2. CURRICULUM VITAE

William Morris Sutton was born in 1928 in Pietermaritzburg. He was educated at the Hilton College in Natal and the Oxford University where he obtained the M.A.-Degree in modern history.

In 1959 he was elected Provincial Councillor for Natal and in 1964 nominated as United Party senator. In 1966 he became the elected member of Parliament for Mooi River. In 1970 and 1974 he was re-elected as member of Parliament. As politician Mr Sutton is among other things known for his firm stand regarding the Schlebusch Commission Report. Other interests are water purification and anti-pollution work.

Outside politics Mr Sutton is a keen sportsman, and as such president of numerous sporting clubs in Howick area. He is also patron of the Maritzburg Football Club and Karkloof Gymkyaana Club.

3. THE DOCUMENTS AND THEIR ARRANGEMENT

3.1 The Documents

This collection was donated to the Institute for Contemporary History by Mr W.M. Sutton. It contains information regarding the United Party, Agricultural Matters, etc.

3.2 Arrangement

The documents of Mr Sutton are fairly complete and reflect the wide range of his interests and activities. The documents are arranged chronologically within each series. Undated papers have been placed at the end of each relevant subject.
