STRUCTURE

1st year: 2 majors, 1 minor, 1 elective + Academic literacy module
(*Where applicable**)
2nd year: 2 majors, 1 minor, 2 Social Science modules
3rd year: 2 Majors



SPLIT 1st YEAR

Year 1A: 1 major, 1 minor, 2 foundation modules + Academic literacy module
(*Where applicable**)
Year 1B: 1 major, 1 elective, 2 foundation modules + Academic literacy module
Year 3 and 4: the same as the 2nd and 3rd year in the 3–year programme!

KEY DIFFERENCE?

Throughout 3 years of study, you will engage with 2 majors, 1 minor and 1 elective. You will do 2 custom Social Science modules, and some skills and lifelong learning modules.



The first year of study is "split" into two years, students are exposed to more foundation- and skills modules to equip them for University- and lifelong learning.
