She obtained her PhD from Lancaster University, UK. Formerly a lecturer in the University of Dschang, Cameroon, she currently coordinates the Postgraduate Programme in Applied Linguistics of The University of Bamenda, and is the Head of Inclusive Education at same University. Her key research areas include Discourse, Gender, Politics and Media. She has several books and articles to her name including *Gender, Discourse and Power in the Cameroonian Parliament* (2010) and *Gender and Language in Sub-Saharan African Contexts: Tradition, Struggle and Change* (2013). Her current research interests seek to find out how (cognitive) understandings of gender impact on (gender) policies and on women and men's participation in politics.
