

The UFS has seven faculties delivering top-quality programmes, driven by dedicated and highly qualified staff committed to making a real-world impact in their fields.




















The UFS, a secure campus environment, is committed to the safety of its staff, students and visitors.








What we are good at

- We are working towards improving food security in Africa through the genetic enhancement of staple crops in our Agriculture to Agro-Processing programme.
- Through **innovative research into cancer detection and treatment**, we instil new hope in cancer patients.
- Understanding Africa its people, politics, culture, relations, and knowledge systems our **Centre for Gender and Africa Studies** provides an inter-faculty approach to gender studies.
- The Institute for Groundwater Studies is **the leading groundwater research group in Africa** dedicated to the sustainable management of groundwater resources.
- High-calibre postgraduate students and postdoctoral fellows from all over the world benefit from expert mentorship and peer review in our International Studies Group, enabling them to publish manuscripts and access prestigious international research opportunities.



- The **Next Generation Sequencing Unit** is a cutting-edge research facility focusing on genomics sequencing.
- The **Department of Pharmacology** is developing one of the most advanced pharmacology Good Laboratory Practice (GLP)-accredited research and development laboratories in the country, which will be a centre of excellence for the government, the World Health Organization (WHO), and the African Union's (AU) Commission for Social Development.
- The Robert WM Frater Cardiovascular Research Centre is a leading cardiovascular research institution in sub-Saharan Africa, providing an interdisciplinary training and research platform for scientists and clinicians.
- **Boyden Observatory** and **Naval Hill Planetarium** are two unique facilities that form vital components in the display and communication of South Africa's astronomical heritage.
- The Centre for Microscopy boasts cutting-edge electron microscopy equipment, providing the infrastructure for exceptional and globally competitive research.





- The National Control Laboratory for Biological Products (NCL) is one of only 12 laboratories worldwide contracted to perform vaccine testing for the World Health Organisation.
- The UFS is also home to the South African Doping Control Laboratory
 (SADoCoL). The laboratory is tasked with researching and analysing samples from
 elite athletes and boasts the international accreditation of ISO/IEC17025.
- The UFS has ties with **FARMOVS**, a world-class clinical research facility with more than 3 000 clinical trials since 1974.
- The Interdisciplinary Centre for Digital Futures (ICDF) is a collaborative, cocreative, synergistic space where scientists and engineers collaborate with different roleplayers to provide a unique intellectual ecosystem that drives the digital future responsibly and critically for the benefit of society.
- The **Afromontane Research Unit** actively engages in and promotes research on Southern African mountains.
- Teacher professional development, learner support, and parent-empowering initiatives are at the core of the activities offered at the Sci-Ed Science Education Centre.





- Our Bachelor of Commerce in Accounting and Bachelor of Accounting have accreditation from several professional bodies, namely the South African Institute of Chartered Accountants, South African Institute of Professional Accountants, Chartered Institute of Management Accountants, Association of Chartered Certified Accountants, and South African Institute of Taxation.
- The SANRAL Chair in Mathematics, Natural Sciences and Technology Education, based in our Faculty of Education, helps to train teachers, support student-teacher interns, and incentivise education results so that participating schools become centres of excellence.
- Simulation training provided by the Clinical Simulation and Skills Unit in our School of Clinical Medicine offers hands-on training and learning opportunities, allowing for deliberate practice and mastery of skills. Human patient simulators enhance the education and training of medical students by expanding the teaching platform. Our School of Nursing also boasts state-of-the-art simulation laboratories known as the SPACE.







- The Merensky Group for Aerial Geological Image Classification (MAGIC) Lab develops drone-based geological imaging in South Africa, with specific attention to mineral and groundwater exploration.
- The School of Financial Planning Law is well-known for the Postgraduate Diploma in Financial Planning, which is a cornerstone qualification in becoming a Certified Financial Planner.
- The Free State Centre for Human Rights is a hub of excellence for human rights studies, drawing together academics from various disciplines, practitioners, and activists.
- The UFS Law Clinic is one of a handful of university law clinics in South Africa with reportable and legally significant judgements.
- The Academy for Multilingualism was born from the UFS' commitment to multilingualism and is linked to our pursuit of social justice.
