RESEARCH SEMINAR HUGE SUCCESS

The 2010 annual Research Seminar presented by the Programme was, according to students and colleagues alike, a huge success. This year will be no different.

The Programme is hosting its Research Seminar on 28 and 29 July 2011. As always the seminar takes place on the Main Campus of the University of the Free State. During the seminar prominent speakers, all experts in their fields, will share their valuable knowledge on research and the importance thereof.

Keynote speakers will include, amongst others, Prof. Dennis Francis (Dean of the Faculty of Education, UFS), Dr Pieter Fourie (Research Associate at Macquarie and Pretoria University) and Prof. Abie Geldenhuys (Director of the School of Management, CUT).

We invite all students as well as all staff members interested to attend the seminar.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND SERVICE LEARNING

The Community Engagement and Service Learning module (SDL322) was presented during the second semester of 2010. Approximately 24 third year students participated in the module. Students were involved in the communities of Mangaung, Batho and Bloemfontein.

The module focused on analysing the relationship between ward councillors and the communities. Students engaged in different activities which included compiling a community profile, organising workshops between the community members and the ward councillors and initiating an action plan to address all of the challenges the community faces. Students had the opportunity to present their portfolios (evidence of learning) through DVD and Powerpoint presentations during a presentation session at the end of 2010.

Students agreed that they learned from the academic module as well as from the community. Interestingly enough, students did not indicate in their evaluations that the module required more work than any other module. The service provider also gained information and knowledge and the community benefited through the interaction with students. Students also enjoyed the interaction with the community and service providers. They were able to link the Governance and Political Transformation discipline to the Community Engagement and Service Learning module. They gained insight and understanding into the process of governance and transformation and the challenges that faced the different communities and stakeholders. They could clearly identify the obstacles and problem areas and they were able to address the different issues in their community workshops. Overall the evaluations received from the students were very positive.
