Coenraad Jacobus Juta was born in Pretoria on 18th September, 1921. After leaving school he studied surveying at the Pretoria Technical College. He was consecutively employed as surveyor by a private firm, the department of Lands, the Rhodes University and the mining industry.

Since 1953 he lectured at the Johannesburg Technical College. After completion of his B.A. Hons.-degree in 1961, he lectured Political Science at the University of Natal in Pietermaritzburg. He succeeded in obtaining his M.A. and Ph.D qualifications and was promoted to Senior Lecturer. He is still serving in this capacity.

3. THE DOCUMENTS AND THEIR ARRANGEMENT

3.1 ORIGIN

The collection was handed over to the Institute for Contemporary History in several instalments by Dr. Juta during 1972, 1976 and 1979.

3.2 ARRANGEMENT

The documents received from Dr. Juta are fragmentary and reflect the wide range of his interests in the history of Natal as well as politics in general. The documents were compiled by several politicians and political parties.

The collection consists mainly of unnumbered subject files, but loose documents also exist.

A subject classification is maintained with an indication of the kind of material for each file. Where possible, series are divided into sub-series to assist the researcher. Files of clumsy proportions are sub divided.

Loose documents are sorted in series according to the kind of document.

In all cases documents are arranged chronologically within each series. Undated papers have been placed at the end of each relevant subject.

Publications, maps, sound recordings and general clippings, not part of the subject files, are indicated in appendixes A - I. Where possible, publications are incorporated in the separately compiled publication series.

4. EXTENT AND CONDITION

This collection is in a very good state of preservation and occupies 4,6 m. shelving space.
