Prof. Michael Martinek, who presented the lecture, is the Director of the Institute of European Law and professor for life at the Saarland University in Saarbrücken, Germany.

Prof. Martinek has written numerous books and articles and his major fields of research interest are German and European commercial and business law, trade regulation law and antitrust law, particularly the law of distribution systems and banking law.

In his lecture he touched on the emergence and development of comparative law, methods and strategies in the application thereof as well as the achievements and perspectives with regard thereto, amongst others.

Judge of Appeal Frans Malan, Extraordinary Professor in the Department of Mercantile Law, and Judge of Appeal Fritz Brand, Extraordinary Professor in the Department of Private Law, also attended the lecture.
