Ke le kopa ho dula le ikamahanya le mohlodi ona wa lona wa dikgau tsa thuto, le le boradikgau ba motlotlo.

Le hoja sepheo sa yunivesithi ya rona e nnile ya ba ho le hlomella ka tsebo le ka boitsebelo ba mesebetsi e hlokehang bakeng sa ho etsa diphetoho mafapheng a dithuto tsa lona, re ntse re tseba hore makgabane a molemo ho wena ho etsa diphetoho setjhhabeng sa heno. 



DILOTSOTLHE, Moatlhodi Justice

Moatlhodi Justice Dilotsotlhe was born in Mahikeng on 13 February 1974. He attended Kebalepile Secondary where he matriculated in 1990. He obtained a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1995, a Bachelor of Arts Hons in 1998 with a distinction in Text and Discourse, and his master's degree in Business Administration with distinctions in Statistics and Research Methodology, in 2015. He started his career as a researcher in 1995 and has occupied various positions. In 2023, the Provincial Treasury in Northwest Province appointed him as a provincial Executive Representative.

With his thesis titled: **A CHANGE MANAGEMENT COMMUNICATION FRAMEWORK FOR EFFECTIVE PUBLIC SERVICE DELIVERY IN SOUTH AFRICA**, the candidate contributes to scholarship on Change Management and Public Service Delivery, focusing on how a change management communication framework can enhance service delivery. Using a quantitative approach, Moatlhodi sampled 200 respondents comprising heads of departments (HoDs), project managers, and change management practitioners in the public service in South Africa to understand and explain how change management communication not only impacts change but also impacts public service delivery. The research makes a significant contribution by positioning its findings in the complexity of South Africa's public sector, characterised by distinct socio-economic challenges, government structures, and cultural subtleties that define and shape the execution of change. The change management communication framework developed through the study provides a structural foundation for the implementation of change in South Africa, confirming its relevance and applicability to local contexts.

SLABBERT, Andrika Jacoba Mara

Anke Slabbert (née Kilian) was born on February 19, 1975, in Bothaville, Free State. She matriculated from Hoopstad High School in 1992 and earned a BCom (Honours) from Vista University in 1997. She completed an MBA at the University of the Free State (UFS) in 2006. She lectured at TVET Goldfields College (1996–2006) before transitioning to the corporate sector. In 2009, she returned to academia at the Central University of Technology, specialising in Project Management and Entrepreneurship. She remains active in research, focusing on business strategy and entrepreneurship.

With her thesis titled: **AN ENTREPRENEURIAL SKILLS FRAMEWORK TO PROMOTE ECONOMIC SUSTAINABILITY OF UPCOMING COMMERCIAL FARMERS IN THE FREE STATE**, the candidate advances agricultural entrepreneurship research. Using a Delphi-DEMATEL mixed methods approach, 30 experts identified essential skills for long-term success. The DEMATEL technique mapped cause-effect relationships, ranking skills by importance. Critical thinking emerged as key for navigating modern farming complexities, while personal attributes proved vital in applying entrepreneurial competencies. Financial and risk management were recontextualised to address market volatility and environmental risks. The resulting framework provides data driven insights for policymakers, educators, and farmers, advocating for tailored skills development programs. By addressing Free

State farmers' challenges, this study fills a crucial gap in agricultural entrepreneurship literature and presents a strategic model for sustainable commercial farming in South Africa and beyond.

DU PLESSIS, Ambrosé Ray

Ambrosé Ray Du Plessis, born on 9 October 1987 in Welkom, Free State, matriculated at Welkom Gimnasium in 2006. He earned a BA in Governance and Political Transformation in 2010 and an Honours degree in International Relations in 2011 at the University of the Free State (UFS). In 2011, he was an exchange student in Political Science at Appalachian State University, U.S. He completed his Master's in Political Science at UFS in 2014. Ambrosé began his career as a junior lecturer in 2011 and became a lecturer in Public Administration and Management in 2016 at UFS.

With his thesis titled: **THE POLITICAL-ADMINISTRATIVE DICHOTOMY IN COALITION-LED METROPOLITAN MUNICIPALITIES: A SOUTH AFRICAN PERSPECTIVE**, the candidate makes a novel contribution, expanding the theory of the political-administrative dichotomy beyond the locus and focus of Public Administration (e.g., public organisational domain) by cross-fertilising the political administrative dichotomy theoretical discourse with theoretical contributions from Political Science (e.g., Coalition Theory). The candidate devised an alternative contextual coalition-led framework towards a functioning political-administrative dichotomy in the City of Johannesburg. This study adopted a qualitative research approach, and a case study design situated within the interpretive research paradigm. The participants' lived experiences revealed significant cross-cutting lessons for uncovering the nexus between the political administrative dichotomy and coalition-led governments in developed and developing countries. Most coalition-led governments have been short-lived in the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality. The empirical data revealed the significance of pre- and postcoalition discussions and the need to design comprehensive and in-depth coalition agreements.

She matriculated in 2003 at Paul VI High School and in 2008 obtained a Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration and Political Science from the National University of Lesotho. In 2013 she graduated with a Bachelor of Administration Honours degree from the University of the Free State and in 2016 with a Master's degree in Management from the University of the Witwatersrand. Her career as a Human Resources Officer began in 2009 and presently, she is a Human Resources Professional and Researcher at the Ministry of Agriculture, Food Security and Nutrition in Lesotho.

With her thesis titled: **TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY OFFICIALS IN LESOTHO**, the candidate makes a significant contribution to the field of parliamentary studies and governance in Africa, with clear implications for improving democratic institutions in the region. Using a qualitative case study design, Papali sampled officials working at the Senate and the National Assembly of Lesotho to understand and explain why the training and development of officials in the Parliament of Lesotho does not produce the anticipated results as shown by the theories, literature and policies on training and development. The study presents the argument that

training and development interventions are haphazard, top-down, unsystematic, un-contextualized and inadequate, and that these characteristics conflict with the theoretical framework of the study. The training and development framework presented by the study can, if implemented, contribute to improved performance, morale and motivated officials.
