In order to maintain the dignity of the ceremony, you are requested to take note of the following:





The University of the Free State (UFS) has a proud history as one of the oldest institutions of higher education in South Africa. It opened its doors in Bloemfontein in 1904 as the Grey University College, with six students in the Humanities. Today it is a multi-campus institution, with two diverse campuses in Bloemfontein and one in Qwaqwa in the scenic Eastern Free State, accommodating more than 40 000 students in its seven faculties (Economic and Management Sciences, Education, Health Sciences, the Humanities, Law, Natural and Agricultural Sciences, Theology and Religion), with an increasing number of international students and associates, and an ever-widening scope of active involvement in and contribution to its surrounding communities.

For the past 119 years, the UFS has been delivering quality graduates who have made their mark in various sectors. # DEVELOPMENT OF THE UFS CREST OVER MORE THAN A CENTURY



## 1904

Up to 1935, the same coat of arms was used as the Grey College School.



## 1935

By 1935, with the name change to University College of the Orange Free State, the coat of arms fell into disuse, especially among students.



### 1947

In 1947, an agreement between management and students led to the new motto *Per Fidem ad Sapientiam* (Through faith to wisdom).



### 1950

In 1952, it was changed to *In Deo Sapientiae Lux* (In God is the light of wisdom). The traditional orange, white and blue, linking the UFS to the South African national colours, changed in the late 1990s.

The orange was replaced by cherry red.



## 2011

The academic brand - the historic University of the Free State crest that has been the symbol of the university since 1952, has evolved to embrace the aesthetic expectations of the stakeholders.

The shape of the traditional academic shield has been simplified and contemporised. Much of the symbolism of the crest remains intact, acknowledging the location of the UFS brand as one of the country's premier institutions of higher education, with a proud history of academic excellence and an ever-evolving, vibrant culture.





Nadia Alexander was born in Kimberley on 11 August 1980. She received her secondary education in Kimberley, where she matriculated at the Kimberley Girls High school in 1998. She obtained the degree Baccalaurus Legum (LLB) in the year 2002, the degree Master of Laws (LLM) with distinction in 2018 and her Doctor of Laws in 2023 at the University of the Free State. She started her career as a practicing attorney in Kimberley in 2002. In 2006 she was appointed in the Department of Education in the Northern Cape Province and at present she is an admitted Advocate and a senior legal advisor at the Northern Cape Department of Education.

There are numerous examples of strained relationships and litigation between the departments of education and school governing bodies, despite the constitutional imperative that organs of state should cooperate.

In her thesis, titled: **THE CREATION OF AN OMBUD OFFICE TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO JUSTICE AND COOPERATION AMONG EDUCATION STAKEHOLDERS**, the candidate explores the suitability of an Ombud office to enhance access to justice for especially quintile 1–3 schools against administrative injustices and to improve cooperation among all stakeholders in order to maintain proper working relations between them, despite conflict. The candidate investigates the importance of access to justice for all stakeholders to ensure that they can contribute on an equal footing to the important project of quality education for all. She examines different types of Ombudman offices and the range of powers and functions that can be awarded to such an office to facilitate access to justice and cooperation among them.

She graduated with a Masters in Law degree at Stellenbosch University, South Africa in 2009. Her career in law began in 2002 and later in 2007 she embarked in research development and human rights work.

In her thesis, titled: THE VALUE OF PRE-COLONIAL CONFLICT RESOLUTION METHODS IN ADDRESSING SEXUAL VIOLATIONS COMMITTED IN INTERNAL CONFLICT SITUATIONS IN ZIMBABWE, the candidate considers conflict resolution in addressing sexual violence against women with reference to precolonial African law. The study underscores the inadequacies of the present legal system and garners insights from African traditional justice mechanisms as employed during pre-colonial times. The African philosophy of Ubuntu is drawn on, to re-imagine an alternative jurisprudence that counters Western domination and marginalisation of African indigenous knowledge in post-conflict justice initiatives in Zimbabwe. The study explores the possibilities of integrating Western and pre-colonial African philosophy and systems in conflict resolution on sexual violence. The main contribution of the thesis is in the consideration of an integrated approach in resolving conflict-related sexual violations that places Ubuntu epistemology at the heart of current jurisprudential challenges to respond to gaps in present approaches aimed at protecting women in Zimbabwe.

#### MHLANGA, Lindani

Lindani Mhlanga was born on 28 September 1993, in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe. He matriculated from St. Patrick's Christian Brothers College in Bulawayo in 2011. Between 2012 and 2018, he received Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Laws, and Master of Laws degrees from the University of Pretoria. He currently works in the fellowship programme of the International Association of Law Schools.

In his thesis, titled: TO REMAIN, the candidate contributes to property law discourse by asking what legal form can be given to the situation that pertains when a court dismisses an eviction application because eviction would be unjust and inequitable, allowing occupiers without any right, to remain on land. He shows that our law has failed clearly to describe both the position of those remaining without right on another's land and the impact that their remaining has on the property right of the affected landowner. This failure he ascribes to the structure of and the approach of our courts to the law, which supports indifference and detachment. He concludes that this structure and approach hinder the transformation of our property law away from an unjust past toward a humane future and that our incapacity to account for the fact of remaining constitutes the missing of an important transformative moment.

#### NAIDOO. Amanda

Amanda Naidoo was born in 1973 in Durban, KwaZulu-Natal. She matriculated in 1990 from Chatsworth Secondary School. She obtained the B Proc degree in 1995 from the University of Durban-Westville and a Master of Laws (Medical law) from the University of KwaZulu-Natal, in 2015. She is currently employed as a lecturer at the Central University of Technology, Free State.

In her thesis, titled: XENOPHOBIA AGAINST NON-NATIONAL ACADEMICS EMPLOYED AT HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS IN SOUTH AFRICA: A LEGAL PERSPECTIVE, the candidate contributes to human rights, equality, and antidiscrimination law and theory by asking whether South Africa's legal response to xenophobia is sufficient to address xenophobia against non-national academics at higher education institutions. Working from the notion of transformative substantive equality, she shows that, although it manifests mostly in covert and symbolic ways, xenophobia is indeed a problem at higher education institutions in South Africa. Based on a survey of the antidiscrimination and employment policy of several higher education institutions, national policy, applicable legislation, and case law, she concludes that the current protective legal framework is indeed inadequate, and that xenophobia-specific legislation, based on a transformative substantive understanding of equality should instead be enacted to protect non-national academics.

#### TAMBWE, Giteya

Giteya Tambwe was born in Yassa Lokwa in the Democratic Republic of Congo on the 19th of December 1961. She matriculated from the Lycee Ngang-Ambel in 1980. In 2015, she obtained her LLB from the University of South Africa. A Master of Laws was awarded her by the University of Pretoria in 2018.

In her thesis, titled: THE IMPACT OF A ONE-PARTY-DOMINANT SYSTEM ON THE RIGHT TO VOTE: THE CASE OF THE **DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO**, the candidate contributes to democracy discourse by asking what impact de facto one-party rule of the Party of the People for Reconstruction and Democracy (PPRD) from 2006 to 2018 in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) had on the right vote. Through a detailed historical analysis based on a conceptual engagement with the notion of a one-party state, she establishes that despite regular multi-party elections, the DRC during this time de facto constituted a one-party state. She shows that despite its de jure entrenchment the right to vote was gradually emptied of



meaning, so that the DRC became a democracy in form only. She reaches several important conclusions about the nature of post-colonial democracies in Africa and the threat posed to democracy by de facto one-party rule.

#### DOCTOR OF LAWS WITH SPECIALISATION IN MERCANTILE LAW

#### MPOFU, Kudzai

Kudzai Mpofu was born on 26 November 1988 in Gweru, which is in the Midlands region of Zimbabwe. He matriculated at Mkoba 3 High School in 2007 and obtained a Bachelor of Laws in 2015. He received a Vice Chancellor's Merit Award as one of the best students at the University of Venda in 2015. He further graduated with a Master of Laws, specialising in business rescue, in 2017. His career as a researcher began in 2018. He is currently a research assistant and part-time lecturer at the University of the Free State.

With his thesis, titled: A BUSINESS RESCUE MODEL FOR UNINCORPORATED BUSINESS ENTITIES IN SOUTH AFRICA, the candidate makes a valuable contribution to the legal theory of business rescue, specifically pertaining to financially distressed sole proprietorships and partnerships. Mpofu used a comparative research methodology to evaluate the business rescue models of small enterprises in Kenya, the United Kingdom, the United States and South Africa. Based on the good practices in these jurisdictions, the candidate proposed a business rescue model that provides for eligibility criteria, a procedural framework providing a step-by-step rescue process and an institutional framework addressing the roles/duties of the debtor, business rescue practitioner, and the judiciary in ensuring that unincorporated business entities are rehabilitated. Two accredited articles from the thesis have been accepted for publication.

#### **REYNDERS**, Candice Leigh

Candice Reynders was born on 08 August 1991 in East London. She attended Eunice High School in Bloemfontein and matriculated in 2009. The candidate obtained her LLB summa cum laude in 2013 and LLM in 2016 at the University of the Free State. In 2016 she completed a Higher Diploma in Taxation at the University of South Africa. She is currently appointed as a director at Phatshoane Henney Attorneys in Bloemfontein in the commercial department where she specialises in corporate law and taxation.

With her thesis, titled: A COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF DIRECTORS' DUTIES TO CREDITORS PRIOR TO INSOLVENCY, the candidate explores whether South African company law appropriately addresses the duties owed by directors to creditors and the extent of consideration given to creditors' interests before a company becomes insolvent, including when the company is in the realm of insolvency. For this purpose, Reynders employed a comparative research methodology and investigated international instruments and the position of creditors in the United States of America and the United Kingdom. The research study culminates in proposed amendments to the Companies Act 71 of 2008 to provide clarity on directors' duties to creditors prior to insolvency. The study also recommends guidelines that suggest the presence of financial distress indicators. These guidelines can be used by directors to determine the extent to which directors should consider the interests of creditors when a company enters the realm of insolvency.

#### DOCTOR OF LAWS WITH SPECIALISATION IN PRIVATE LAW

#### **SEPTEMBER-VAN HUFFEL**, Anthea-Lee

Anthea-lee September-Van Huffel, born in Cape Town on 19 April 1985. Attended secondary school at Stellenberg High School in Cape Town. Obtained the degrees LLB and LLM awarded by the University of the Western Cape. She is an admitted Attorney of the High Court of South Africa. Practiced at ENS and Webber Wentzel law firms in Johannesburg. Anthea-lee commenced her academic scholarly career as a Lecturer at the University of the Free State in 2017, in the Law Faculty, Private Law department. She is married to Heinrich Van Huffel and the couple have a son, Zack Van Huffel.

In her thesis, titled: A CRITICAL INVESTIGATION OF STATE CUSTODIANSHIP AND ITS IMPLICATIONS FOR THE SOUTH AFRICAN PROPERTY REGIME. In the doctoral thesis she investigates state custodianship of rural agricultural land, particularly within the context of land reform initiatives and increased regulatory controls over natural resources like water and minerals for public interest; and the efficacy of the construct of state custodianship should it be applied to land as a natural resource. In so doing, she considers the socio-political basis for the legal construct of state custodianship and whether this novel construct has yet proven capable of delivering transformative outcomes. The original contributions highlighted by the examiners are: the comparison of public trusteeship with state custodianship and that of rural land tenure; The implications of a state custodianship model to rural communal land tenure; and the efficacy of a state custodianship approach as a tool for transformative constitutionalism.

#### DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY WITH SPECIALISATION IN CONSTITUTIONAL LAW AND PHILOSOPHY OF LAW

#### **BLOEM**, Martie

Martie Bloem was born in Pretoria on 9 January 1980. She attended primary school at Laerskool Laeveld in Mbombela and completed secondary school at Hoërskool Jim Fouché in Bloemfontein. She matriculated with 6 distinctions whereafter she enrolled for LLB at the UFS in 1999. In 2004, she was the best candidate attorney to receive an LLB degree and she was admitted as an attorney of the High Court. She practiced as an attorney until she was appointed as a lecturer in 2016. She obtained a LLM with specialisation in Private Law with a distinction in 2018 whereafter she enrolled for a PhD.

In her thesis, titled: THE REQUIREMENT OF 'FIT AND PROPER' FOR THE LEGAL PROFESSION: A SOUTH AFRICAN PERSPECTIVE, the candidate challenges the current understanding and application of the 'fit and proper' requirement for admission to legal practice, finding that it is superficial and one-dimensional. She argues for a re-imagining of the requirement to allow for diversity and for the critical thinking needed to enable transformation of the legal profession. The study relates the requirement to the role of the legal professional in society and draws a direct link between objectives such as public interest, access to justice and social justice. The candidate proposes that being 'fit and proper' should be a continuous responsibility of all legal professionals and informed by Constitutional values and not mere compliance with fixed rules of conduct. With this thesis the candidate contributes significantly to the transformation of the legal profession as well as legal education.

#### RAMAKHULA, Thabang

Thabang Ramakhula was born in Maseru, the capital city of Lesotho, on the 19th of April 1990. She matriculated from Lesotho High School in 2008. In 2014, she was awarded a Bachelor of Laws degree by the National University of Lesotho and in



2018 she graduated with a Master of Laws degree from the Centre for Human Rights, University of Pretoria. She is currently employed as an interim project assistant with the European Union Delegation to the Kingdom of Lesotho.

In her thesis, titled: THE IMPACT OF CUSTOMARY LAW AND ITS CONSTITUTIONAL PROTECTION ON THE SOCIAL STATUS AND POLITICAL PARTICIPATION OF WOMEN IN LESOTHO, the candidate asks why, despite various interventions to improve it, women's political participation in Lesotho has progressively declined. From a postcolonial and African feminist perspective, she examines the relationship of custom and constitutionally entrenched customary law with women's social status and political participation. She shows that custom has formed and sustained social and political stereotypes concerning women's social status. Customary law, bolstered by its constitutional status, further formed, sustained, and entrenched women's subordination, negatively impacting their social status and political participation. The combined effect of custom and entrenched customary law, she concludes, is that women's subordination is woven so tightly into the fabric of Lesotho society and polity that legislative and policy measures introduced to improve women's political participation are likely to have little effect.

## The Main Procession Graduation Gowns - embroidered with rich diversity

South Africa, and the Free State in particular, has a long-standing friendship with our neighbouring country, Lesotho.

Through a shared history, we have become co-creators of our futures. For this reason, the UFS decided to incorporate our tradition with that of the Basotho in the design of our Main Procession graduation gowns.

The gowns are inspired by the Seanamarena – the traditional Basotho blanket. The different patterns on the Seanamarena indicate the status one holds in the Basotho nation or reflect the occasion being celebrated. Keeping the Seanamarena pattern in mind, we combined our traditional academic designs with that of the Basotho nation.

## YOKE PATTERNS



## Yoke pattern for the Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor

This Seanamarena pattern is an interpretation of a design used exclusively for the king and chiefs -which means 'to swear by the king'. This blanket has the highest status of all Basotho blankets.



### Yoke pattern for the Chairperson of the Council

This Seanamarena Victorian crest motif appeared after the visit of the Prince of Wales to Lesotho in 1925. which made a profound impression on the local people. Customers refer to this blanket as 'lesiba' meaning feathers - when buying it.



### Yoke pattern for the Vice-Rector

This Seanamarena Poone design symbolises good crops, wealth, and fertility. The Poone is given as a present to honour an important visitor.



## Yoke pattern for Registrar

The same Seanamarena Poone design used for the Vice-Rector applies to the Registrar, with some slight design and colour alterations.

The Deans wear gowns made in the colours of the faculties, or others which indicate the office they hold.
