BRIEF HISTORY

The UFS was established in 1904 as Grey University College, with six students. Today we pride ourselves on having close to 40 000 students across three diverse campuses, namely Bloemfontein Campus, in the heart of the city, South Campus, nestled in the hills overlooking the city, and Qwaqwa Campus, which is situated in the picturesque Eastern Free State.

The university is the hub of higher education in the Free State Province and has positioned itself on the global stage, promoting research excellence, exceptionally talented students and alumni who are recognised the world over as leaders and influencers.

he Bloemfontein Campus Visitors Centre is a great place to start. Located on DF Malherbe Drive, visitors require a daily access card and parking disc which can be obtained at the centre reception desk. Campus maps are available for easy access to any destination.

The South Campus is located on Church Street in Bloemfontein and can be accessed from the N1 highway and from all major roads of the city. Our friendly staff members at points of entry are available to assist visitors on arrival.

The Qwaqwa Campus is located in Phuthaditjhaba in the Eastern Free State. Staff members at the main entrance to the campus are available to assist visitors with information and access.

Our campuses are also equipped with disabled-friendly walkways, and buildings and facilities that will make your stay safe and comfortable.

ACADEMIC

o reach the heights of academic excellence, the research, teaching and learning programmes in our seven academic faculties are constantly breaking new ground. One of the programmes preparing young academics for the professoriate is the Vice-Chancellor's Prestige Scholars' Programme, in place since 2013, which aims to accelerate

the academic trajectory for scholars who have recently attained PhDs in their respective fields.

The UFS attracts and retains excellence in research and innovation through five South African Research Chairs Initiative (SARChI) research chairs. The five research chairs are: the Vector-Borne and Zoonotic Virus research group in the Department of Medical Microbiology and Virology; Pathogenic Yeasts in the Department of Microbial, Biochemical and Food Biotechnology; Higher Education and Human Development; Solid State Luminescent and Advanced Materials in the Department of Physics and Disease Resistance; and Quality in Field Crops in the Department of Plant Sciences. The UFS has 165 National Research Foundation-(NRF) rated researchers in various fields and this includes 1 P-rated researcher. It also holds the South African National Roads Agency (Sanral) Chair in Mathematics, with a focus on postgraduate students at master's and PhD level in mathematics, natural sciences and technology education,

our three diverse campuses

he university boasts excellent facilities that enable students to access information and enhance learning while using world-class technology, with the e-learning and open and distance-learning programmes ranked as some of the best in the country.

Our campuses are equipped for students with disabilities, with modified buildings, sign language interpreting services, learning material, sporting facilities and modified pathways for the blind. The Centre for Universal Access and Disability Support (CUADS) is dedicated to helping disabled students to enjoy their campus experience.

The Bloemfontein Campus is located in the studentcentered city of Bloemfontein, and is known for its historic buildings, tranquil gardens and water features. On the campus is the Sasol library which holds 655 000 and 866 books current journal titles. Ordering of books and access to learning material is fully automated and accessible online with open access digital material available on KovsieScholar, the online research repository. Attached to the library are computer laboratories and afterhours study rooms. Lecture rooms, labs, studios and auditoriums can be found throughout the campus.

QWAQWA CAMPUS

he Qwaqwa Campus is set among sandstone mountains in an ecologically significant Afromontane region of the Eastern Free State. The campus now has close to 8000 students, which is the highest number it has ever had. It offers academic programmes in four faculties, namely: Economic and Management Sciences, Education, Humanities and Natural and Agricultural Sciences and holds its own graduation ceremonies each year.

The Qwaqwa Campus has taken the lead with its Afromontane Research Unit which focuses on challenges unique to mountainous regions. Through this project the UFS is ideally placed to promote interdisciplinary research on sustainable development, mountain biodiversity and water supply. An international collaboration with the University of Japan was established in 2017, focusing on sustainability and youth migration.

SOUTH CAMPUS

his campus is the hub of distance learning. It provides distance education programmes to more than 3 000 students at locations in six provinces. It also offers the Advanced Certificate in Teaching (ACT), a complete online programme and the first of its kind in South Africa; the University Access Programme (UAP); and the ICT Innovation in School Education (ICTISE) – an award-winning programme that supports secondary school teachers across the Free State with teaching aids, using the Internet Broadcast Project. It also offers a Family Maths and Family Science programme, and the extended degree programme.

NAVAL HILL PLANETARIUM

The Naval Hill Planetarium is located at Naval Hill, Bloemfontein, at the Centre for Earth and Space. It is the first digital planetarium in sub-Saharan Africa. The public shows offer a digital experience from the smallest atomic particles to the largest cosmological scales and are suitable for young and old, school groups and families.
