TRANSITIONING students into university

Hello First-Years and Welcome to the University of the Free State!

Are you excited to start this amazing and new chapter in your academic journey? As you transition into university, it is normal to be feeling overwhelmed, nervous and anxious about this new change, and it could be a while before you feel at home at the university. At the University of the Free State, we make it a priority to assist you in your transition into university. At the Centre for Teaching and Learning, the Transition, Development and Success (TD) division assists students who transition from high school into the university and students transferring from other tertiary institutions, in a module called UFSS1504/UFSS1522. Students who are transitioning into the workplace are assisted in doing so through a module called EDED3712/ EDED3722.

What can you expect from UFSS1504/UFSS1522?

In the first semester, the aim of UFSS1504 is to support you in the transition from high school to university, by teaching you the academic skills you need to be successful in your studies. These academic skills are taught in the first semester, through a high-impact, condensed, 3-day summer school. You will be equipped with the academic success skills needed to thrive succeed during your first few months on campus. The academic success skills include topics like computer literacy, time management and goal setting, study skills, referencing and plagiarism, financial literacy and how to develop a growth mindset. Studying at university is very different from the way you approached your studies at school. At university, you are expected to become a life-long learner whilst engaging, and participating in guided, self-directed learning.

These resources and support tools exist to help you become successful in your studies.

What can you expect from EDED3712/EDED3722?

EDED3712/3722 is positioned as a capstone module for final -year and postgraduate students, and aligns with career development and employability initiatives at the UFS. The aim of this module is to enhance your employability by teaching you to take stock of the skills and attributes you have acquired during your studies, and articulate that in ePortfolios that will assist you in marketing your skills, networking, and applying for work. This module is offered during the first semester through a 2.5-day summer school, and repeated in the second semester through a 2.5-day winter school (so you do not need to register for both module codes). In 2023, this module is offered for free to students, and we have space for 2000 students to enrol as an additional module so do not pass up this opportunity!

WHAT IS ACADEMIC ADVISING?

Academic advising is an ongoing and intentional teaching and learning practice that empowers the student in their learning development process to explore and align their personal, academic and career goals. As a shared responsibility between the advisor and advisee, advising aims to maximize the students' potential by facilitating a conceptual understanding, sharing relevant information, and developing a relationship focused on promoting academic success. The envisaged result is that students have a meaningful academic experience while in higher education and feel a sense of belonging within the institution.

Who are **Academic Advisors**?

Curriculum Advisors

These advisors are dedicated trained faculty/academic departmental staff (academic or non-academic) who offer support/guidance to students in understanding their curriculum (i.e., majors, minors etc.). This includes students on academic monitoring, appeal and/or probation. This is the equivalent of faculty advising.

Registration Advisors

These advisors support you in the process/practice that guides and supports students through the technical navigation/troubleshooting of offer management, online registration, and other related information/processes.

Central Academic Advisors

Central advisors support students who are undecided in their programme selection and offer support/guidance. This is done through the alignment of a student's personal, academic and career aspirations.

Furthermore, Central Advisors help with:

- Educational planning: Aligning your academic (degree), career and personal interests (incl. registration planning support)
- Career planning: Career goal design, program selection
- Academic success skills: Time management, study skills, revision planning, and exam preparation
- Transition into university: Connecting and engaging with diverse support services

What is the **First-Year Orientation** Programme?

The First-year Orientation Programme is purposefully designed to orientate newly registered students effectively to the university environment, thus assisting in their transition to higher education. The Gateway Orientation course is presented as a module on the UFS Blackboard organization.
