OSM AUDITION GUIDELINES FOR

VOICE STUDENTS

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: Vocal studies as part of programmes of the OSM are focused mainly on Western Art Music (classical music, opera, lieder) and applicants will be evaluated in terms of an ability to complete a programme with this focus successfully.

Technical work

Vocal Exercises Instructions (please read carefully):

We have recorded and uploaded demos of how to sing nine vocal exercises on the given vowels and the specific notes; please record your performance of these exercises, and attach them as part of your audition material. All voice types must please sing and record exercises 1 - 5 (broken triads). Exercises 6 and 7 (arpeggios) are for low male and female voices, and exercises 8 and 9 for high male and female voices. In other words, basses, baritones, altos and mezzo-sopranos are to record exercises 6 and 7. Tenors and sopranos are to record exercises 8 and 9.

You may, however, record all of exercises 6 - 9 (low and high voices) if your vocal capabilities allow for this. In the demonstration of all exercises, you will notice that an example is given for male voice, followed by an example for female voice (which lies an octave higher than the male voice).

Please note that all exercises are counted in with "one and two and..." for you to prepare your breath. On the count of three, you will start singing. We have also uploaded the "piano only" version of exercises 1 - 9. You can use these to record yourself while singing with the piano on our recording.

Very important is that you sing all exercises as legato as possible; this means that you should try to sustain the sound through all notes in order to have a vocal line without breaks in between.
