





It opened its doors in Bloemfontein in 1904 as the Grey University College, with six students in the Humanities. Today it is a multi-campus institution, with two diverse campuses in Bloemfontein and one in Qwaqwa in the scenic Eastern Free State, accommodating more than 40 000 students in its seven faculties (Economic and Management Sciences, Education, Health Sciences, the Humanities, Law, Natural and Agricultural Sciences, Theology and Religion), with an increasing number of international students and associates, and an ever-widening scope of active involvement in and contribution to its surrounding communities.

1904

Up to 1935, the same coat of arms was used as the Grey College School.





1935

By 1935, with the name change to University College of the Orange Free State, the coat of arms fell into disuse, especially among students.

1947

In 1947, an agreement between management and students led to the new motto *Per Fidem ad Sapientiam* (Through faith to wisdom).

1950

In 1952, it was changed to *In Deo Sapientiae Lux* (In God is the light of wisdom). The traditional orange, white and blue, linking the UFS to the South African national colours, changed in the late 1990s.

The orange was replaced by cherry red.

The academic brand - the historic University of the Free State crest that has been the symbol of the university since 1952, has evolved to embrace the aesthetic expectations of the stakeholders. The shape of the traditional academic shield has been simplified and contemporised. Much of the symbolism of the crest remains intact, acknowledging the location of the UFS brand as one of the country's premier institutions of higher education, with a proud history of academic excellence and an ever-evolving, vibrant culture.





Dr Keamogetse Gladness Morwe is an Erasmus Mundus scholar who completed her joint Ph.D. in Legal and Social Sciences at the University of Málaga, Spain, and in Higher Education Studies at the University of the Free State under the supervision of professors Elisa-Maria García-España and Thierry Luescher. She previously obtained a B.Soc.Sci. and M.Soc.Sci. (Social Work) from North-West University (Mahikeng). Morwe's interests are in youth development, student movements, protesting, and wellbeing. She is co-principal investigator on a NRF-funded research on student movement-related violence and wellbeing. Morwe currently works as lecturer at the University of Venda.

With her thesis titled: **CULTURE OF VIOLENCE AS A MECHANISM FOR SOLVING PROBLEMS WITH AUTHORITY AMONG STUDENTS AT SOUTH AFRICAN UNIVERSITIES**, the candidate investigated why South African university students resort to violence when they have problems with university authorities. The study used a mixed method convergence design to address the research problem, using a multi-variation sampling procedure. The findings reveal the complex interface of historical, political, socio-economic, and personal factors that contribute to violent protests at universities. Interesting findings of this study were that some students considered violence as fun, inconsequential, and a normal part of the protests. Although students were emotionally affected by the protests, female students bore the brunt of such as their experiences were compounded with sexual harassment and threats of sexual violence. The outcomes of the study indicate that some students may have been de-sensitised to violence and such de-sensitisation is critical in understanding why student protests turn violent.

Her career as a teacher began in 1988 and saw her teaching at primary school and later at secondary school levels. Currently, she is lecturing at the Adventist University of Central Africa in Rwanda.

With her thesis titled, **TRANSLANGUAGING FOR SUSTAINABLE LEARNING IN ZIMBABWEAN RURAL ECOLOGIES**, the candidate contributes to pedagogy by presenting a strategy of using multiple languages in classrooms in an organised manner for the development and maintenance of both Home Languages and the official Language of Instruction to benefit all learners. Premised within the theoretical framework of Ubuntu philosophy, the research process emphasised equal participation. Data generation adopted the participatory action research (PAR) framework through the focus group discussion method from a sample of teachers, parents, school administrators, and learners from one secondary school in a rural area in the Midlands Province of Zimbabwe. Data findings revealed that creating and maintaining multilingual spaces supportive of translanguaging provide learners with opportunities to actively participate in their learning, giving their voice space to negotiate meanings. Hence, learners are privileged to challenge the status quo of the Language in Education Policy and linguistic practices that promote separation and compartmentalisation of languages by emphasising English dominance while marginalising their HLs and life experiences.

With his thesis titled: **ENHANCED REASONING AND GEOMETRIC PROOF SKILLS IN MATHEMATICS EDUCATION**, the candidate contributed to the discourse. Thesis that informs this study was identification of mathematics learners with challenges in interpreting structure of the theorem statement and applying geometric meanings. This intellectual piece adopted a Critical Emancipatory Research as a theoretical lens that promotes transformation. Study was located within a Participatory Action Research as a methodological approach. Data generated through Focus Group Discussions as a technique to collate discourses generated by participants. Data generated were analyzed using Critical Discourse Analysis as an analytic procedure, the choice for CDA was appropriate to investigate textual orientated discourses to reveal discursive praxis, control and disparity. Findings were to cultivate critical thinking skills in geometry, improve strategic use of technology in the teaching and learning of geometry, enhance effective pedagogic praxes in geometry, and develop learners' use of Mathematical language.

He further studied for an Advanced Certificate in Education and an Honour's degree in Science Education. He completed a master's degree in Science Education with the University of Witwatersrand in 2011. His career as a teacher began in 2001 and rose through the ranks to become a school principal and is currently heading the Research Coordination directorate in Gauteng Department of Education at the Head Office.

With his thesis titled: **CONTROVERSIAL TOPICS IN THE SCHOOL CURRICULUM: A CASE STUDY ON THE TEACHING OF EVOLUTION IN SOUTH AFRICA**, the candidate contributes to the current body of scholarship that explores 'difficult conversations' in the classroom, by focusing on how Life Science teachers approach the teaching of Evolution as a topic of study in the South African school curriculum, with diverse groups of learners. Using qualitative approaches, Grade-12 Life Science teachers from three different secondary schools in the Gauteng province were sampled. The study concludes that the teaching of controversial topics, such as evolution, continues to be a big challenge for most teachers in schools as it is influenced by several key factors, including the teachers 'knowledge of the topic, learners' perspectives, willingness to engage in the difficult conversations, resources, and the language used, all of which had to be balanced against political, religious and cultural considerations.

With her thesis titled: PHENOMENOLOGICAL STUDY OF PRACTITIONERS' LIVED MATHEMATICAL PLAY PRACTICES IN AN EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND EDUCATION (ECCE) SETTING, the candidate used qualitative research approach and 10 practitioners in Mangaung, Motheo District in Free State Province were purposefully selected to provide in-depth information around mathematical play practices in the ECCE setting. The study noted that practitioners were not adequately qualified to provide ECCE in the centres. Additionally, insufficient understanding of content and pedagogy knowledge, which made them to struggled to employ integrated approach when implementing mathematical play-based activities in the ECCE centres which made them to treat each early learning and development areas (ELDAs) in isolation. Practitioners lacked training and support for children who faced barriers to learning and development and lacked resources. Therefore, the study calls for Department of Education to enhance practitioners' knowledge and skills to enable them to use integrated learning approach in the ECCE setting.

With her thesis titled: EXPLORING STRATEGIES TO STRENGTHEN INTEGRATED INTER-SECTORAL COLLABORATION AMONG EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND EDUCATION (ECCE) PROVIDERS, the candidate used qualitative research approach and 12 experienced ECCE providers from government and private sectors in Kimberley, Frances Baard District in Northern Cape. The ECCE providers were selected to give in-depth understanding of their views on integrated inter-sectoral collaboration of ECCE provision. The study noted that the ECCE providers had a common understanding of integrated inter-sectoral collaboration but are unable to integrate and collaborate the ECCE services because of insufficient funding, a lack of common unifying policies, shortages of human resources, infrastructure backlog, working in silos, uncoordinated ECCE sector and fragmented systems of governance in the ECCE sector. The study therefore recommends the development of an integrated inter-sectoral collaboration plan with its own budget, establishment off ECCE forums, empowerment workshops as strategies to strengthen integrated inter-sectoral collaboration among ECCE providers.

With her thesis titled, 'IMPLEMENTING THE MOTHER TONGUE POLICY IN TEACHING INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY TO INFANTS IN ZIMBABWE', the candidate not only contributes to scholarship on teaching ICT in L1, but also to the emerging discourse on how teachers make sense of instructional reforms, thereby providing an alternative tool for interrogating the pervasive and challenging theory-practice gap in policy implementation. A mini-ethnographic case study was adopted to examine teacher interpretation and enactment of the mother tongue policy in teaching ICT to infants. The study concludes that variations in teacher knowledge of ICT, pedagogy and medium of instruction, diverse beliefs and experiences, variable resource provision, physical and historical contexts, all impact the interpretation and

enactment of the L1 policy differently. The study therefore proposes a context-sensitive model for the enactment of the L1 policy for teaching ICT to infants, a model that provides for enhanced teacher sense-making during implementation.

As theoretical framework I used complexity theory and informed by a document analysis and a literature review, I conducted interviews with various stakeholders and interest groups. Findings revealed that various challenges hamper education policy implementation in Lesotho. The study developed a framework that calls for a validation and an appraisal of the important role stakeholders and interest groups can play in ensuring policy implementation, especially in an educational context characterised by poverty, lack of resources, etc. The framework outline ways for closer collaboration between MoET and education stakeholders by arguing for their inclusion in the entire policy process and in the policy implementation process. If implemented, this framework could enhance policy implementation in the Lesotho education sector.

The research findings confirmed and supported the central argument of the study, namely that sustained academic performance cannot be explained through simple linear relationships but is best understood through the analysis of schools as complex institutions using complexity theory.

The pre-test and post-test data collected in this study was subjected to descriptive and Inferential statistics such as Analysis of Covariance (ANCOVA), Estimated Marginal Means and Scheffe Posthoc. The results indicated that Scaffolding Learning Strategy (SLS) and Cooperative Learning Strategy have transformative effects on Social Studies Pre-service Teachers' attainment in cybercrime prevention but have no effect on their attitudes to cybercrime prevention. This study has contributed to knowledge by carving a philosophical niche that empowers Social Studies pre-service teachers to teach cybercrime prevention to learners in secondary and primary schools in Nigeria.

Dan Mosia was born in Bloemfontein on 13 March 1969. He received his secondary education in Tweespruit, where he matriculated in 1988 at Mariasdal High School. He later attained a Bachelor of Dental Therapy Degree from Medunsa in 1994. He obtained a Master of Business Administration at Bond University (Australia) in 2001 and a Post Graduate Diploma in Hospital Management at the University of the Free State in 2003. His professional career in dentistry started in 1995, and he rose through the ranks to become the Chief Commercial Officer at Wits Health Consortium and a livestock/crop farmer in Bloemfontein.

With his thesis titled: A COMPETITIVE STRATEGY FOR SMALLHOLDER WOMEN IN THE AGRO-FOOD INDUSTRY IN THE FREE STATE PROVINCE, the candidate contributes to scholarship on the development of a framework for a competitive strategy that would empower smallholder women to own and nurture agro-food enterprises in South Africa' Free State Province. Utilising the concurrent explanatory mixed method research design, followed by focus group sessions, Dan sampled 517 women, collecting the socioeconomic data using a close-ended questionnaire. The findings revealed that all the domains for empowerment positively influence the empowerment of these smallholder women agro-food enterprises. The results showed a positive relationship between production and empowerment success, a significant relationship between transformation and empowerment, capacity building and empowerment, entrepreneurship and empowerment and savings and competitiveness.

The study concluded that business ownership, representation of women, and management control are necessary to transform these women agro-food enterprises.

Diao Leeu Ramabitsa was born in Edenville, in the Free State, on 5 June 1976. He completed his matric in Ngwathe Secondary School in 1995. Thereafter he attained a National Diploma in Civil Engineering (Vaal Triangle Technikon in 2001), followed by the degrees Bachelor of Technology in Civil Engineering (Vaal University of Technology in 2004), Bachelor of Technology in Project Management (Central University of Technology in 2011) and Master of Business Administration (North West University in 2015). He has vast experience in local government and is currently appointed as Director for Technical and Infrastructure Services in Metsimaholo Local Municipality, Sasolburg.

With his thesis titled: **SUSTAINABILITY OF LOWER-GRADE CONSTRUCTION BASED SMMEs IN THE FREE STATE PROVINCE**, the candidate makes a valuable contribution to local business administration. The study investigates the high failure rate among SMME construction businesses in the early stages of operation due to contributing factors such as low barriers to entry as well as a deficiency of skills, formal qualifications, relevant industry experience, and management and leadership skills. The findings indicate that major challenges include corrupt activities within the construction industry and the use of political connections to gain advantage in government contractor programmes, with few benefiting from the latter. The main recommendations are to establish a panel of experienced, qualified, professional, registered experts in all the construction fields to monitor progress and quality and that only local SMMEs are allowed to bid in order to alleviate congestion, improve business and ensure lowergrade construction sustainability in the Free State Province.

Patient Rambe holds a Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Administration and Masters' in Public Administration from the University of Zimbabwe. He holds a PhD in Education (specialising in Educational technology) from the University of Cape Town. He was a postdoctoral fellow and an assistant director at the University of the Free State between 2011-2013. He was a senior lecturer at the Central University of Technology in 2014 and became a full research professor in Entrepreneurship at the institution in 2019. He is an established researcher (C2) of the National Research Foundation.

With his thesis titled: **"UNDERSTANDING THE FACTORS AFFECTING TECHNOLOGY ENTREPRENEURSHIP OF UNIVERSITY-INCUBATED FIRMS"**, the candidate contributed to scholarship on technology entrepreneurship by adopting a multi-level, muti-theoretical approach to investigating the individual, institutional and systemic factors that merge with university-based technology business incubation in shaping technology entrepreneurship. Drawing on interpretive phenomenology, Rambe investigated two incubation ecosystems to unravel factor combinations that synergize with business incubation in leveraging technology entrepreneurship. The results demonstrated that intuitive thinking, scripts, physical, social and intellectual capital, national entrepreneurship policy and regional funding systems merged with technology business incubation in facilitating technology entrepreneurship. The study also developed a framework that validated specific conditions



under which synergies among these factors could be leveraged. He demonstrates the significance of developing different resource mobilisation strategies for incubatees at various stages of their entrepreneurial journeys and the value of multilevel approaches to unravelling business incubation in building resilient entrepreneurial ecosystems.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY WITH SPECIALISATION IN DEVELOPMENT STUDIES

MOKOENA, Malefetsane Daniel

Malefetsane Daniel Mokoena was born on 27 July 1963 in Bethlehem (Eastern Free State). He matriculated at Selelekela High School in 1984, attained a Bachelor's degree at UNISA (1991), National Higher Diploma in Public Management and Administration at Technikon SA (1995), a post-graduate Diploma in Planning and Management of Urban Development at IHS, The Netherlands (1997) and a Masters degree in Development Studies at UFS (2005). His career as development practitioner began in 1995 and he rose through the ranks to become the General Manager in the Human Settlements Sector and part-time lecturer at UFS.

With his thesis titled: 'DEPENDENCIES AND DECENTRALISED GOVERNMENT FOR THE GOVERNANCE OF HOUSING DELIVERY IN MANGAUNG' the candidate investigates the role of dependencies and decentralised government in housing delivery in Mangaung over three decades. The study uses the evolutionary governance theory to conceptualise housing governance and its evolution. This study relies on data collected from semi-structured interviews, secondary sources and policy documents. The candidate challenges the current literature, which related the poor locational outcomes of housing only to neoliberal tendencies, by arguing that a set of dependencies created after apartheid and the dysfunctional quality of intergovernmental relations have also played a role. The dominant role of the provincial government, which did not consider the nature of a city government, has been a prominent reason for poor housing outcomes in Mangaung. The study concludes that the independence of city governments needs to be honoured in future.

PALMER, Eurica Leatitia

Eurica Palmer was born on 12 February 1972 in Port Elizabeth. She matriculated at the Westville Secondary School in 1989 and attained a BA Human Ecology degree in 1994. She graduated with a Post-Graduate Diploma in HIV/AIDS Management in 2002, followed by a Master of Philosophy in HIV/AIDS Management degree at the University of Stellenbosch in 2008. She was awarded a fellowship in the Albertina Sisulu Executive Leadership Programme in Health. She is a public-health specialist based in the United States of America.

With her thesis titled: 'EARLY CHILDHOOD MALE MEDICAL CIRCUMCISION', the candidate contributes to the literature on masculinity and circumcision. Medical male circumcision studies seldom consider theoretical frameworks and Black women's involvement in medical male circumcision policies is limited. The study uses constructs from Social Constructivism Theory, Ecological Systems Theory, and Social Norms Theory and in-depth interviews with Black women and a young male participant, who has undergone traditional male circumcision, to analyse their experiences of ICMC decision-making in Gauteng, South Africa. The findings show that policy positions do not reflect the social contexts, including social sanctions, the social network,

and the social construction of masculinity prevalent in ICMC decision-making. The involvement of Black women in medical male circumcision policies and programmes should be central, as men dominate ICMC decisions and women are on the periphery of the decision-making process. Two papers have appeared in international journals.

Constance Brenda Motsitsi was born on the 13th of July 1992 in Sebokeng. She received her secondary education at Suiderlig Hoërskool where she matriculated in 2010. Constance obtained her BA degree in 2014 and BA Honours Degree in 2015 at the North-West University. She started her lecturing career in 2016 as a junior lecturer at North-West University, where she in 2018 obtained her Master's degree, specialising in Public Administration and Management. In 2019 she was appointed as a lecturer in the Public Administration Department at the University of the Free State (Bloemfontein campus) where she is presently a lecturer.

With her thesis titled: **PUBLIC FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT REFORMS AND SERVICE DELIVERY IN THE NORTHERN CAPE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH**, the candidate makes an empirical contribution to public financial management reforms and service delivery in South Africa. The study aimed to determine why there is a disconnect between having public financial management reforms in place and real functional improvements in service delivery. Through a qualitative case study approach, she found that this disconnect is caused by political interference, human weaknesses, inefficiencies, incapabilities resulting from poor leadership, and a lack of political commitment in the implementation of public financial management reforms. The results of the study highlight that political will, institutional capacity, policy spacing, and adaptation of iterative and inductive processes are critical aspects in the implementation of public financial management reforms. If integrated and implemented effectively, these aspects will enhance service delivery within public institutions.

The Main Procession Graduation Gowns embroidered with rich diversity


outh Africa, and the Free State in particular, has a long-standing friendship with our neighbouring country, Lesotho.

Through a shared history, we have become co-creators of our futures. For this reason, the UFS decided to incorporate our tradition with that of the Basotho in the design of our Main Procession graduation gowns.

The gowns are inspired by the Seanamarena – the traditional Basotho blanket. The different patterns on the Seanamarena indicate the status one holds in the Basotho nation or reflect the occasion being celebrated. Keeping the Seanamarena pattern in mind, we combined our traditional academic designs with that of the Basotho nation.

YOKE PATTERNS






This Seanamarena pattern is an interpretation of a design used exclusively for the king and chiefs – which means 'to swear by the king'. This blanket has the highest status of all Basotho blankets.

Yoke pattern for the Chairperson of the Council

This Seanamarena Victorian crest motif appeared after the visit of the Prince of Wales to Lesotho in 1925, which made a profound impression on the local people. Customers refer to this blanket as 'lesiba' – meaning feathers – when buying it.



Yoke pattern for the Vice-Rector

This Seanamarena Poone design symbolises good crops, wealth, and fertility. The Poone is given as a present to honour an important visitor.



Yoke pattern for Registrar

The same Seanamarena Poone design used for the Vice-Rector applies to the Registrar, with some slight design and colour alterations.

The Deans wear gowns made in the colours of the faculties, or others which indicate the office they hold.
