Information

The Master of Public Administration (MPA) is an established career-focused postgraduate programme aimed at high-level management in the public sector. It is intended for graduates who have not necessarily had an undergraduate background in public administration or management but have gained relevant career experience in the public sector or related areas and want to strengthen their management abilities.

Admission requirements

Admission to the programme is subject to approval by the departmental chair. To be admitted to the Master's programme an applicant should have:

- Any Honours degree or Postgraduate Diploma at NQF level 8.
- Obtained an average of 65% for his/her qualification or equivalent.
- Five years of proven management experience in the Public Sector (on Assistant Director - or Middle Manager levels or above).
- Passed a proficiency assessment at the level determined by the department.

The proficiency assessment comprises two rounds of selection. The first selection round evaluates whether an applicant meets the admissions requirements. During the second selection round, applicants who meet these requirements are invited for an online written discipline-specific assessment. Assessments are developed and assessed by the Department of Public Administration and Management.

Prospective students must apply for admission to the programme in writing before 30 September of each year, prior to registration in the following year. Applications are submitted on the university's website at <https://apply.ufs.ac.za/Application/Start>. The following documents should accompany an application.

1. Certified copy of ID/passport.
2. Academic record.
3. Certified copies of academic qualifications.



4. A curriculum vitae providing evidence that an applicant has at least five years of proven management experience in the public sector.
5. A letter from an applicant's employer's human resources department confirming his/her appointment status and rank.
6. In a research proposal, presenting the applicant's basic field of interest in 4000 words, discuss:
 - i. Background and reason for the study
 - ii. Literature review
 - iii. Research problem
 - iv. Aim and objectives
 - v. Research methodology (Approach, method of data collection, and sample strategy – which public sector institution or unit of analysis is the target).
