FutureLEAD Challenge (FLC) 2024



What is the FLC programme?

The **FutureLEAD Challenge** is a **co-curricular leadership development programme** presented by the Office for Student Leadership Development (SLD), designed in partnership with the Unit for Institutional Change and Social Justice. Interested students from all 3 campuses, whether undergraduate or postgraduate, may participate. Please note that participation is voluntary and that modules bear no academic credits.

Utilising a blended learning format, over a period of 4-7 months, the programme engages students on both Blackboard and in journal discussions on and around understanding and using Leadership in various situations and environments. It also includes online assessments per module.



Objectives of the programme

The FutureLEAD Challenge programme aims to assist students in:

- Achieving the knowledge to develop and grow as future leaders, whether utilised in their personal life ambitions, their career ambitions or in helping communities
- Preparing interested students for Student Governance Elections
- Acquiring the knowledge, skills and values of leadership a "soft skill" highly valued by the corporate market



Programme certification

The programme offers students two different types of achievement:

- The Certificate of Participation, providing a student with acknowledgement that they engaged in the programme for 1 or more modules and passed the respective tests
- The Certificate of Completion, providing a student with evidence that they not only completed all the sessions and passed all the tests over a period of 4 months, but that they also practically applied the learning over a period of 6-7 months

The Certificate of Participation will require that students complete at least 1 of the 4 themes/modules as follows:

- 1. To gain access to the rest of the modules, participation in Module 1 is compulsory, AND a pass rate of 60% is required. The certificate issued at the end of the year will though acknowledge all modules passed, as well as their outcomes reached
- Engage with the online content (read material, watch presentations and videos on the subject matter) 3. Watch the video featuring the expert panel discussion on the module theme
- 4. Complete and pass the online assessments per module with 70%, according to the time schedule below

Students who wish to achieve the Certificate of Completion will be required to:

- Complete all 4 themes/modules, as per the instructions above and pass each with 70%
- Engage in an online (individual) journal discussion on the subject matter and pass with 60% (monitored)
