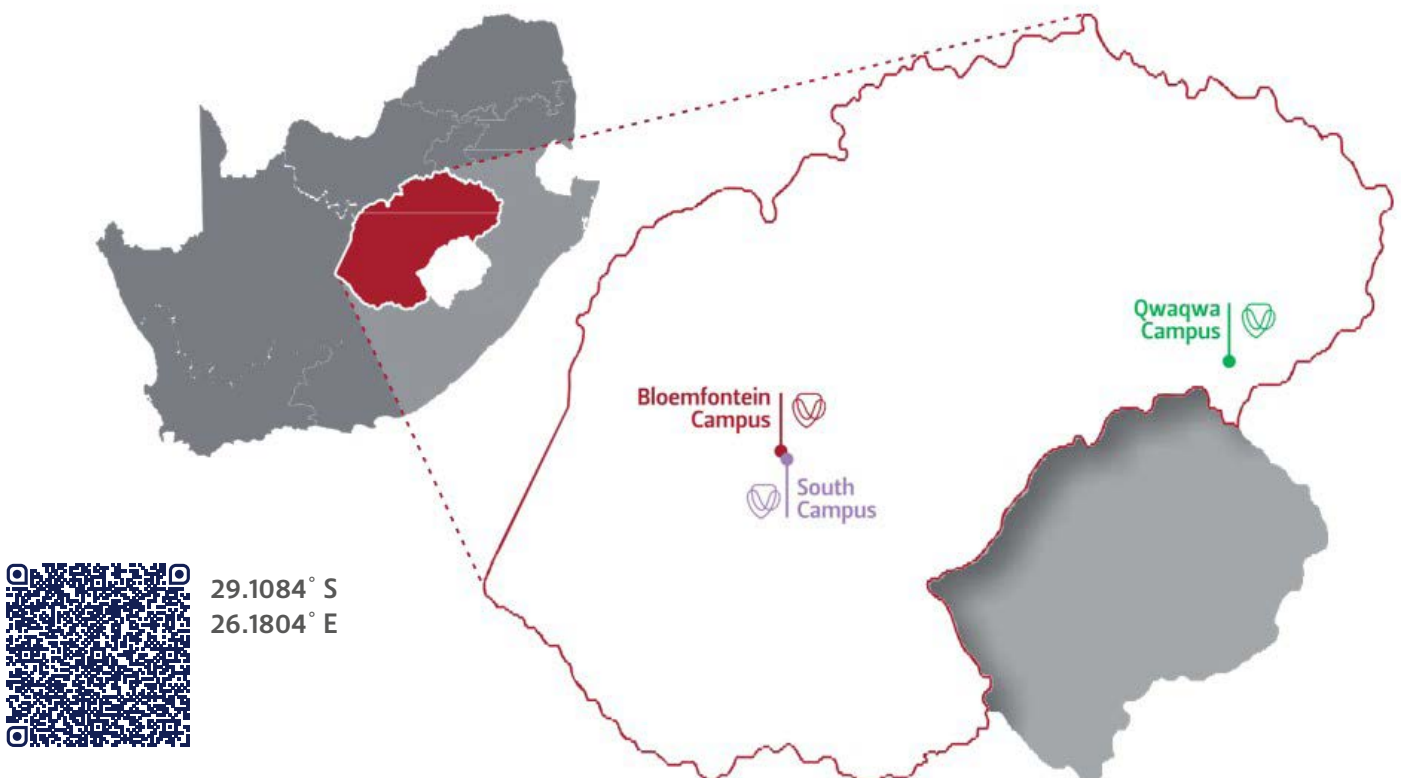
FREE STATE - DISCOVER THE HEART OF SOUTH AFRICA

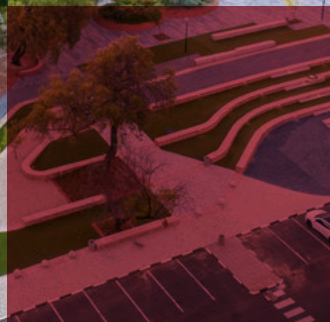

RESEARCH ACHIEVEMENTS

RATED RESEARCHERS

The National Research Foundation's (NRF) rating system is a benchmarking system through which individuals who exemplify the highest standards of research, as well as those demonstrating strong potential as researchers, are identified by an extensive network of South African and international peer reviewers. Ratings are based on the quality and impact of recent research outputs (over an eight-year period).

Apart from research output, the quality and impact of research at tertiary institutions in South Africa are also reflected in the number of rated scientists identified through the NRF-rating system. Awards are valid for a period of six years.

The most distinguished categories are:

- A** for researchers regarded as world leaders in their fields
- B** for researchers who enjoy considerable international recognition by their peers
- C** for researchers regarded as established in their field
- P** for young researchers with exceptional potential who are likely to become future international leaders in their fields

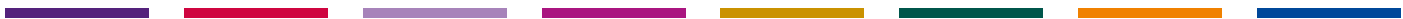

- Students transferring from other universities are required to provide a certificate of conduct and a complete study record from their former institution when submitting their application. Please be aware that application deadlines may vary depending on the faculty to which you are applying. Adherence to these timelines is crucial for the evaluation of your application.

International postgraduate applicants are mandated to submit certified copies of their degrees/certificates and academic transcripts, alongside their applications. Moreover, we require international applicants to include proof of their application for a SAQA (South African Qualifications Authority) Certificate of Evaluation for all qualifications earned outside of South Africa. This step is vital for the assessment of your international qualifications and should be completed without delay to ensure a smooth application process.

As an international student, once your application evaluation has been concluded and you meet the programme requirements, you will receive a letter from the Office for International Affairs that serves as a supporting document for your study visa application where necessary. Visit the South African embassy/consulate/high commission in your home country with the above letters, as well as your passport, to apply for your visa. Please be advised that your study-permit application can take more than six weeks to be finalised. Please contact the Office for International Affairs should you experience challenges or delays with the visa application process.

Visa: You must have a valid study visa before you can enter South Africa. Make sure your study visa is issued to study at the UFS and not at any other institution in South Africa. You must have a valid and appropriate/correct visa to be registered at the UFS. Applications may take more than six weeks to process; please contact the Office for International Affairs immediately if you experience any challenges or delays. See below for more information.



Accommodation: For full-time studies, you must have a letter from Housing and Residence Affairs confirming accommodation. This letter is required for your visa application to study at the UFS. Contact resapplications@ufs.ac.za for assistance.



Medical Aid: You must be a member of a medical aid registered in terms of the Medical Schemes Act 1998 of South Africa, as required by the South African Immigration Act. Please note that your medical-aid cover **MUST** be valid for 12 months, renewable every year for the duration of your studies at the UFS. No travel insurance or hospital plans will be accepted. See below for more information.

Scholarships/Bursaries/Sponsorships: If you have a scholarship, inform your sponsor of the UFS regulations on payments before you register and pay tuition fees.

Applicants who are in possession of a degree from non-South African universities must include the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) evaluation letter or proof of application for evaluation to SAQA with their application form. Non-South African certificates/degrees must be assessed by SAQA prior to registering at the UFS. This process can take anything from **two to three months**. Visit www.saqa.org.za for more information.

STUDY VISAS



If you are a foreign student and wish to study in South Africa, you can apply for a study visa by completing South African Home Affairs Form BI-1738. Study visas must be applied for at VFS Global Centres at various locations in South Africa or at the nearest South African embassy, mission, or consulate abroad; prospective students are

responsible for the payment of the relevant fees. Study visas for studies at a learning institution must be valid for the duration of the study.

The following documents must be submitted with the **BI-1738 application form**:

- a passport valid for no less than 30 days after intended studies
- payment of the prescribed administrative fee
- confirmation and proof of payment for a South African medical aid through a medical scheme registered with the SA Council for Medical Schemes; the cover must remain valid for the duration of the calendar year
- letter of offer from the university, stating the duration of the degree
- letter of undertaking from the university – this letter is issued by the Office for International Affairs; contact Jeanne Niemann: E: niemannja@ufs.ac.za | T: +27 51 401 3219.
- medical and radiological reports (less than six months old)
- yellow fever vaccination certificate, if relevant
- relevant certificates if married, widowed, divorced, or separated
- details regarding arranged accommodation while in South Africa
- proof of sufficient funds to cover tuition fees and maintenance
- a police clearance certificate for the past 12 months or longer since the age of 18.

You are advised to submit the documentation as soon as possible. **DO NOT** send the documentation to the university. You should keep a copy of your submission and all receipts safe. Please note that it can take longer than six weeks to obtain a study visa.

Please note that the holder of a study visa may conduct part-time work for a period not exceeding 20 hours per week.

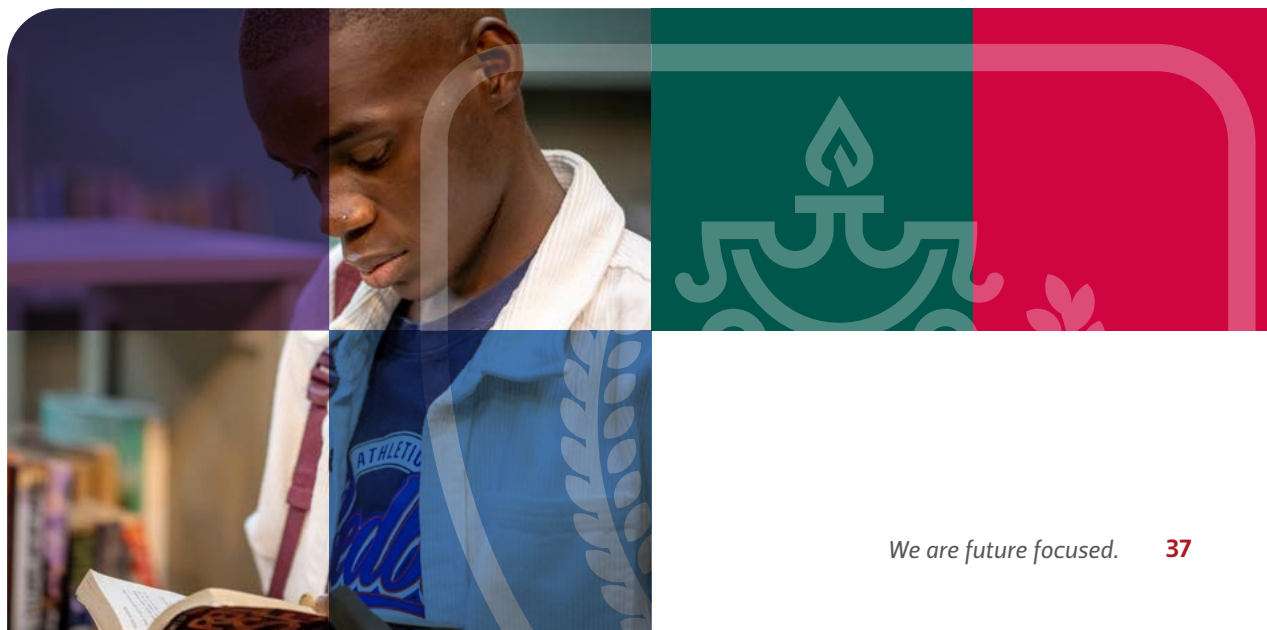

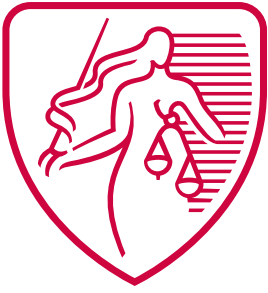

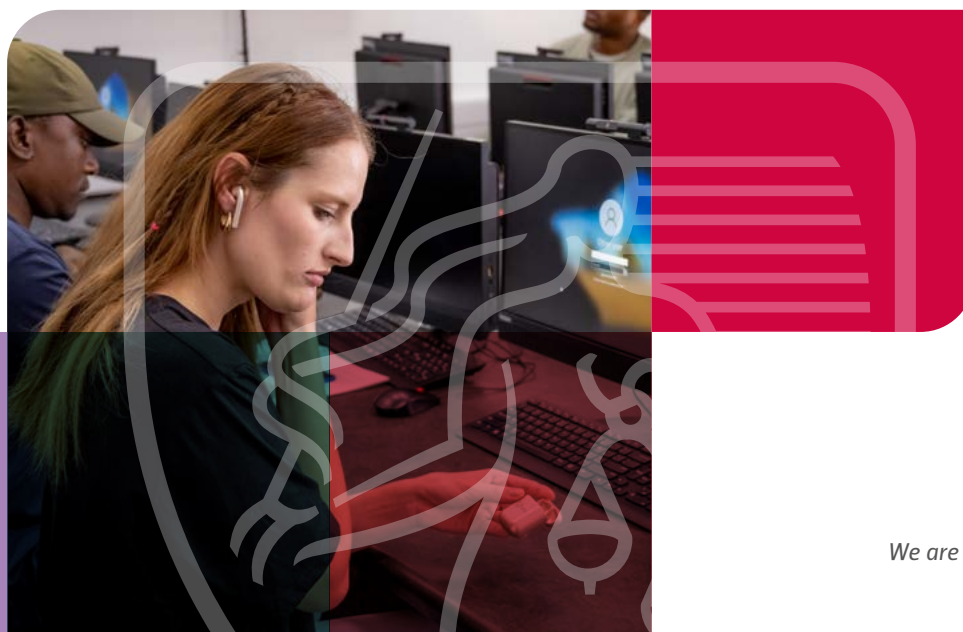

Students studying with financial aid from recognised and reputable funders are exempted from the first payment after the following conditions have been met:

- Historic debt from the previous year has been paid off.
- The funding must be officially confirmed by the funder. Proof of confirmed funding must be submitted to Student Finance **five (5) working days prior to registration**. Please email the confirmation letter to tuitionfees@ufs.ac.za
- The funding awarded must cover the full cost of study for the year.

The above excludes the following:

- **International students** studying with the assistance of financial aid are **NOT EXEMPT** from paying the first payment, as indicated for SELF-PAYING STUDENTS.
- Students who have applied/appealed for funding but have not yet received funding confirmation, must pay the first payment as indicated for SELF-PAYING STUDENTS, **five (5) working days prior to registration**. Payments will be refunded when funding is confirmed.
- Students with financial aid that **does not cover the full cost of study** for the year **MUST** pay the first payment as indicated for SELF-PAYING STUDENTS **five (5) working days prior to registration**.

b. Self-paying and partially funded students

c. Re-registration and first payments for master's and phd student

Submission dates and the dates on which assessment results are captured will determine whether you need to re-register and pay a first payment.

If your assessment results are captured on PeopleSoft on/ before the end of February, re-registration and payment is not required.

If your assessment results have not been captured by the end of February or you have to resubmit your thesis for assessment, you have to re-register and pay the required first payment as indicated.

- If your results are received and captured on PeopleSoft in time for the first annual graduation (April), all module fees will be credited to your account.
- If your results are too late for the first annual graduation, but in time for the second graduation ceremony (December), 50% of the module fees will be credited to your account.
- If your results are too late for both graduation ceremonies, all fees charged for the year remain due and payable.

PAYMENT DATES

Tuition and residence fees are calculated per semester. All fees must be paid as follows, regardless of whether an account has been received or not. **Official account statements are sent to students' ufs4life email addresses** on a monthly basis. It is the responsibility of the student to provide the university with his/ her correct contact details and to make enquiries should he/ she not receive an account.

The university strictly adheres to the Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA). Account statements or any other personal information will NOT be shared with a third party. You must forward the account to the person(s) responsible for paying the account. It is your responsibility to enquire if you have not received an account.

South African students

- The first payment as indicated must be paid **five (5) working days** prior to registration.
- All fees for the first semester are payable on/before **31 March**.
- The tuition-fee account must be settled in full by **31 August**.

International students

- The first payment as indicated must be paid **five (5) days prior to registration**.
- All fees for the first semester are payable on/before **31 March**.
- The tuition-fee account must be settled in full by **30 June**, regardless of any other date that may appear on the account statement.

All other fees are payable no later than the end of the month following the month in which the transaction took place, as indicated on the account statement, unless specifically stipulated otherwise in the regulations.

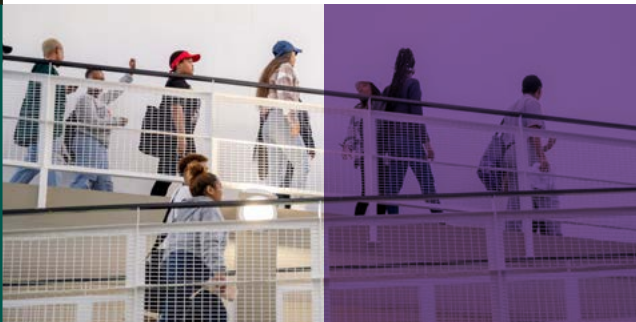

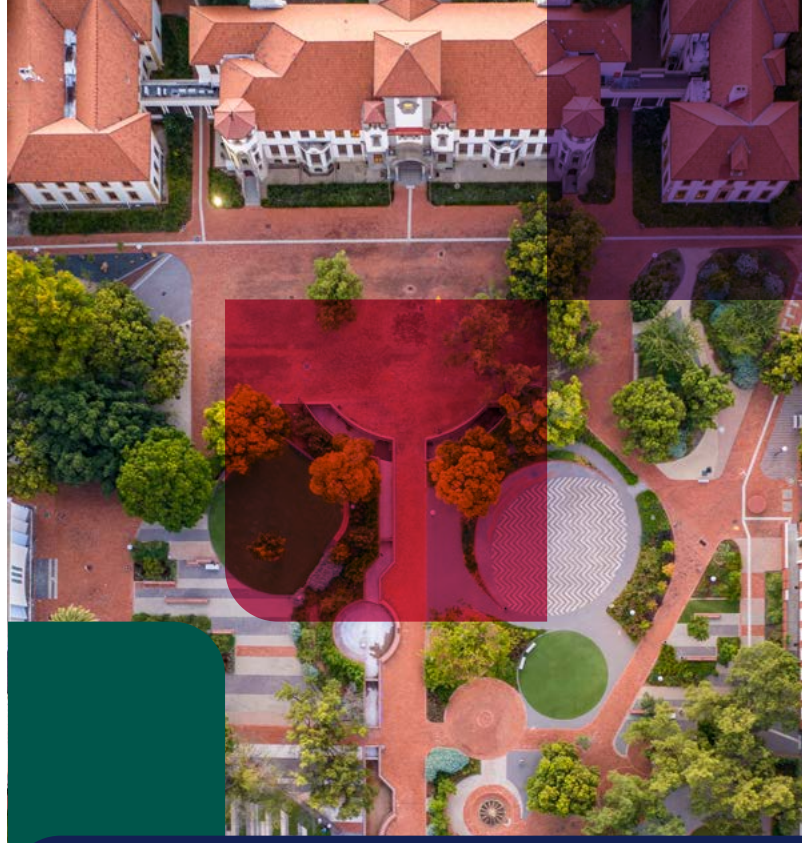

LIABILITIES

Accidents

As the university only insures its own risks, it cannot be held liable for accidents that happen to students. It is therefore recommended that students take out personal accident insurance.

Damage to students' personal possessions

Vehicles on campus

It is recommended that students keeping vehicles on campus should take out SASRIA (riot insurance). All students and members of the public who wish to use the roads on campus should purchase an access disk issued by the Division of Protection Services of the university. The disc must be displayed on the windscreen.
