It opened its doors in Bloemfontein in **1904** as the Grey University College, with six students in the Humanities. Today it is a **multi-campus institution**, with two diverse campuses in Bloemfontein and one in Qwaqwa in the scenic Eastern Free State, accommodating more than 40 000 students in its **seven faculties** (Economic and Management Sciences, Education, Health Sciences, the Humanities, Law, Natural and Agricultural Sciences, Theology and Religion), with an increasing number of international students and associates, and an ever-widening scope of active involvement in and contribution to its surrounding communities.

DEVELOPMENT OF THE UFS CREST OVER MORE THAN A CENTURY



1904

Up to 1935, the same coat of arms was used as the Grey College School.



1935

By 1935, with the name change to University College of the Orange Free State, the coat of arms fell into disuse, especially among students.



1947

In 1947, an agreement between management and students led to the new motto Per Fidem ad Sapientiam (Through faith to wisdom).



1950

In 1952, it was changed to In Deo Sapientiae Lux (In God is the light of wisdom). The traditional orange, white and blue, linking the UFS to the South African national colours, changed in the late 1990s.

The orange was replaced by cherry red.

The academic brand - the historic University of the Free State crest that has been the symbol of the university since 1952, has evolved to embrace the aesthetic expectations of the stakeholders.

The shape of the traditional academic shield has been simplified and contemporised. Much of the symbolism of the crest remains intact, acknowledging the location of the UFS brand as one of the country's premier institutions of higher education, with a proud history of academic excellence and an ever evolving, vibrant culture.

Ditebohiso ho baithuti ba rona ba di-graduate – lena ke letsatsi le kgethehileng ka nnete mme dipelo tsa rona di thabile haholo ho bona ba bangata ba lona le fuwa mangolo a lona a tshwaneleho ao le tshwanelehang ho a fumana kajeno. Re hlile re ikotla sefuba ka sena seo le se fihleletseng. Lebaka la hore le ile la tlameha ho fetohela maemo a matjha a tlwaelo ho fihlella tsena tseo le di fihleletseng dinako tse neng di na le diphephetso tse kgolo e ne e se papadi – re nka motsotso ona ho LE thoholetsa haholo.

Re boela re nka motsotso ona ho le lebohisa le ho hetla morao ho bona ditahleheloh tseo le bileng le tsona ka bomong. Ka nako e tshwanang, le ne le ke ke la kgona ho fihlella mohato ona wa bohlokwa ntle le tshehetso ya batho ba bangata ba le potapotileng – le leboha ditheo tse ileng tsa le tshetshisa – batswadi, lelapa, metswalle, bahlokomedi, le dilektjhara ba ileng ba le thusa ho fihla mohatong ona kajeno.

Following a career as a researcher and research manager, he is the author or co-author of more than 200 publications and has served in positions such as Dean: Research Development, Dean: Research and Innovation and Senior Director: Research Development and Postgraduate studies at the Central University of Technology. Professor Lategan is currently Research Professor in Research Education and Postgraduate Development, is a South African NRF-rated researcher and editor of the Journal for New Generation Sciences.

With his thesis titled, **A PUBLIC HEALTH ETHICS FRAMEWORK FOR THE GERIATRIC COMMUNITY: A SOUTH AFRICAN PERSPECTIVE**, the promovendus argues that a growing ageing and consequently elderly or geriatric community will create more demands on the already challenged social and health services. This will place further strain on the geriatric community as a vulnerable community. The South African geriatric community is no exception. Insufficient healthcare provision and the quality of healthcare provision a social determinants impacting negatively on the geriatric community's health and contributing to the ethical challenges experienced by the geriatric community. The study expands on the limited information and knowledge regarding the South African geriatric community's needs and confirms the absence of a public health ethics framework for geriatric community care in South Africa, at both conceptual and implementation levels. The examiners commended the promovendus and promoters on the outstanding thesis and original study.

MORPHIS, Michaela

Michaela Morphis was born in Pretoria on 21 September 1992. She received her secondary education at Eunice High School, where she matriculated in 2010. She obtained the degree BMedSc in 2013, BMedScHons in 2014, and completed her Postgraduate Diploma as an intern Medical Physicist in 2018. She obtained her MMedSc (Medical Physics) degree with distinction from the UFS in 2016. In 2021, she was appointed to the position of medical physicist at ICON Oncology South Africa

With her thesis titled, **ACCURACY OF PATIENT-SPECIFIC DOSIMETRY USING HYBRID PLANAR-SPECT/CT IMAGING: A MONTE CARLO STUDY**, the candidate makes a valuable contribution towards personalised dosimetry for radionuclide therapy using hybrid planar-SPECT/CT imaging. Using patient-specific models created from computed tomography images, she used Monte Carlo simulations to mimic clinically realistic iodine-123 and iodine-131 activity distributions with planar and SPECT images. The SPECT images allowed her to assess the accuracy of SPECT activity quantification in the simulated patients. This novel method of evaluating the accuracy of activity quantification has enabled the candidate to determine the accuracy of personalised dosimetry for iodine-131 radionuclide therapy, which will benefit future patients who will receive I-131 therapy. So far, three papers from this thesis have been published in international journals, with one more in preparation.

Lawrence went on to obtain a BTh (ATS), MMed (O&G) (Pretoria), FCOG (CMSA), Certificate in Maternal & Fetal Medicine (CMSA) and an MSc (University of Liverpool). He is currently the Head of the Department of Obstetrics and Gyneacology at Charlotte Maxeke Johannesburg Academic Hospital and Assistant head of Wits School of Clinical Medicine.

With his thesis titled, **FIT FOR PURPOSE? THE STRENGTHS AND WEAKNESSES OF GAUTENG MATERNITY SERVICES HEALTH CARE ORGANISATION/CONFIGURATION IN THE CONTEXT OF REDUCING MATERNAL DEATHS**, the candidate presents critical factors to be considered and mistakes to be avoided in designing functional and resilient maternity services. Using mixed method research and Context, Input, Process and Product model as theoretical lens, Lawrence analyzed the Gauteng Cluster Policy Framework (CPF), conducted semi-structured interviews with healthcare workers, audited healthcare facilities and maternal deaths in the Charlotte Maxeke Cluster to identify these factors. Achieving balance between the supply and demand sides of maternity services emerged as a central theme. The above require political commitment, competent leadership, sound health system governance, optimized decision spaces, data driven planning and accountability in implementing government policies.

The co-created framework is viewed as a modest contribution to knowledge about navigating the challenges threatening nursing education in the country. Furthermore, it is believed that this framework offers resources for resilience during the current pandemic.

Anna Doratheia Grobler was born on 18 June 1959 in Somerset East. She matriculated at Brandwag High School in Uitenhage in 1976 and obtained a Diploma in Diagnostic Radiography at the UOFS in 1980. Her career as a radiographer started in 1981 in Kimberley. She graduated with a BTech Radiography: Diagnostic Degree (cum laude) at the Technicon Free State in 2002 and an Advanced Diploma in Radiography (Diagnostic) (MRI) at the UFS in 2007. In 2008, she obtained her MTech Radiography degree at CUT. Since 2013, she has been a lecturer in Radiography at Nelson Mandela University in Port Elizabeth.

With her thesis titled, **A MODEL FOR THE TEACHING OF IMAGING INFORMATICS, A PLATFORM IN BIOMEDICAL INFORMATICS, IN A FUTURE INTEGRATED NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE SYSTEM IN SOUTH AFRICA**, Grobler's goal was to assist the development of knowledgeable professionals in imaging informatics, improve efficiencies in a radiology department and improve patient care. Using data gathered from various sources through a sequential mixed method approach, it was possible to make inferences and deductions regarding the context, goals, content, learning experience, and assessment used for developing the model. The study presents an evidence-based hybrid model that includes best practices associated with various teaching and learning strategies, approaches, and models. Grobler used a holistic approach to identify the imaging informatics components to be included in the teaching model, including interpretation of their relationships to create an integrated, scaffolded teaching model. The model provides guidance as to the basic and advanced and can be applied in a variety of environments.

Nokuthula Tlalajoe was born on 1 December 1988 in De Aar, a small town in the Northern Cape. She matriculated at Vuyolwethu High School in Kimberley in 2006. She graduated with a Master's degree in Biochemistry (Cum Laude) in 2013 at the University of the Free. Her teaching career began in 2013 as a Junior Lecturer in Molecular Biochemistry at the North-West University (Potchefstroom (Pukke) Campus). In 2016, she changed careers, shifting from hard-core sciences into softer science with a humanistic approach where she facilitates general lifelong learning skills and graduate attributes for all health sciences students at the Faculty of Health Sciences, UFS.

With the thesis titled: **A SUPPORT FRAMEWORK FOR SOCIAL LEARNING AND INTEGRATION OF FIRST-YEAR UNDERGRADUATE MEDICAL STUDENTS**, the candidate argues that most strategies developed to support student focus on the academic aspects and neglect the social learning and integration support systems that could facilitate the transition of first-year undergraduate medical students from high school to a higher education environment. The study was grounded on the social learning theory by Bandura (1969) and social integration theory by Tinto (1975) to develop a social learning and integration theory, defined as the interactions, through institutional experiences, that can influence how individuals learn from each other through observation, imitation, modelling and persistence. This provided a deeper understanding of the dynamics of transitioning into a new educational environment and means of achieving a successful transition. Data from a nominal group and Delphi technique was used to construct a support framework for social learning and integration of first-year undergraduate medical students.

Samukeliso Sibanda was born on the 29th of December 1983 in Nkayi, Zimbabwe. She obtained the LLB degree in 2009 from the University of Fort Hare. She graduated with the LLM degree with a LLM thesis, titled *Xenophobia in South Africa: A socio-legal analysis* in 2011 from the University of Fort Hare. After obtaining the LLM she worked at the then new Zimbabwe Institute of Legal Studies as a Legal Consultant, where she was involved in developing curriculum for the Institute. In 2014 she joined the Zimbabwe Human Rights Commission and in 2015 was involved in teaching at the Great Zimbabwe University as a Law Lecturer at Herbert Chitepo Law School.

With her thesis titled, **A CRITICAL INVESTIGATION INTO RAPE AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE IN ZIMBABWE**, the candidate contributes to scholarship on rape and sexual violence by investigating the reasons for the failure of national legislation to protect women from rape in Zimbabwe. Relying on radical feminism, intersectionality and socio-legal analysis the study examines the concept of patriarchy and its impact on women's ability to realize the right to freedom from all forms of physical, emotional and psychological violence. It exposes also the significance of harmful social practices and their role in exacerbating rape and sexual violence against women. The candidate by interrogating rape laws, specifically their structure, suggests alternative ways of interpretation and application and for them to be aligned with the Zimbabwean Constitution. Other recommendations include mandatory minimum sentencing to be adopted; a national register of sex offenders be established, and that Zimbabwean society be educated on harmful practices which exacerbate rape and sexual violence against women.

He obtained the degrees BTh cum laude in 2016 and MDiv cum laude in 2017, the Postgraduate Diploma in Theology cum laude in 2018 and the PhD in New Testament Studies in 2021 from the University of the Free State. He was awarded the Dean's Medal twice, for the best undergraduate and postgraduate student. He started his academic career in Bloemfontein at the University of the Free State in 2019, with his appointment as part-time lecturer.

With his thesis titled, **'N TEKSGESENTREERDE RETORIESE ANALISE VAN 1 TESSALONISSENSE (A TEXT-BASED RHETORICAL ANALYSIS OF 1 THESSALONIANS)**, the candidate contributes to the investigation of the rhetorical analysis of Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians. After offering a detailed overview of existing rhetorical analyses of the letter and noting that all existing rhetorical studies are based on either classical or modern rhetorical approaches, he opts for a different approach, namely a text-based rhetorical approach that has not been applied to this letter previously. By applying this novel approach to the letter, he offers a comprehensive rhetorical analysis of every section of the letter, as well as a comprehensive overview of the broad rhetorical strategy followed in the letter. He also shows convincingly that such an approach brings important and fresh insights to Paul's rhetorical strategy in the letter and helps one discover aspects that have gone unnoticed in previous studies.

He later went to Bishop Gwynne College in South Sudan and completed a Certificate in Theological Training. He also graduated with a BA in Translation Studies at Pan Africa Theological College in Nairobi – Kenya. He further obtained a Masters degree in Biblical Studies from South African Theological Seminary (SATS). He enrolled for his PhD in Religion Studies with the University of the Free State in 2019 and successfully completed it in 2021.



With his thesis titled, **TOWARDS AN INTEGRATION OF NUBA TIRA TRADITIONAL MARRIAGE VALUES WITH BIBLICAL TEACHING: A HERMENEUTICAL APPROACH BASED ON THE OLD TESTAMENT**, the candidate makes a significant contribution to Biblical and Religious Studies in the areas of Christian Family, Contextual Theology and the Theology of Marriage both as a biblical and cultural construct. Through this empirical study, Angalo sought to examine some practical ways in which the integration of Nuba Tira traditional marriage values with biblical teachings could occur and as a result, empowering African Christian leaders to depend solely on the sufficiency of scripture as the standardized rubric in assessing cultural undertakings in matters of faith and conduct. The candidate established that in order to be meaningfully relevant within the Nuba Tira communities, the Biblical notion of marriage must not merely be idealistic but must also consider the socio-cultural milieu in which it is practiced.

BOAHENG, Isaac

Isaac Boaheng was born on 6 January 1982 at Odumasi, the Bono Region of Ghana. He matriculated at Odumasiman Senior High School in 2000. He obtained his BSc in Geomatic Engineering from the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology. He also obtained a Master of Divinity degree with Cum Laude from the Trinity Theological Seminary. He further pursued his second Masters in Theology at the South African Theological Seminary (SATS), and also completed it with a Cum Laude in 2019. He thereafter enrolled with the department of Religion Studies for his PhD, which he successfully completed in 2021.

With his thesis titled, **A CONTEXTUAL THEOLOGY OF ATONEMENT FOR THE AKAN COMMUNITY OF GHANA**, the candidate makes a significant contribution to African scholarship in the areas of Contextual Theology, Africanisation and Systematic Theology through the dogma of atonement. Based on document analysis as a method of enquiry, Boaheng sought to explore the dogma of atonement and its theological implications within the Akan socio-cultural perspective with an intent that it might bring about some religious and ethical renewal to Akan Christians. Thereby, empowering them to depend solely on the sufficiency of Christ as once and for all atonement for the sins of the world. The candidate established that in order to be meaningfully relevant within the Akan community, the Christian notion of soteriology must not merely be idealistic but must also consider the cultural, socio-economic and political milieu in which it is embodied. Thus, Christianity must speak to the social context.

Marelize Maritz was born on 8 September 1962, in Robertson in the Western Cape. After she matriculated at the Robertson High school in 1980, Marelize attended the Hugenote College. In a collaboration between Hugenote College and UNISA she obtained her B.Diac. Youthwork degree in 1983, and a B.Diac. Honours in Youthwork in 1984. In 2012 she furthered her studies in Practical Theology. After obtaining a MTh at the UFS in 2016, she pursued to obtain a D.Th. in Practical Theology at the UFS. Marelize served in various leadership positions in DRC congregations in South Africa.

With her thesis titled, **POWER IN POVERTY: CONGREGATIONAL LEADERSHIP IN A CONTEXT OF POVERTY**, the candidate uses practice-orientated research to answer the main research question: "How does reflective congregational leadership enhance the well-being of people living in a context of poverty?" The empirical analysis of interviews conducted in three congregations from different denominations revealed how pastors and congregational members interact in relationships of authority. Reflective leadership, characterised by servanthood, support and calling as elements of pastoral practices focused on congregational members' needs, dreams and expectations, creates and enhances positive experiences of well-being. The positive experiences of congregants, combined with reflective authoritative servant leadership, create hope and trust among congregational members. Where these elements are present, congregational members submit to and grant autocratic authority to their pastors. When ordained pastors use their granted autocratic authority, they create and enhance sustainable well-being experiences for people living in a context of poverty.

THE SEANAMARENA THE TRADITIONAL BASOTHO BLANKET

The Main Procession graduation gowns – embroidered with rich diversity

South Africa, and the Free State in particular, has a long-standing friendship with our neighbouring country, Lesotho.

Through a shared history, we have become co-creators of our futures. For this reason, the UFS decided to incorporate our tradition with that of the Basotho in the design of our Main Procession graduation gowns.

The gowns are inspired by the Seanamarena – the traditional Basotho blanket. The different patterns on the Seanamarena indicate the status one holds in the Basotho nation or reflect the occasion being celebrated. Keeping the Seanamarena pattern in mind, we combined our traditional academic designs with that of the Basotho nation.

YOKE PATTERNS



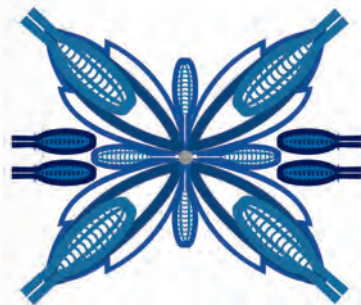
Yoke pattern for the Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor

This Seanamarena pattern is an interpretation of a design – used exclusively for the king and chiefs – which means ‘to swear by the king’. This blanket has the highest status of all Basotho blankets.



Yoke pattern for the Chairperson of the Council

This Seanamarena Victorian crest motif appeared after the visit of the Prince of Wales to Lesotho in 1925, which made a profound impression on the local people. Customers refer to this blanket as ‘lesiba’ – meaning feathers – when buying it.



Yoke pattern for the Vice-Rector

This Seanamarena Poone design symbolises good crops, wealth, and fertility. The Poone is given as a present to honour an important visitor.



Yoke pattern for Registrar

The same Seanamarena Poone design used for the Vice-Rector applies to the Registrar, with some slight design and colour alterations.

The Deans wear gowns made in the colours of the faculties, or others which indicate the office they hold.
