This unique programme is for students with an academic background in any field (NQF level 7) who feel called to contextual Christian ministry. Grounded in the soil of the South African context, but aware and connected to discussions across the globe, the programme aims to form students in becoming innovative and respected Christian leaders within their respective communities. The theology we as a group seek to explore and embody together is ecumenical at heart – as we thirst to drink from more and deeper wells the Church offers to us. All theological disciplines are tailored to meet (and even anticipate) the ever-growing challenges of ministry in a world faced with many looming disasters. In short, interpreting Word and the world is the ongoing task of those called to serve.

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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Advanced Study of Church History and Church Polity Historical hermeneutics, contemporary South African historiography, and a selected number of themes of historical and church political trends are studied. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Advanced Study of Systematic Theology and Ethics The interplay of systematic theology, ethics, and context is studied through the application of a theological notion that informs the well-being of the personal, congregational, and public spheres of life in the South African context. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Advanced Study in Research Methodology and Theory in Practical and Missional Theology Different research approaches and methods in practical and missional theological research are studied on an advanced level. This includes enhancing the practical relevance of research within an ecclesial setting, exploring the multiplicity of collaborative research practices within such communities of practice, and the eventual presentation of a research proposal and a research report. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Advanced Study of Themes in Practical Theology, Specialised Ministries and Practicum The fundamental knowledge, theories, principles, and practices of an advanced study of the themes in practical and missional theology will be studied, including a) Practical Theological Ecclesiology; b) Pastoral Care; c) Liturgy and homiletics; d) Faith formation; and e) Missiology. Tuition format

We follow a blended model consisting of an online orientation session for all modules at the beginning of the semester, self-study, one live online class (45 minutes) every week (e.g., on a Wednesday afternoon from 16:00-16:45), and one compulsory face-to-face block contact week each semester. A reading schedule in the module guide will guide the self-study. The weekly online class will be rotated between the modules, and each module will have at least two online meetings per semester. Depending on the module, the aim of these online meetings may vary from presenting and discussing some lectures or group work, responding to work presented in previous lectures, or voluntarily checking in at these sessions to ensure your progression through the module.

It is also important to note that these contact sessions are closely aligned with students' active involvement within a particular faith community – and students need to work under the respected leadership and guidance of an acknowledged mentor from within their situated faith community. The independent development of your ministerial portfolio is an important outcome of this programme.

Note the following:

- Full-time students do this programme in one (1) year.
- Part-time students do this programme over two (2) years. The block contact sessions for part-time students will be shorter.

- Students are expected to be computer literate and have access to a computer, and internet, to participate meaningfully in an online management system (Blackboard) and in virtual classes during online contact sessions.
- The module guides will be available on Blackboard at the beginning of February, and students will have access to it the moment they have registered.

Admission requirements

A three-year degree (360 credits at NQF level 7) in any field, completed at an accredited institution.

05-11 May	Block Week I: face-to-face classes	Attend a variety of worship services and ministries in Bloemfontein on Sunday. Classes are from Monday till Thursday. Attend the Ecumenical Tour to the Eastern Free State from Thursday to Saturday.
01-07 Sept	Block Week II: face-to-face classes	Attend a variety of worship services and ministries in Bloemfontein on Sunday. Classes are from Monday till Thursday. Attend a Retreat from Thursday till Saturday.

Please note that the block contact requirements for part-time students will be less.
