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
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ARBEIDSTERAPEUTE NA DIE VSA

Vier arbeidsterapeute verbonde aan die Departement Arbeidsterapie het in Februarie vanjaar die VSA besoek. ON TOUR WITH OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

An experiential learning tour was held for 3rd year Occupational Therapy students as well as a number of philosophy students during March 2010. The purpose of the tour, which took place in Bloemfontein, was to sensitize students to the relevance of human rights to social justice issues and ultimately cultivate cultural competence.

A total of 60 students and 4 lecturers from the two disciplines participated in this event. The week-long tour included a fully guided historical tour through Bloemfontein, a lecture on the challenges that students with disabilities face and discussions with people from diverse cultures regarding their experiences as minority groups.

In addition, students travelled to MUCPP by taxi, (in wheelchairs) attending lectures in Social Justice and Critical Thinking presented by well-known public speakers such as Elna Boesak and André Zaaiman.



STUDENTS LEARN WHILE PROVIDING A MUCH NEEDED SERVICE

And you thought that dietitians are trained to help people lose weight and tell diabetics what to eat? Not at all! Fourth year Dietetics students from the Department of Nutrition and Dietetics are providing a much needed community service for the past four years in the rural areas of the Southern and Central Free State. This service does not only entail providing nutrition education to prevent and treat disease, but also include a long-term research project on nutrition related health issues in these communities.

The Assuring Health for All in the Free State (AHA FS) study is a research project aimed at determining how living in urban informal settlements and in rural areas influences the lifestyles of populations that predispose them to both chronic diseases (such as

obesity, diabetes and cardiovascular disease) as well as under nutrition. This study will provide the Free State with a direct estimate of the health/disease burden attributable to established and emerging risk factors for obesity, diabetes, and cardiovascular disease, as well as infectious diseases such as HIV/AIDS, TB and under nutrition.

The challenge for students and lecturers is to design and develop appropriate educational and health promoting programs with the emphasis on prevention rather than cure in disadvantaged communities where services are provided. Except for providing an important service according to specific needs, this unique opportunity in return offers a valuable learning opportunity to students in a real community setting.



STUDENTS PARTAKE IN AN INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

Three postgraduate students from the Department of Medical Microbiology and Virology recently attended the 14th International Congress on Infectious Diseases (ICID) in Miami, Florida, USA from 9th to 12th March 2010. Rudo Samudzi, Lehlohonolo Mathengtheng and Shannon Smouse each presented their results as posters entitled "Gene optimization for expression of Crimean-Congo hemorrhagic fever viral nucleoprotein," "Development of a recombinant antigen and multiplex PCR for the differentiation of tick-borne and mosquito-borne flaviviruses" and "Preparation of antigenically active recombinant yellow-fever viral envelope domain III protein", respectively. The three students are under the supervision of Prof Felicity Burt whose research group focuses on immune profiling and antigen/epitope discovery for medically significant vector-borne viruses. Funding for travel was awarded by the University of the Free State Grow Our Own Timber program and by the NHLs travel funds.
