

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN EDUCATION

The Postgraduate Certificate in Education is a professional teaching programme that 'caps' an approved undergraduate Bachelor's Degree

Admission Requirements

- Subject to selection and based on the capacity of the Faculty of Education.
- Students must be in possession of a National Senior Certificate for admission.
- A minimum achievement level of 4 (50%) in the language of instruction is required.
- Home language at 55% for foundation and intermediate phase programmes

AP Score (four-year programme): 30 AP Score (extended programme): 28 – 29

FUNZA LUSHAKA

The Funza Lushaka Bursary programme is a dedicated scheme to attract and fund students to choose teaching as a profession. It is a merit bursary for high performing students aged 30 and below.

Bursaries are available to enable eligible students to complete a full teaching qualification, a four-year Bachelor of Education degree (BEd).
