

Christine Anthonissen is Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of General Linguistics, Stellenbosch University since 2004. She was formerly attached to the Department of Linguistics at the University of the Western Cape.

Her research focuses mainly on Discourse Studies, Critical Discourse Analysis and social aspects of Bilingualism and Multilingualism. She has done an analysis of media discourses of the late 1980s considering how the South African news media managed stringent censorship regulations. More recent work relates to discourses in coming to terms with a traumatic past, related to the South African Truth and Reconciliation Commission, and discourses between health workers and patients in an HIV/AIDS clinic. Currently she is engaged in an interdisciplinary project investigating characteristics of language shift from Afrikaans to English in a number of Western Cape communities, tracing the causes of the shift and features of the various dialects that are used in the communities.

She is member of the editorial board of Stellenbosch Papers in Linguistics (SPIL), the Journal of Language and Politics (Benjamins, editors Ruth Wodak, Paul Chilton) and Language Assessment Quarterly (Routledge, editor Antony Kunnan).
