





WHAT DO YOU NEED TO STUDY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF THE FREE STATE?

For degree studies at the University of the Free State, we expect that

- you have an NSC or NCV with an endorsement that allows entrance to degree studies (bachelor's degree)
 or an equivalent qualification:
- you meet all the minimum admission requirements for the programme you intend to study.*
- · you have a minimum level of 4 (50%) in English Home Language or English First Additional Language; and
- you must pass certain school subjects with a minimum level of achievement in order to take a certain
 university module. For example, you must get a minimum mark of 50% for Mathematics in Grade 12
 if you plan to study Intermediate Phase Teaching with specialisation in Mathematics, Natural Sciences,
 Technology, and Afrikaans Home Language. Please refer to the section on the faculty-specific admission
 requirements, which also includes the respective compulsory subjects and achievement levels required
 per programme.

HOW DO YOU APPLY?

Visit https://apply.ufs.ac.za Keep your mobile phone and an active email address ready, as you require both to access and complete the online application form.

Proceed through all the steps and submit your electronic application. Make sure that you complete the application form properly, e.g., if you need oncampus residence accommodation or financial aid, indicate this in the relevant section.

Upload copies of the following in PDF or JPEG format when you apply for undergraduate studies:

- · · Your ID if you are a South African citizen
- · · Your passport if you are an international student
- · · Your parent's ID or passport if you are younger than 18
- Your final Grade 11 results with the school's stamp
- National Senior Certificate (NSC) or Grade 12 IEB certificate if you have already matriculated
- Your academic record, only if you are/were a student at another institution of higher learning
- USAf accreditation from the examination board for South African universities. Apply to https://mb.usaf.ac.za/ for conditional exemption, foreign conditional exemption, or mature age conditional exemption. A Universities South Africa (USAf) Certificate of Exemption is required if you do not have an endorsed South African Senior Certificate. If you are eligible for the certificate, but have not yet applied for it, we will assist you with the process. Therefore, you can apply before receiving the required certificate. 

ADMISSION TO STUDY AT THE UFS

Academic excellence is what the UFS is about – the higher your AP score, the better your chances of being chosen and finally admitted to study.

Applicants with the highest AP scores are chosen first, and the admission continues until all spaces have been filled. If you do not meet the minimum admission requirements for your intended/chosen programme of study, you will not be selected. Consult the faculty-specific admission requirements for all the programmes you qualify for and apply for the two programmes that best fit your personality, purpose, and passion.

You will be CONDITIONALLY ADMITTED based on your Grade 11 or equivalent results, subject to you meeting all



the minimum requirements for the intended programme of study. Please note that conditional admission is not applicable to all the selection programmes in the Faculty of Health Sciences.

Your FINAL ADMISSION to the programme of your choice will depend on your final Grade 12 results. You will be notified of the university's admission decision immediately after your final Grade 12 results have been released by the Department of Education. Therefore, it is your responsibility to ensure that your contact details on your application form are correct

Pay attention to the following important information:

- The UFS reserves the right to change the minimum requirements of each programme or any other information without notifying you.
- There are specific admission requirements that you should meet if you want to study at any South African
 university. If you finished school in or after 2008 and have a National Senior Certificate (NSC), you need
 to have a performance level of at least 4 (50%) in four (4) of the seven (7) subjects included in your NSC
 subject package.
- All admission requirements apply to first-year students in 2024.
- Admission to study at the UFS is dependent on the following:
- · Your application should meet all the minimum requirements for the programme
- The programme must have available space and capacity to admit students
- · You have to submit valid school results with your application
- Applications for all non-selection programmes close on 30 September 2023.

An admission point (AP) consisting of seven levels is used. Points will be awarded for six academic subjects.

Diploma in Grade R

Grade R is the first year of the Foundation Phase that spans from Grade R to Grade 3 in the formal schooling system. The purpose of the Diploma in Grade R Teaching is to develop teachers who can demonstrate general principles, as well as focused knowledge and skills appropriate for Grade R teaching.

The Diploma in Grade R Teaching opens an alternative pathway for teachers to advance in their careers as well as promoting further study. In addition, as stated in MRTEQ and the requirements specified for the Diploma, this qualification intends to offer graduates, who wish to become trained Foundation Phase teachers, as alternative pathway to enter the BEd (Foundation Phase Teaching) and present credits for transfer through RPL.

The following admission requirements for prospective students apply:

- In possession of a National Senior Certificate (NCS), or a Level 4 National Certificate (Vocational) (NC(V)) with admission to the Diploma studies, or
- Level 4 or Level 5 Certificate or Diploma in Early Childhood Development may also be presented for admission and assessment pertaining to advanced credit standing.
- Adhere to the minimum prescribed Academic Point (AP) score for this specific programme.
- Provide proof that they have access to a Grade R classroom to complete work-integrated learning (WIL).
- Prospective students are required to submit a form, signed off by the Principal of the applicable school, verifying the student is employed and has access to a Grade R classroom for the duration of the programme.

EXTENDED CURRICULUM PROGRAMMES

Prospective undergraduate students who do not meet the minimum requirements to enrol for mainstream programmes may be considered for the Extended Curriculum Programme (ECP). Placement is subject to the availability of space.

The ECP is designed to equip students who do not meet the minimum requirements with the necessary competencies to be successful in their studies. Academic support and skills development are integrated with regular academic work. To be considered for placement in the ECP, prospective students must apply for the mainstream programmes.

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN EDUCATION (PGCE)

The Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) is a professional educator qualification that 'caps' a degree qualification. It is intended for students seeking a career in the Senior and Further Education and Training phase in schools. This qualification is also suitable for students who already have at least a first bachelor's degree and wish to develop expertise for education-related careers, such as instructors and trainers.

Admission Requirements

NQF Level 7 qualification with a minimum of two school-relevant subjects completed as part of the above qualification. All PGCE applications go through a selection process at faculty level.

A combination of school-related subjects in the obtained degree can ensure admission to this study, e.g.

Option 1	Two subjects up to third-year level
Option 2	One subject up to third-year level and one subject at first-year level

- The Funza Lushaka Bursary Programme is a dedicated scheme to attract and fund students to choose teaching as a profession.
- The aim is to contribute substantially to the supply of adequately trained teachers, with a focus on rural and poor schools.
- It is a merit bursary, meaning high-performing students aged 30 and younger.
- Bursaries are available to enable eligible students to complete a full teaching qualification: a four-year Bachelor of Education degree (BEd) or a three- or four-year bachelor's degree.
- Bursaries are available to students qualifying for the Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE).
- The programme is available to students studying at any of the 24 public universities that are currently
 offering initial teacher education studies

First-time applications open: 1 January every year

Online applications for current students open: 1 October every year

Closing date for re-applications: November every year

The BEd qualification is also suitable for the development of expertise in teaching-related careers, such as instructors; trainers; lecturers/doctors/professors at higher-education (tertiary) institutions; supervisors and/or managers in technology-related industries; managers of workshops, community centres, and factories; experts in loss control; forestry; draughtsmen; designers; etc. Entrepreneurial opportunities are unlimited, and an appropriate choice of subjects (for example, Business Management) opens up the opportunity to establish your own business.
