INVITATION TO WORKSHOP: UNIVERSITY OF THE FREE STATE

The Disaster Management Training and Education Centre (DiMTEC) of the University of the Free State in Bloemfontein is actively involved in several research projects on national and international level in the field of natural and man-made disasters. The Centre is celebrating its centenary this year.

DiMTEC will be presenting a workshop on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>20 August 2015</u> in Bloemfontein with the following theme:

"A critical evaluation of commonalities and exclusions between the MHI Regulations and the Disaster Management Act in South Africa".

The Major Hazard Installation (MHI) Regulations of 2001 makes provision for an assessment of the health and safety risks associated with hazardous facilities such as industrial plant and equipment. The regulations are currently being revised by a specialist group under the auspices of the Department of Labour. The Disaster Management Act (Act 57 of 2002) regulates the preparedness for and response to a disaster on national, provincial and local government level.

During the workshop an international perspective will be sought on the subject and for this purpose London-based Dr David Smith of the Institute of Business Continuity Management has been invited to participate. He is, inter alia, well versed in the work done by the UK Health and Safety Executive (HSE) on which the South African MHI Regulations are based. Information gathered at the workshop will be used to guide regulatory disaster decision-making in South Africa in the medium to long term.
