

POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN LABOUR LAW (PGDLL)

This post graduate programme is designed to enable people to specialize in Labour Law. The legal profession, business (human resources), trade unions and public sector will benefit from this course. - Affirmative Action
- Skills Development and Training

MODULE 6: (LLAC5825)

- Unemployment Insurance
- Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases
- Occupational Health and Safety

Every module will have an assignment, class work and an examination of one hour.
