Information

A Doctoral Degree is intended for people who would like to pursue further studies after completing a relevant Master's Degree. A Doctoral degree can be granted on the grounds of a thesis or a number of interrelated, publishable manuscripts/published articles.

Admission requirements

Admission to the programme is subject to approval by the departmental chair. To be admitted to this programme an applicant should have:

- Obtained at least an average of 70% for his/her MAdmin or equivalent master's programme.
- Passed a proficiency assessment at the level determined by the department.

The proficiency assessment comprises two rounds of selection. The first selection round evaluates whether an applicant meets the admissions requirements. During the second selection round, applicants who meet these requirements are invited for an online written discipline-specific assessment. Applicants who pass this assessment are invited for an interview. Assessments are developed and assessed by the Department of Public Administration and Management.

Prospective students must apply for admission to the programme in writing before 30 September of each year, prior to registration in the following year. Applications are submitted on the university's website at https://apply.ufs.ac.za/Application/Start. The following documents should accompany an application.

- 2. Curriculum Vitae
- 3. Academic record
- 4. Certified copies of academic qualifications
- 5. Motivation with reasons for inclusion in the programme



- 6. Copy of an applicant's Master's Degree dissertation or mini-dissertation
- 7. In a research proposal, presenting the applicant's basic field of interest in 4000 words, discuss:
 - i. Background and reason for the study
 - ii. Literature review
 - iii. Research problem
 - iv. Aim and objectives
 - v. Research methodology (Approach, method of data collection, and sample strategy which public sector institution or unit of analysis is the target).
