How Long Will it Take

- 1. Initial 4 year window to lodge restitution claims closed in 1998.
- 2. 80000 claims lodged
- 3. HLP report concluded that there were still approx. 7000 unsettled and over 19000 unfinalised "old order" claims.
- 4. At the then rate of finalising 560 claims a year, it would take 43 years to finalise all old order claims.

Restitution of Land Rights Amendment Act, Act No. 15 of 2014

- In 2014 the Zuma administration re-opened land claims despite many thousands of 1998 claims remaining unresolved.
- 166000 new claims were lodged more than double the number in the first round.
- In 2016 the CC declared Act to be invalid. All 1998 claims to be finalised before new claims processed.
- 24 months to introduce new legislation.
- Or new court order had to be sought in July 2018.

New Claims .Time and Money

- 1. The HLP report estimates that the 166000 new claims lodged since 2014 will take 143 years to settle.
- 2. Treasury estimates settling the new claims alone will take 200 years and R600 billion
- 3. If land claims process is re-opened it is estimated that 397,000 will be lodged
- 4. And that it will take 709 years to complete land restitution.
- 5. Nonetheless ANC Chairman of the Parliamentary Land Committee has expressed his hope that one million new claims will be lodged.
