#### **Brief description**

The purpose of this module is to guide students to study all the aspects concerning pastoral care for law offenders and victims of crime. Students are guided to understand the complexity of crime and the knowledge and skills needed to do pastoral counselling with law offenders. Students are guided to understand the impact of trauma on a victim and guided to acquire the necessary knowledge and skills to do trauma counselling. They are then exposed to a prison environment where they will do counselling with law offenders.
