# Research Seminar for Master's students once again a huge success



The Programme in Governance and Political Transformation at the UFS held a research seminar on 28 & 29 July for their Master's Degree students who are currently busy with research for the writing of their mini-dissertations. The seminar took place over two days. The first day various academics made presentations regarding research, with topics that included: how the knowledge of research methodology can be meaningfully applied in writing the mini-dissertation; the mechanics of community-engaged research; enhancing the quality of qualitative research; voicing memories: the dynamics of

conducting interviews; the promise and pitfalls of theory and guidelines on writing the dissertation.

The presenters were Prof Sechaba Mahlomaholo, Dean of the Faculty of Education at the UFS; Dr Ina Gouws, senior lecturer of the Northwest University's Vaal Triangle campus; Dr Asta Rau, Director of the Centre for Health Systems Research and Development at the UFS; Dr Marietjie Oelofse, senior lecturer in the Department of History at the UFS; Mr Eben Coetzee, lecturer in the Department Political Studies and Governance at the UFS; and Dr Lyndon du Plessis, head of the Department Public Administration and Management at the UFS.

The second day took the format of a workshop where students received guidance from various facilitators regarding their topics and the different aspects on writing their mini-dissertations. The established programme in Governance and Political Transformation aims at the advancement of knowledge regarding governance and the development of political management-orientated skills in an environment of rapid change. Various highly skilled academics presented this multi-disciplinary programme to the students who consisted of, amongst others, politicians and government officials who enroll for this prestigious programme from all over the country. The programme was created to satisfy the need for institutional capacity building, the development of leadership and the promotion of good governance – which forms the basis of a healthy democracy.
