The University of the Free State (UFS) is inspiring excellence and transforming lives. Through our Human and Academic Projects we are becoming a university internationally recognised for human reconciliation and compassion and excellence in academic achievement.

The university is situated in Bloemfontein in the heart of South Africa. The Bloemfontein Campus dates back to 1904, making our university one of the oldest higher education institutions in the country. Since its foundation, the university has been a dynamic learning institution where academic excellence and the development of leadership qualities have become long-standing traditions.

From a humble start with six BA students, the university is now home to more than 31 000 students on our three campuses, the Bloemfontein Campus, the growing Qwaqwa Campus in the picturesque Eastern Free State and the South Campus in Bloemfontein. The South Campus accommodates our School of Open Learning and the University Preparation Programme that provides a bridging programme for learners to enter higher education.

Superior scholarship is essential in the global market – where academic distinction is crucial. Emanating from our richly-embedded research culture, we offer exceptional undergraduate and postgraduate programmes and research opportunities across seven faculties. More than 1 800 students from across the African continent and around the world, representing 55 countries, are enrolled, some in programmes where the UFS takes a leading role in Africa.

The programme ensures comprehensive support, intensive mentorship and placement with the best international researchers. This novel project positions us as an innovator among research universities.
