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Historical year of the students

From Rhodes falling, Stellies 'opening' and 0% fee increases; the re-awakening of student activism in South Africa has rightfully marked 2015 as 'the historical year of the students'. The rise of student activism initiatives, has given young people a platform to voice their concerns regarding domestic issues, question institutionalized ideologies, and deconstruct certain social constructs in efforts to create a more inclusive space for youth participation in the building of a better South Africa.

One of the most striking points highlighted through these initiatives, was that of the power and influence of student leadership. The Fees Must Fall protest at Wits University was boldly led by four student leaders -WITS EFFsc chairperson, Vuyani Paml outgoing WITS SRC, President Shaeera Kalla, incoming WITS SRC president, Nompendulo Mkatswa and controversial former Wits SRC President, Mcebo Dlamini The four put political differences aside to dvocate for a worthy cause and demontrated the kind of strategic leadership students yearned to see in their own government – leadership which advocated for social justice above self-enrichment, which actively and sincerely listened to the concerns of those it represented and fearlessly went out of its way to serve their interests.

The successfully-led Fees Must Fall protest at the University of the Free State also realized a newly found appreciation for the Student Reprehensive Council, but, moreover,

sparked conversations which highlighted genuine concern over the effectiveness of student leadership in other relevant structures, including residence and association committees. Conversations were also rife with critical analyses of the general views held by the UFS student community regarding active citizenship and patriotism, youth activism and participation, awareness of and reaction to domestic economic, political and social issues as it became clear that apathy towards student activism campaigns and a general disinterest in student affairs are still

issues worth addressing. Equally, it's worth noting that student activism has fuelled a more radical, yet strategic and responsible approach to the tackling of related issue of injustice, including gender equality issues, outsourcing, parallel medium language policy debates, government mismanagement of public funds, and more.

The Rhodes Must Fall, Open Stellenbosch Fees Must Fall and End Outsourcing protests, amongst others, gave a glimpse of the kind of future leaders our n spective Universities breed - if tertiary intuitions of learning aim to groom citizens who will bring hope to South Africa, find 'African solutions to African problems' and change the world for the better, then these institutions ought to continue to allow students the space to objectively criticise, offer different perspectives to analyses and generate new and innovative solutions to problems; in so doing, allowing students to lead and pave the way for transformation within and beyond University boarders.





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
