



ABOUT THE UFS







The University of the Free State (UFS) has a proud history as one of the oldest institutions of higher education in South Africa. It opened its doors in Bloemfontein in 1904 as the Grey University College, with six students in the Humanities. Today it is a multi-campus institution, with two diverse campuses in Bloemfontein and one in Qwaqwa in the scenic Eastern Free State, accommodating more than 40 000 students in its seven faculties (Economic and Management Sciences, Education, Health Sciences, the Humanities, Law, Natural and Agricultural Sciences, Theology and Religion), with an increasing number of international students and associates, and an ever-widening scope of active involvement in and contribution to its surrounding communities.

For the past 119 years, the UFS has been delivering quality graduates who have made their mark in various sectors. What sets the institution apart is its holistic student support initiatives, enabling it to achieve some of the highest success rates in the country. Delivering students who are in high demand in the global job market remains a top priority. An established network of industry partners and close collaboration with the public and private sectors, as well as a continuous process of transformation and curriculum renewal, dovetail to produce highly employable graduates.

DEVELOPMENT OF THE UFS CREST OVER MORE THAN A CENTURY



1904

Up to 1935, the same coat of arms was used as the Grey College School.



1935

By 1935, with the name change to University College of the Orange Free State, the coat of arms fell into disuse, especially among students.



1947

In 1947, an agreement between management and students led to the new motto *Per Fidem ad Sapientiam* (Through faith to wisdom).



1950

In 1952, it was changed to *In Deo Sapientiae Lux* (In God is the light of wisdom). The traditional orange, white and blue, linking the UFS to the South African national colours, changed in the late 1990s.

The orange was replaced by cherry red.



2011

The academic brand - the historic University of the Free State crest that has been the symbol of the university since 1952, has evolved to embrace the aesthetic expectations of the stakeholders.

The shape of the traditional academic shield has been simplified and contemporised. Much of the symbolism of the crest remains intact, acknowledging the location of the UFS brand as one of the country's premier institutions of higher education, with a proud history of academic excellence and an

ever-evolving, vibrant culture.







arius Rezelman is a UFS Council member, serving as Vice-Chair of the Finance subcommittee and as a member of the Investment as well as the Audit, Risk and Information subcommittees.

In 2013, he was appointed by the Cabinet to the Board of the South African National Space Agency (SANSA), where he chaired both the Strategy and Investment and the Audit and Risk subcommittees.

Rezelman is currently the managing director of a management consultancy called Tribe Consulting, focusing on the higher education sector. He has worked with nearly all South African universities across a wide range of areas, including

- feasibility studies to establish the Sol Plaatje University in Kimberley, a campus for the University of Zululand in Ulundi, medical schools at the Nelson Mandela and Limpopo universities, and veterinary schools at Fort Hare, the University of Namibia, and the Sefako Makgatho Health Sciences University; and
- merger planning and affordability modelling at 10 of the 16 universities affected by mergers.

Previously, at the international management consultancy, Gemini Consulting, he led the investigation resulting in Telkom building their first call centres and he also led the team that managed the merger between Southern Life and Momentum.

Rezelman studied a BComm at Rhodes University and a BComm Honours at Unisa, focusing on strategy and project management. He also attended the International Business School of Capgemini University in France.

He is a keen sportsman, having played rugby at provincial level and participating in more than 10 Argus cycle tours. He is married, with four children and three grandchildren.

In 2009 he obtained a B.A. Ed degree, with Merit, from the University of Zambia. In 2013 he obtained a Master of Education degree from the University of Zambia. His career as a teacher began in 2009, and he rose to the rank of head of department. He has worked as a part-time lecturer at Nkana College of Education and at the Technical and Vocational Teachers College in Luanshya District, Zambia.

With his thesis, titled: USING TEACHERS' LIVED EXPERIENCES TO ENHANCE PEDAGOGY IN ENGLISH 2ND LANGUAGE IN ZAMBIAN SECONDARY SCHOOLS, the candidate contributes to the scholarship on applied linguistics and literacy development. This study, premised on the narrative design, confirms that how the teachers experienced the English lessons, from primary school to tertiary level, does influence pedagogy in their English classrooms. The candidate caps the thesis with a multilayered model that guides Secondary English teachers, and it explicates the following: the need for the re-design of teacher training courses to make them more responsive to secondary school needs, the need for an exhaustive understanding of the impact of the lived experiences on pedagogy by the ESL course designers, how contextual teaching can be achieved in the ESL classrooms, how ESL teachers can move from conservatism to dynamism, and how translanguaging practices can effectively replace monolinguistic practices.

Mohau Lika was born in 1973. He went to Emmanuel High School and matriculated in 1990. He enrolled at the National University of Lesotho and obtained a Bachelor of Science Education in 1995. Furthermore, he enrolled at the University of Free State and graduated with a Bachelor of Education Honours and Masters of Education in 2002 and 2006, respectively. He worked as an Educator and Lecturer in Lesotho institutions Mount Royal High School, Lerotholi Polytechnic and St James Anglican High School, where he served as a Deputy Principal. He joined the South African Education System as an educator at Lereng Secondary School in 2009.

With his thesis, titled: **ENHANCING THE TEACHING AND LEARNING OF ALGEBRAIC EXPRESSIONS AND EQUATIONS THROUGH REASONING IN GRADE 9,** the candidate contributes to the scholarship on teaching and learning of algebraic expressions and equations. Using bricolage-guided participatory action methodologies, Mohau interrogated participants' diverse perspectives on reasoning to enhance the teaching and learning of algebraic expressions and equations towards deep conceptual knowledge. The reasoning-based approach suggested in the thesis successfully reduced the complexity of teaching and learning by converging conceptual and procedural knowledge, which also appeared to promote the learners' self-driven learning capability and their critical thinking skills on the content matter in a manner befitting their own varying learning contexts. The complexity of teaching and learning algebra was successfully reduced. The study synthesised multiple theoretical positions and participants' perspectives into a framework that could be the starting point for further teaching and learning enhancements.

He graduated with a BA degree with the University of South Africa (UNISA) in 1998 and a Masters of Education with Zimbabwe Open University (ZOU) in 2004. His career as a teacher began in 1986 and he rose through the ranks to became Head of Department in the Theory of Education and Professional Studies department and lecturer at Morgenster Teacher's College under the Ministry of Higher and Tertiary Education Science, Innovation and Technology Development

With his thesis, titled: THE INFLUENCE OF DISTRIBUTED LEADERSHIP ON TEACHING PRACTICE SUPERVISION IN MASVINGO PROVINCE'S TEACHER EDUCATION COLLEGES the candidate contributes to scholarship on distributed leadership focusing on how teacher leaders supervise student teachers on teaching practice. Using a qualitative approach Makasi sampled 8 teacher leaders to understand and explain the influence of distributed leadership on student teacher supervision. While most teacher leaders appear to have limited knowledge on distributed leadership, they were more knowledgeable about the demands and expectations as well as the challenges they faced as teacher leaders. The study presents the argument that demands, and expectations, challenges and perceptions of various teacher leaders shape the differential implementation trajectories and practices of the distributed leadership when supervising student teachers on teaching practice in Zimbabwe.

The candidate started school at Moemaneng Primary School, he also attended Sparta Intermediate School and Itemoheng Primary School. He completed high school at Tlokola Secondary School in Marquard, Free State. He enrolled for a Bachelor of Science at UFS Bloemfontein campus and completed his degree in 2011. In 2012, the candidate enrolled for BSc Honours and in 2013 he enrolled for a Master's degree. It was in 2018 when the candidate decided to enrol for PhD study, and he embarked on this transformative journey in academia.

With his thesis, titled: EXPLORING TEACHERS' IMPLEMENTATION OF KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS BEYOND A SCHOOL-UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIP, the candidate contributes to the area of teachers' continuing professional development, with a focus on Mathematics and Sciences school-university partnership projects. Using a qualitative case study approach and drawing on Kram's framework of mentoring and complex systems theory, the candidate focused on the experiences of 16 teachers in implementing knowledge and skills learnt during such a project, beyond its separation phase. The findings suggest that the teachers developed content and pedagogical knowledge, and curriculum management and assessment skills, and are using a variety of approaches to implement these beyond the partnership period. Individual and institutional factors that threaten, and teacher traits and school conditions that are conditional for, this implementation, were identified. Based on the findings, the study makes several recommendations for future school-university projects.

With his thesis, titled: A COMMUNICATION STRATEGY TO FOSTER SOCIAL COHESION IN A HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION, the candidate contributes to scholarship on social cohesion in an ever increasingly diverse higher education environment. The candidate employed the Verbal and Nonverbal tenets of communication as well as the social cohesion constructs of Social Capital, Social Inclusion and Social Mobility to interrogate threats and indicators of success in a higher education as they relate to social cohesion. Habermas' Communicative (Participatory) Action was adopted as a theoretical lens and focus group interviews with participant observation used to collect data. Analysed through the techniques of SWOT Analysis, Critical Discourse Analysis and Nonverbal Communication Analysis, the findings from the data were used to present a communication model for social cohesion that is based on the principles of Ubuntu, with Participatory Development Communication as its bloodline

Maqenehelo Manka was born on 7 March 1975 at Ha-Mohalenyane Maseru Lesotho. She obtained Primary School Leaving Certificate (PSLE) in 1987. She matriculated at St. Catherine's High School in 1992 and later attained a Secondary Teacher's Certificate (STC) at National Teachers Training College (NTTC) in 1998. She graduated with a B.Ed degree from the National University of Lesotho in 2004, a B.Ed Honours Hon degree at the University of Free State (UFS) in 2006, a Post-Graduate Diploma in Education 2007 and a Master of Education in 2008, respectively. Her career as a teacher began in 1998, and she rose to become a school principal and part-time lecturer at the National University of Lesotho (NUL).

With her thesis, titled **EXPLORING THE POTENTIAL OF LESOTHO EDUCATION POLICIES TO PROMOTE A SENSE OF COMMUNITATRIAN BELONGING**, the candidate contributes to the scholarship of Philosophy and Policy Studies in Education. With this contribution, she examines African communitarianism to conceptualise education in the Lesotho policy context as founded on a sense of communitarian belonging. African communitarianism belonging exhibits morals informed by *ubuntu* and *ukama. The study* explored the extent to which the Lesotho education policies are attuned to the immediate place students find themselves incorporating humans and non-humans. A qualitative approach and research methods were employed, namely a literature review, document analysis and policy analysis. The document analysis revealed that moral development and teaching of environmental education are imperative to promote cultural heritage and aspire to the norms and standards of the Basotho nation. The policy analysis found that some education policies are silent on education framed from community places. However, the CAP 2009 adopted curriculum aspects such that students' lived experiences and the awareness of the self and others be acknowledged, and that personal, social and spiritual learning inculcate moral values pertinent to students' personal and social growth. Furthermore, CAP 2009 envision providing students with skills that place primacy in the students' survival.

He received his secondary education at Sacred Heart Kiteredde Senior Secondary School (O'Level) and later attended Nkono Memorial School, Kaliro, Jinja, where he completed his A'Level in 1994. He obtained a Diploma in Education from St. Mary's University of Minnesota, Winona, USA (Nairobi Campus) in 2004. After that, he obtained Honours Degree in Theology in 2008, another Honours Degree in curriculum studies in 2014, and a Master of Education at the Free State University in 2019. He started his career as a teacher in 2004 and rose through the ranks to become a high school principal at Sacred Heart High School in Leribe, Lesotho.

With his thesis, titled: **CONCEPTUALISING EDUCATION FOR ECOLOGICAL DEMOCRACY IN LESOTHO: AN AFRICAN PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION PERSPECTIVE**, his qualitative study explored the potential contribution of the African Philosophy of Education, grounded in communitarianism and expressed through the concepts of *ubuntu* and *ukama*, to conceptualising education for Ecological Democracy in the Lesotho education policy context. A qualitative approach supported by a literature review, document and policy analysis unpacked the African Philosophy of education and its communitarianism concepts of *ubuntu* and *ukama*. I analysed the content of selected documents that address climate change in Lesotho and the Lesotho educational policy landscape to conceptualise the potential of Lesotho education for ecological Democracy. Analyses of the documents revealed that climate change mitigation in Lesotho is possible when citizens are motivated to work through communities to maintain and preserve the Basotho cultural identity grounded within the African Philosophy of Education and its incorporation of the African ideas of *ubuntu* and *ukama*. By communitarianism living and observing democratic governance, people in communities learn to cooperate and collaborate, and care for the environment, and this will benefit not only humans but also non-humans through the creation of structures allowing harmonious living between humans and non-humans and contribute to the knowledge of ecological Democracy.

Anna Ntlhare was born on 01'April 1970 in Bothaville, South Africa. She matriculated at Kgauho High School in 1991and later attain Diploma in JPTD in Education at Kagisanong College of Education, she graduated with a BED Hons degree at University of the Free State (Ufs) in 2005 and Masters of Education at Central University of Technology in 2015. Her career as a teacher began in 1997 and she rose through the rank to become a support teacher and become a supervisor in Adult Education and Training at Botshabelo primary school.

With her thesis, titled: PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT NEEDS OF FOUNDATION PHASE TEACHERS IN THE IDENTIFICATION OF LEARNERS WITH LEARNING BARRIERS the candidate contributes to primary schools and the Department of Education, focusing on how to improve teachers' training to meet the needs of the teachers in identifying LWLB at primary level. Using qualitative approach, Anna sampled 20 Foundation Phase teachers, four support teachers and four subject advisors in Free State to understand and explain their challenges and experiences in identifying LWLB in the inclusive classrooms. While most of the subject Advisors have limited knowledge and skills to train teachers in identifying LWLB and how to support them how teach learners, they were more knowledgeable about their roles as facilitators. This positively correlated with how they enacted the inclusive policy in schools. The study presents the argument that knowledge, skills and perceptions and cooperation among teachers improve teaching strategies and practices of Foundation Phase teachers in the schools in Motheo District.

She graduated with a Diploma in Primary Education and Advanced Diploma in Special Education at the Lesotho College of Education in 2002 and 2009 respectively. She obtained her B.Ed Honours degree in Inclusive Education at the University of 2. South Africa in 2015, and a M. Ed. degree in Psychology of Education at the University of the Free State in 2021. Her career as a teacher began in 2006 and she is currently a special education teacher at Mots'eare Primary School.

With her thesis, titled: ENHANCING AN ENABLING LEARNING ENVIRONMENT FOR LEARNERS WITH VISUALLY IMPAIRMENT IN A RURAL LESOTHO SCHOOL, the candidate contributes to scholarship on Inclusive Education and Enabling Learning Environments (ELEs), focusing on how teachers navigate and enhance the ELE for the learners with visual impairments (LVIs) in an under-resourced rural Lesotho school. Using a participatory qualitative approach, Ramatea sampled ten participants to understand and explain facilitative and obstructive factors towards the enhancement of ELE among LVIs in a selected rural primary school in Lesotho. While most obstructive factors appeared to be typified by macrosystematic challenges, collaboration, interpersonal relationships, active participation of LVIs, relevant teaching and learning materials, and a non-discriminatory environment enhanced ELE for LVIs. The study presents the argument for a more nuanced understanding of ELE within the rural context and proposes a move from viewing schools and communities in the rural areas from a paradigm of deficiency but rather generative.

The Main Procession Graduation Gowns - embroidered with rich diversity

South Africa, and the Free State in particular, has a long-standing friendship with our neighbouring country, Lesotho.

Through a shared history, we have become co-creators of our futures. For this reason, the UFS decided to incorporate our tradition with that of the Basotho in the design of our Main Procession graduation gowns.

The gowns are inspired by the Seanamarena – the traditional Basotho blanket. The different patterns on the Seanamarena indicate the status one holds in the Basotho nation or reflect the occasion being celebrated. Keeping the Seanamarena pattern in mind, we combined our traditional academic designs with that of the Basotho nation.

YOKE PATTERNS



Yoke pattern for the Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor

This Seanamarena pattern is an interpretation of a design used exclusively for the king and chiefs -which means 'to swear by the king'. This blanket has the highest status of all Basotho blankets.



Yoke pattern for the Chairperson of the Council

This Seanamarena Victorian crest motif appeared after the visit of the Prince of Wales to Lesotho in 1925, which made a profound impression on the local people. Customers refer to this blanket as 'lesiba' meaning feathers - when buying it.



Yoke pattern for the Vice-Rector

This Seanamarena Poone design symbolises good crops, wealth, and fertility. The Poone is given as a present to honour an important visitor.



Yoke pattern for Registrar

The same Seanamarena Poone design used for the Vice-Rector applies to the Registrar, with some slight design and colour alterations.

The Deans wear gowns made in the colours of the faculties, or others which indicate the office they hold.
