
NATIONAL ANTHEM OF SOUTH AFRICA



REV JAN LUBBE



GUEST SPEAKER

everend Jan Lubbe completed his tertiary education at the University of the Free State (UFS) (1983–1990), obtaining degrees in Theology and Philosophy (cum laude). As part of his doctoral research on 'The Reception of Abraham Kuyper in South Africa', he spent time at Stellenbosch University (US), the Theological University of Apeldoorn, the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam, the Theological University Kampen, and at numerous global and local archives. He was president of the UFS Student Representative Council in 1988/89 and was awarded the Abe Bailey Bursary to visit the UK in 1989.

Before entering the ministry, Rev Lubbe lectured full-time at the UFS (1990) and US (1995-1996), and part-time in the UFS Department of Historical and Constructive Theology since 2003. He received recognition as Best Lecturer in the Faculty (2011) and the Excellence in Teaching and Learning award from the UFS Prestige Forum. His research in church history, history of theology, liturgy, and spirituality resulted in two published

monographs, eleven chapters in co-authored publications, twelve articles in accredited scientific journals, and several papers at national and international conferences. As a regular columnist, he has published more than 100 pieces on church and society, ethics, and the public role of theology in *Volksblad*, *Netwerk24*, and *Kerkbode* over the past 15 years.

Reverend Lubbe has been pastoring the Dutch Reformed Church Berg-en-Dal in Bloemfontein since 1997 and serves the broader ecclesiastical and South African ecumenical community in numerous leadership roles. He was moderator of the 2013 and 2022 Free State Synods of the Dutch Reformed Church (DRC), and of the General Synod of the DRC in 2023. He also chairs the Moderamen of the DRC in Southern Africa, the Curatorium of the DRC Free State (overseeing theological training for this family of churches), the management of the DRC Free State Archive and Document Centre, and the boards of Hospice Bloemfontein and Siesta Old Age Home.

Tirhani Asnath Masia, born on 11 February 1984 in a rural Valdezia village in Limpopo, South Africa, completed her secondary education in 2001 at Rivubye High School. She earned a BSc in Nutrition in 2006, an MSc in Public Nutrition in 2015 from the University of Venda, and a Postgraduate Diploma in Health Professional Education from the University of Cape Town in 2016. She joined the University of Venda as a part-time junior lecturer in 2007, was permanently and full-time appointed in 2014, and is now a lecturer. She is a registered Nutritionist with the HPCSA.

With her thesis titled: STRATEGY ON OPTIMIZING NUTRITIONAL STATUS OF INFANTS THROUGH WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE IN VHEMBE DISTRICT OF LIMPOPO PROVINCE, SOUTH AFRICA, the candidate's research presents a significant contribution to the field of nutrition and public health through the development of an integrated strategy aimed at optimising the nutritional status of infants aged 6–23 months in the rural Collins Chabane Local Municipality of Vhembe District, Limpopo, South Africa. Utilising a robust mixed-methods approach, the study assessed the intersection of water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) practices with household food security and infant nutritional outcomes. Findings revealed critical associations between suboptimal WASH practices, inadequate infant feeding, and malnutrition indicators. The research culminated in the development of a comprehensive, community-informed WASH strategy designed to enhance infant nutrition, promote optimal feeding practices, and empower women through education. This thesis makes a valuable contribution to achieving sustainable development goals and provides actionable insights for future health and nutrition interventions in similar rural settings.

With her thesis titled: IMPACT OF A FOOD SUPPLEMENT ON THE NUTRITIONAL STATUS OF PREGNANT WOMEN AND THE BIRTH OUTCOMES OF THEIR OFFSPRING, the candidate makes a meaningful contribution to the field of maternal and child nutrition, particularly in resource-limited settings. Conducted in Kroonstad, South

Africa, this rigorous study assessed the effects of a balanced energy-protein supplement fortified with multiple micronutrients on maternal health and birth outcomes. Her research highlights the complex interplay of malnutrition, food insecurity, and inflammation in pregnancy, demonstrating the challenges of improving maternal nutritional status and neonatal outcomes through supplementation alone. While the intervention did not yield statistically significant improvements in key health indicators, the findings support the urgent need for integrated nutritional and public health strategies. Her work aligns with global research on maternal nutrition and provides valuable insights for policy and programme development aimed at optimising pregnancy outcomes in low-to-middle-income populations.

Pauline Muthoni was born in Kenya on 03 July 1987. She received her secondary school education in Nyeri County, where she matriculated at the South Tetu Girls High School in 2004. She obtained her Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Public Health degree at Kenyatta University in 2010 and her Master's in Nursing at the University of Nairobi in 2017. She started her career as a clinical nurse in 2012 and proceeded to teach Critical Care Nursing at Kenya Medical Training College in 2018. In 2020, she was appointed as a lecturer at the School of Nursing at the Dedan Kimathi University of Technology.

With her thesis titled: **SELF-MANAGEMENT INFOGRAPHICS TO PREVENT CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE IN PATIENTS WITH TYPE II DIABETES MELLITUS IN RURAL KENYA**, the candidate makes a significant contribution to diabetes care in under-resourced rural settings. The three-phased pragmatic study was informed by the integrated model of behaviour prediction. The context-specific and culturally tailored infographics that were developed were presented as a booklet and, furthermore, medication storage bags were printed with diabetes mellitus self-management infographics. The study indicates that the infographics could promote self-management of Type II diabetes and, thereby, prevent chronic kidney disease. Examiners and journal reviewers have expressed great interest in the development and use of infographics in the field of nursing.

She started her career as a Professional Nurse at Pelonomi Hospital in Bloemfontein in 1991. In 2000, she was appointed at the Free State Department of Health as the assistant director and provincial maternal and child health coordinator. She is currently a lecturer in the School of Nursing at the University of the Free State.

With her thesis titled: A MIDDLE RANGE THEORY FOR STRENGTHENING THE ADVANCED ANTENATAL CARE PROGRAMME IN THE FREE STATE, the candidate contributes to scholarship by developing a middle-range theory to strengthen advanced antenatal care programmes. With this contribution, she offers insight into the context, mechanisms, and outcomes to be considered by policymakers and management when planning, designing and implementing such programmes for midwives in primary healthcare settings. A three-phased realist evaluation of an implemented Advanced Antenatal Care programme in the Free State was undertaken using a mixed-method sequential approach. Multiple data strands highlighted the interplay between the clinical workplace factors, transfer climate, the performance of the midwives, birth outcomes, and the programme. The identified context-mechanism-outcome configurations can guide the development of strategies to strengthen and facilitate the transfer of learning in the implementation of future advanced antenatal care and midwifery-related programmes. One article was published, while two are under review.

Gift Nyirenda was born in Zambia on 21st July 1979 in Chama District, Eastern Province, Zambia. He graduated from Chama Secondary School in 1998. He completed his Bachelor of Theology qualification as the best student at Justo Mwale Theological College (Lusaka) in 2007. In 2011, he graduated with the Master of Theology in Biblical Studies and Hermeneutics at UFS and the Master of Theology in Bible Translation in 2016. He currently works with the Bible Society of Zambia as Translation Manager in charge of the Translation Department.

With his thesis titled: INTERSEMIOTIC BIBLE TRANSLATION FOR AN ORALLY DOMINANT CULTURE: THE CASE OF TRANSLATING LAMENTATIONS INTO NSENGA, the candidate contributes significantly to Bible translation studies by emphasising the necessity of an intersemiotic approach—oral, visual, and written—in translating biblical texts. By analysing Nsenga laments, the study highlights the importance of oral traditions, tonal variations, and performance elements in conveying meaning. It challenges linear translation methods, advocating for complexity theory to address the dynamic, interactive nature of translating sacred texts across different media. It underscores that translation is not just about words but involves cultural, cognitive, and performative aspects. This perspective enriches translation by recognising the deep intersemiotic interaction at every stage of the process, which is especially relevant for translators working with poetic and oral-based texts. Ultimately, the research calls for a holistic, context-sensitive approach to Bible translation, ensuring that meaning is created across semiotic systems.

Daniel Sandford Banda was born on 17 January 1979 in Kasama Town, Zambia. In 1997, he matriculated at the Libala Secondary School. In 2008, he obtained his BTh degree with distinction from Justo Mwale University College. In 2012, he received an MTh from the UFS; in 2014, he received an MTh from PTHU in Groningen, The Netherlands. He started his career as a Reverend in Kitwe in 2008 and is currently serving as a minister of the Reformed Church in Zambia (RCZ) in Chipata while also serving on the Moderature of the RCZ.

With his thesis titled: IMAGING PROSPERITY IN AFRICAN CHRISTIANITY: A PRACTICAL THEOLOGICAL CASE STUDY OF URBAN CONGREGATIONS IN LUSAKA, ZAMBIA, the candidate contributes to scholarship in African Christianity. The empirical, qualitative research focuses on the proliferating Prosperity Faith movement. It investigates how techniques and practices are deliberately employed to image prosperity. Projecting affluence in ministers' lifestyles, in preaching and in church architecture, creates the impression of faith being rewarded with health and wealth. Traditional Christian images such as the cross or the elements of broken bread and spilled wine in Holy Communion, portraying a theology of incarnational solidarity with the poor and afflicted, are replaced by images of triumphalism and earning a "breakthrough" through proper faith. The candidate suggests exploring the imaging of an alternative concept such as 'flourishing', understood as a holistic and multidimensional state of

undeservedly "being in Christ" that encompasses physical, emotional, spiritual, and social well-being, often despite circumstances.

He graduated with a Bachelor of Theology Degree at Justo Mwale Theological College in 2006 and a Master of Theology at the University of the Free State in 2015. His career as a Minister began in 2007 at the Reformed Church in Zambia, Sinda Congregation (2007 – 2011), Later RCZ Chifubu Congregation (2011-2018). In 2018, Extension in Zambia (TEEZ) seconded him to serve as Training and Capacity Development Manager at the Theological Education. He is currently the Acting Executive Director at the Theological Education by Extension in Zambia.

With his thesis titled: LEADERSHIP AND FINANCES IN AFRICAN CONGREGATIONS: A PRACTICAL THEO-LOGICAL STUDY OF CONGREGATIONS IN THE REFORMED CHURCH IN ZAMBIA, the candidate contributes to the practical theological study of the intricate relationship between leadership and finances in congregations within the Reformed Church in Zambia. The research investigates how leadership practices impact on financial management and sustainability in African congregations. The study further reveals that effective leadership, characterised by financial transparency, accountability, and stewardship, is crucial in promoting optimal financial management. The research proposes that upholding these leadership tenets can create flourishing congregations. The research proposes a contextualised leadership model, integrating biblical principles and African values, to enhance financial oversight and integrity in congregations. The findings contribute to the broader discourse on leadership, finance, and sustainability in African churches, offering practical and actionable recommendations for denominational leaders, pastors, and congregational members, empowering them to influence their congregations positively.

(Practical Theology) at the University of Stellenbosch in 2000 and a M.PA (Public Administration) in 2015 at the University of the Western Cape. He started his career as a minister in the URCSA Kuruman congregation in 1997 and Postmasburg since 2016. On 1 October 2021, he was appointed as part-time Executive Administrator in the Regional Synod Phororo.

With his thesis titled: A MISSIONAL-PRACTICAL EVALUATION OF THE ECCLESIOLOGY OF RURAL CON-GREGATIONS IN THE REGIONAL SYNOD OF PHORORO U.R.C.S.A., the candidate makes a contribution towards the development of a missional ecclesiology for rural congregations in the Northern Cape. The ecclesiology for rural congregations should be developed from below and have a developmental character. It is also informed by the Belhar Confession. Leadership is a key aspect in the formation of rural congregations as the leaders are called to discern their rural, traditional, and African context and create strategic processes to contribute to the changes that are needed in their context. The empirical voices of the membership of six rural congregations were heard, by using the National Church Life Survey. Appreciative Inquiry initiated the strategic process, by focusing on the

positive aspects of existing ministries. A strategic framework was developed to guide the mission and ministries of rural congregations.

He started his career as part time lecturer for the Faculty of Theology and Religion; a position he is still holding to date.

With his thesis titled: **EXPLORING THE ZION CHRISTAN CHURCH'S TEACHINGS AND QUALITIES IN COM- PARISON WITH ZION CHURCHES**, the candidate using ethnographic methods, the study compares Zion Christian Church led by Bishop Engenas Lekganyane, Edward Lekganyane and Barnabas Lekganyane to other Zion churches with a view to draw out its distinctive aspects. Among others, the study investigates the Africanisation of the Christian faith seen in the ways that the ZCC intentionally adopts the African cultural heritage closer to the Christian faith. The study highlights the distinctiveness of the church seen in inculturation and the contextualisation of the Christian faith. As major findings, the study observes that intersection between Christianity and African practices is complex and needs more attention or research. In addition, despite the complexity associated with Africanisation, the study further discovers that African Christians need to experience the gospel from their own cultural context.


