

Professor Francis Faller


Having, after 34 years, retired from active service in the School of Education, Professor Francis Faller remains associated with the University of the Witwatersrand as an Honorary Adjunct Professor. Since 2005 he has been associated with the Council on Higher Education in various roles as peer academic, including short periods of secondment as Director of Accreditation and Director of Standards Development. For the CHE he has been involved in evaluation of programmes for accreditation, development of qualification standards, and participation in national reviews of Education and Law degrees, and the recent review of doctoral qualifications.

Dr Mziwakhe Sibuqashe is currently employed at Nelson Mandela University as a Senior Manager: Academic Planning. He holds a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree in Education from the same institution. 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Dr Andre Bechuke


