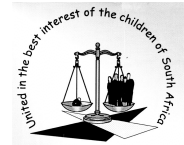

## SAPSAC objectives

3. to promote research, an examination of comparative literature and the exchange of information among professionals involved in the field of child abuse;
4. to encourage and promote multidisciplinary professional education on topics of relevance in the field of child abuse;
5. to promote cooperation and coordination among the different professions involved in the field of child abuse and with relevant organizations both nationally and internationally, in furtherance of the foregoing objectives;
6. to serve as a representational forum within which the needs and concerns of the professionals of the various disciplines addressing the problem of child abuse can be articulated at a national level;
7. to issue the publication *Child Abuse Research: A South African Journal (CARSA)* in furtherance of the foregoing objectives;
8. to promote the effectiveness and well-being of professionals working with abused children.
