RELEBOHILE MOLETSANE

Relebohile Moletsane is Professor and the FALF-Wits-NRF Research Chair in Gender-based Violence and Femicide at the University of Witwatersrand in Johannesburg. She also serves as a UNESCO UniTwin Co-Chair in Mental Health and Psychological Support for Teachers and Learners.

Previously, Prof Moletsane held the John Langalibalele Dube Chair in Rural Education at the University of KwaZulu-Natal. Using participatory visual methodologies, her research focuses on understanding and challenging unequal gender norms, sexual and reproductive health and rights, girlhood studies, and community-based approaches to social change.

She has co-edited several influential academic volumes, including *African Feminist Girlhood Studies and Development* (with Catherine Cymone Fourshey and Marla L. Jaksch, Palgrave MacMillan); *Where am I in the Picture? Researcher Positionality in Rural Studies* (2024, with Claudia Mitchell & Katarina Giritlin, University of Toronto Press); and *Ethical Practice in Participatory Visual Research with Girls and Young Women in Rural Communities* (2021, with Lisa Wiebesiek, Astrid Treffry-Goately, and April Mandrona, Berghahn Books).

Prof Moletsane also co-edited *Disrupting Shameful Legacies: Girls and Young Women Speak Back Through the Arts to Address Sexual Violence* (2018) with Claudia Mitchell, published by Brill.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY WITH SPECIALISATION IN CURRICULUM STUDIES

MOTSETA, Lesiba Lesley

Lesiba Lesley Motseta was born in Lebowakgomo (Limpopo Province) on the 21st of June 1990. He received his secondary education in Lebowakgomo, where he matriculated at Kopano High School in 2007. He earned his educational degree in 2018 from the University of South Africa (UNISA), subsequently obtaining his Honours in Education in 2020 and his Master of Education degree in 2023, also from UNISA. His career as an educator began in 2018. At present, apart from being a permanent educator at Lafata Primary School, he is currently serving as a PGCE Assessor at Stadio Higher Education on a part-time basis.

With his thesis titled: **EXPLORING THE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT NEEDS OF BUSINESS STUDIES EDUCATORS IN ONE SOUTH AFRICAN EDUCATION DISTRICT**, the candidate contributes to the field of educator professional development within Business Studies education in South Africa. With this contribution, he attempts to deepen the understanding of the specific, context-bound professional development needs of Business Studies educators in one South African education district. The study highlights gaps in existing professional development initiatives, particularly in relation to content knowledge, curriculum implementation, and assessment practices. The results of this investigation serve as an indication of the value that context-sensitive and needs-driven interventions hold in addressing gaps in current professional development provisions and improving the quality of teaching and learning in Business Studies.

NCALA, Lucky Ernest

Lucky Ernest Ncala was born on 4 January 1986 in the Dekuilen Farm of Standerton, Mpumalanga, South Africa. He matriculated at Imisebeyelanga Secondary School in 2003 and later attained a Bachelor of Education at the University of Pretoria in 2008. He graduated with a BEd Honours degree in Curriculum and Instructional Development and Design at the University of Pretoria in 2015 and a Master of Education at the University of the Free State in 2020. His career as a teacher began in 2009 and he later became a lecturer at the North-West University in 2022.

With his thesis titled: **EXPLORING TEACHERS' BELIEFS AND PRACTICES INFLUENCING THE FACILITATION OF ONLINE INQUIRY-BASED LEARNING IN LIFE SCIENCES CLASSROOMS**, Ncala makes a meaningful contribution to scholarship on inquiry-based learning, online pedagogy, classroom technology use and acceptance, and teacher beliefs in science education. Employing an interpretivist multiple-case study design and the Community of Practice and Unified Theory of Acceptance and Use of Technology frameworks, Ncala investigated how teachers' pedagogical and technological beliefs shape the enactment of inquiry-based learning in online learning environments. The findings show that positive beliefs about inquiry and technology acceptance enabled the use of



collaborative strategies, online videos, and practical work simulations. The pedagogical beliefs and the acceptance and use of technologies were mediated by contextual factors, including professional development, school contexts, and access to specific technologies. The study culminates in a coherent model integrating teacher beliefs, online environments, inquiry practices, and technology use.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY WITH SPECIALISATION IN EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT AND LEARNING

NCUBE, Sifiso Everelly

Sifiso Everelly Ncube was born in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe on the 9th of December 1975 and received her secondary education at Fatima High School in 1994. She obtained a Diploma in Education (Primary) with specialisation in Infant Education at the United College of Education in 2005 and later graduated with a BEd ECD degree (2010) and an MEd ECD degree (2016, with merit), both at Great Zimbabwe University. Her career began as a primary school teacher in Bulawayo in 2006 and she rose through the ranks to become a lecturer at the United College of Education. She is currently a lecturer at Botswana Open University.

With her thesis titled: **EXPLORING EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT PRE-SERVICE PROGRAMMES IN PREPARING TEACHERS FOR INCLUSIVE SETTINGS**, the candidate contributes to scholarship on pre-service teacher education programmes by examining the preparation of early childhood teachers for inclusive settings. Employing a qualitative approach, Ncube purposively sampled 95 pre-service ECD student teachers from two colleges in Zimbabwe to explore how they were prepared for inclusive working environments. The findings revealed a fragmented integration of inclusive education content in a few pre-service syllabi, the absence of structured interdisciplinary collaboration and stakeholder engagement during training, and persistent systematic gaps between theory and practice, which left student teachers feeling inadequately prepared and possessing low self-efficacy in inclusive settings. The results of the study underscore the urgent need for ECD pre-service programme developers at the two colleges to mainstream inclusive education as a cross-cutting theme requiring integration across all pre-service syllabi, rather than confining it to a few courses.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY WITH SPECIALISATION IN SUBJECT EDUCATION IN SOCIAL SCIENCES

MUTONHODZA, Lucky Nil

Lucky Mutonhodza was born on 2 August 1982 in Zaka District, Masvingo Province, Zimbabwe. He completed Ordinary Level at Mutsambwa Secondary School, Zaka District in 1999 and attained a Diploma in Education (Primary) at the United College of Education in 2009. He graduated with a Bachelor of Education Honours Degree (Sociology) in 2017 and Master of Education Degree (Sociology) in 2019, from Great Zimbabwe University. He joined the Ministry of Education as a primary school teacher in 2009 and later transferred to the Ministry of Higher and Tertiary Education as a Sociology of Education lecturer, the post he holds to date.



With his thesis titled: **THE SOCIOLOGICAL IMPACT OF CULTURAL CAPITAL ON LINGUISTIC ACQUISITION OF ENGLISH SECOND LANGUAGE PRIMARY SCHOOL LEARNERS**, the candidate contributes to the sociological impact of cultural capital on the linguistic acquisition of English Second Language by primary school learners. Using a mixed-methods approach, Mutonhodza sampled 100 primary school teachers for quantitative data and 20 for qualitative insights. The study confirms that cultural capital is essential in determining the acquisition of English Second Language (ESL) among primary school learners. Learners with greater cultural capital find it easier to navigate the social and educational systems and the study proposed a model depicting the mutually beneficial relationship between cultural capital and the acquisition of ESL linguistic skills. Key recommendations include creating a supportive reading environment and ensuring diverse, age-appropriate books are available at home.
