Please complete the following two tasks:

1. Compose an essay (3 000 words; Arial or Times New Roman 12 Size Font, Single Spacing) on what you consider as the major development challenges facing your region/locality. Consider the practicalities of improving the state of human development in that region/locality and construct an argument for how it could be done.

The essay will be assessed critically graded, therefore pay attention to the following issues:

- Brief background to your region;
- Challenges facing the region;
- Construction of argument;
- Academic writing style;
- Plagiarism; and
- Referencing

The essay will be assessed in terms of the following assessment rubric – please ensure that you attend to all the sections of the rubric:

Section	Content	Marks
1. Introduction	Purpose of essay; Research Problem; Lay-out	10
2. Brief introduction to region / locality	Concisely describe the region/locality your essay will be dealing with. Do <b>NOT</b> deal with countries but stay with regions, provinces, towns etc.	10
3. Development challenges	Identify a maximum of three development challenges facing the above region/locality and describe them in detail. Look at economic, social, political factors playing a role.	20
4. Possible practical solutions	Describe possible solutions to the developmental challenges using real-life current or future solutions to the challenges	20

5. Conclusion	What is your own opinion on what should be done?	10
6. Technical Care	Make sure that <b><u>ALL</u></b> sources are acknowledged in the text (Harvard Referencing Technique) and that <b><u>ALL</u></b> sources are included in a bibliography at the end of the essay. Language is correct. Pages and sections are numbered. Plagiarism will be monitored.	10
7. Organisation	Make sure the arguments made are well-structured and presented in a logical fashion. The challenges should be scrutinized and solutions synthesised in an orderly fashion. Independent thinking will be important.	20
