Impact of modernity as world-view

- Economical development - *growth*-oriented ideology – worldview of modernity
- Characteristics:
- human beings are superior
- human beings as masters of their fate
- world is an exhaustible resource
- human ingenuity can solve all problems

Modernity contributes to (Chossudovsky 1998)

Increasing gap between rich and poor

Increase in low-income work opportunities

Reduction in state's compassion with those less privileged

Environmental and spiritual crisis in social work

- Environmental crisis is unfolding.
- Gore (1992:98) states: "the more deeply I search for the roots of the global environmental crisis, the more I'm convinced that it is the outer manifestation of an inner crisis that is, for the lack of a better word, spiritual."
