Module Descriptions

TPPP7900: Mini-Dissertation in Pastoral Theology TPPN7926: Narrative Pastoral Therapy: and Praxis:

In this module, research in the form of a mini-dissertation or one publishable article (20 000 – 30 000 words) will be completed on a relevant theme in the field of study to contribute to the development of knowledge at an advanced level.

TPRM7916: Research Methodology and Theory in **Practical and Missional Theology:**

In this module, the fundamental knowledge, theories, principles, and practices of an in-depth study of research methodology and theory in practical and missional theology are studied. This includes the development of a research proposal, the selection of an appropriate methodology and the completion of a research project.

TPCH7916: Pastoral Care in Chaplaincy:

In this module, specific pastoral theologies, theories and models of care to law offenders and the survivors of crime will be introduced and conceptualised, focussing specifically on the contexts of chaplaincy in various contexts (e.g. correctional services, police services, hospitals and the defence force).

Tuition Format

A blended learning and teaching model is followed, which consists of an online orientation session for all modules at the beginning of the semester, self-study, one live online class, and one compulsory face-to-face block contact week each semester.

Projected Costs

The projected cost for full-time tuition fees (excluding books) for this programme is R36 800,00

This is not a quote for 2026 but a minimum cost projection for the full course based on the fees for .

In this module, an in-depth study of narrative pastoral therapy and related theories and concepts will be conducted to explore various narrative pastoral therapeutic techniques that can be applied to specific contexts.

TPPC7926: Pastoral Care and Counselling:

In this module, pastoral care and counselling theologies. theories and models will be studied in-depth, with a focus on pastoral theological conceptualisations, and the application of specific pastoral care models in specific contexts of care (e.g., marriage and family, illness and loss, and crises and trauma).

TSUP7906: Pastoral Care Internship and Supervision:

The theory focuses on introductory components of pastoral care, methods related to providing pastoral care in marriage and family, loss and bereavement and crisis counselling. This theory directly relates to the practical component, which provides the students with both a context and opportunities to consider various aspects related to practice and apply related skills to these contexts.
