Ambassador Program

- Student volunteers who serve as Social Support Ambassadors in the SSO.
- Eligibility criteria: must be second-year students, maintain a minimum 65% academic average, and demonstrate knowledge of DSA services.
- Assist with campus activities, programmes, and events, as well as additional tasks assigned by the campus coordinator.
- Serve a one-year term, with annual recruitment of new ambassadors.
- Foster student well-being and inclusivity by supporting office initiatives.
- Gain valuable experience in leadership, teamwork, and organisational skills.

LEKGOTLA MEN'S WELL-BEING PROJECT

• The Social Support Office (SSO) piloted the Men's Well-being Project in March 2023 to promote the overall well-being of male students at the University of the Free State (UFS), with 1,337 students from all three campuses participating in its inaugural year. The initiative addresses key factors affecting male students through targeted interventions, recognizing the alarming suicide rates among men in South Africa and the tendency for men to underutilize mental health services. By creating safe spaces for men to openly confront their realities, the project seeks to enhance well-being within the UFS student community and foster a culture that actively supports and promotes men's health and wellness.

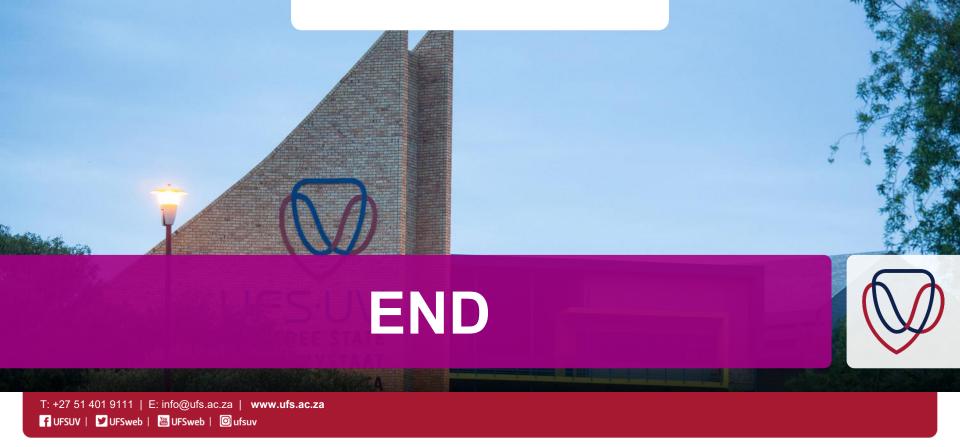
