Situated in the scenic sandstone mountains of Phuthaditjhaba in the Eastern Free State, our Qwaqwa Campus attracts students from across the continent, with the majority from the Eastern Free State and western KwaZulu-Natal.

This campus offers programmes in the Faculties of the Humanities, Education, Economic and Management Sciences, as well as Natural and Agricultural Sciences, with postgraduate teaching in various centres of excellence. Our main consideration is that the learning programmes, research, academic interventions, and community service-learning opportunities are socially and educationally responsive to the region. The on-campus research hubs produce valuable knowledge, much of which has a local focus.

With the influx of postgraduate students from around the globe, the Qwaqwa Campus is probably the fastest-growing rural campus in South Africa. To address the recent growth spurt, existing buildings were renovated, the infrastructure updated, and new buildings added. The huge investment in infrastructure makes it one of the best-equipped rural campuses, with a spacious layout, modern lecture theatres, and comfortable residences.

Various male, female, and day residences accommodate students' living, learning, and social needs, with floodlit stadia, athletic tracks, and netball and basketball courts catering for sports talent and aspirations.

The Bloemfontein Campus dates back to 1904, making our university one of the oldest higher-education institutions in the country. It is a vast campus where staff and students are encouraged to walk while enjoying the beautiful buildings, parks, lawns, artwork, and other facilities. Every effort has been made to make the campus user- and experience-friendly, including braille-guided areas for blind students, and additional ramps and elevators for students with disabilities.

When on the campus, stop and rest under one of the shady trees. You will find that many of the benches represent artwork by **Azwifarwi Ragimana**, a famous South African artist. Walk through the Thakaneng Bridge and the Student Centre where you will find a range of takeaway shops, KovsieFM – the campus radio station, stationery and bookshops. The swanky KovsieGear shop offers visitors and students exciting Kovsie merchandise.

Our Bloemfontein, South, and Qwaqwa Campuses are immaculately maintained and provide a safe and secure environment for the more than 40 000 students who study here. Through an active programme of sports, cultural, and social events, our students are also given the opportunity to develop into competent and compassionate future leaders.

Student accommodation is very popular, and our residences are within walking distance of all facilities. Our Bloemfontein Campus is regarded as one of the most integrated campuses in South Africa, with a very diverse group of students.

The campus is situated in one of the main roads passing through Bloemfontein, Nelson Mandela Drive, and is within walking distance of shopping centres, schools, and other places of interest.

Nestled in the hills overlooking the vibrant city of Bloemfontein, lies the South Campus of the University of the Free State (UFS). The facilities can accommodate up to 4 000 students and include lecture rooms, an auditorium, a library, and an administration building.

Originally established in the 1980s as a satellite campus for Vista University, it was incorporated into the UFS in 2004. Ever since its incorporation, the UFS tailored the South Campus to play a significant role in the economy of the region, the enhancement of its people, as well as being the hub for distance-learning programmes offered by the institution.

One of the main roles of the campus is to draw new students from lower levels of education who would previously not have been able to obtain higher education. The South Campus offers programmes for students to gain access to Further Education and Training (FET) and Higher Education (HE) levels. These programmes enable learners to ultimately enter the mainstream curriculum after completing preparation courses. By offering this opportunity, the UFS ensures that students – who might otherwise have fallen by the wayside – get to develop to their full potential and realise their dreams.

In addition, the South Campus also serves as the pivotal centre to more than 6 000 long-distance learners. These students are not able to study on campus due to a variety of factors, such as their geographical location, financial constraints, or having to complete their degrees on a part-time basis because of job commitments. The influx of long-distance learners account for the South Campus being the fastest growing of the UFS campuses.

On-campus students receive intensive small-group instruction, which has been proven to be a highly successful method of tuition. Distance education is accomplished through online technology and broadcasting mediums.

KOVSIE STUDENT-LIFE CENTRES

Kovsie campuses each have a Student Life Centre where students can socialise informally, enjoy meals, and attend events and meetings. The Student Councils also have their council chambers and offices in these centres and are making conference facilities and smaller committee rooms exclusively available to students. STUDENT LIFE COLLEGES (SLC)

When you become a Kovsie, we want you to feel that you belong to a circle of friends – people who support and inspire you to reach your full potential. This sense of belonging is facilitated through student communities. UFS student communities are created through small pockets or groups that build towards larger communities.

We encourage you to become a member of these cohesive groups through on-campus residences, day residences, student associations, and/or faculty organisations. Together, these groups form the strong building blocks of larger communities called Student Life Colleges.

Student Life Colleges are created by clustering on-campus residences and day residences, which then work together with student associations and faculty organisations. HOUSING AND RESIDENCE AFFAIRS

ON-CAMPUS RESIDENCES On-Campus Residence Accommodation: Junior/Senior Residences

Accommodation at the UFS will become your second home; life in a student residence can be a very exciting and rewarding experience. If you are accepted into one of our residences, you will benefit from a completely new world of friendships that can last for a lifetime. There are many people from different language, racial, and cultural backgrounds on campus. Living and learning in this diverse environment can give you a definite advantage over many other jobseekers once you graduate, and this will help you later in life.

Our residences are very popular, with a waiting list of applicants. Therefore, you should apply as soon as possible if you want to secure a place.

The leadership of residence communities consists of a residence head, prime, residence committee, and peer mentors. This leadership team creates a residence environment where every student feels welcome and inspired. All residence communities are driven by a set of shared values, which mediates a culture of mutual accountability.

First-year students are supported in their transition to higher education by means of a peer-mentor system in residences. Each first-year student is allocated to a peer mentor who facilitates individual conversation as well as conversations in small group format with students.

The accommodation agreement that you entered into with the UFS will, subject to other stipulations or regulations as approved by the Council from time to time, be binding for the full accommodation period. You, or your parent/guardian, or both are responsible for the full accommodation fee for the accommodation period.

APPLICATION FOR RESIDENCE ACCOMMODATION

TO BECOME A RESIDENT IN ONE OF THE ON-CAMPUS RESIDENCES, YOU NEED TO:

Indicate on your application form for studies in 2021 that you require residence (oncampus) accommodation.

Keep your breakage deposit of R960 ready in case you are selected for placement in a residence (refer to the placement procedure on the application form).

Take note of the academic admission criteria residences. Make sure that your admission point meets the criteria.

PLACEMENT POLICY

It is very important to take note of the following academic requirements for junior residences on the:

Bloemfontein and Qwaqwa Campuses

- Meeting the minimum admission requirements for your chosen/intended programme of study does not quarantee placement in a residence on campus, as limited space is available in each residence.
- A minimum Grade 12 admission point (AP) of 30 is required for admission to a residence.
- Your academic merit is determined based on the most recent admission point as calculated by the university (whether Grade 11 or Grade
- If you were admitted to a residence based on the Grade 11 AP, but the final Grade 12 AP is less than 30, your admission to a residence will be cancelled.
- If your current AP (Grade 11 final results or Grade 12 June results) is less than 30, you can still apply for residence accommodation. You will qualify for admission to a residence (subject to availability) if your final Grade 12 AP is 30 or more.
- If you are currently in the University Access Programme (UAP), you will qualify for admission to a residence if you pass all your modules.
- If you were registered at the UFS or another tertiary institution for the second or subsequent years, you must have passed at least 120 credits to qualify for admission to a residence. Current first-year students will qualify for admission to a residence based on their Grade 12 admission point.

South Campus: Admission to a full-time programme on the South Campus

- If you were provisionally admitted to a residence on the Bloemfontein Campus prior to your final Grade 12 results becoming available and your final results indicate that your studies encompass an extended curriculum programme on the South Campus, such provisional admission shall automatically be transferred to a residence on the South Campus.
- Your admission is in all cases subject to you meeting the conditions pertaining to the aforementioned admission.

DAY RESIDENCES

A day residence is a residence that consists of students who live off campus in private homes, student houses, townhouses, flats, rooms, etc. Students who are members of day residences must arrange their own accommodation off campus. Day-student residences are ideal for students who stay in private accommodation and are part of the broader college system.

If you do not live on campus, a day residence gives you the opportunity to participate in organised student activities. It is very important to us that you have the opportunity to develop as a complete person by participating in academic and non-academic activities on campus. With day residences, you can participate in all activities offered in campus residences.

The three day residences each have a residence head and a residence committee that manages their affairs. These people are responsible for managing day residences and seeing to it that all activities offered are taking place in line with the vision, mission, and values of the university.

All day students, and in particular first-year students, are required to join one of the three day residences in order to be active college members.

The Centre for Universal Access and Disability Support (CUADS) aims to ensure that the University of the Free State increasingly becomes a universally accessible higher-education institution which embraces and is welcoming to all students, including students with disabilities.

CUADS assists students in gaining access to:

- Study courses
- Buildings and classrooms on campus
- Learning material
- Residences
- Sporting activities
- · South African Sign Language interpreting service for deaf, hard-of-hearing, and deafened students
- Classrooms
- Computer facilities (the CUADS computer lab houses the latest assistive technology and software; alternative furniture and adapted hardware for physically impaired and blind students)
- Specialised exam and test venues for alternative test and exam procedures

CUADS provides a support service for the following categories of students with disabilities:

- Specific learning difficulties (e.g. dyslexia, ADD/ADHD, hyperactivity)
- · Mobility impaired (e.g. wheelchair users, amputees, cerebral palsy, muscle dystrophy, spina bifida, multiple sclerosis)
- Visually impaired (e.g. blind, partially sighted, eye conditions). Students receive all their study material and textbooks according to the format of their choice, which includes:
 - Braille
 - · Audio (material is read on a digital recorder)
 - Enlarged material
 - E-text
- Hearing impaired (deaf, hard of hearing, and deafened)
- · Various mental-health conditions, psychosocial and other chronic conditions (e.g. schizophrenia, epilepsy, panic disorder)
- Temporary impairments (e.g. a broken hand).

Special arrangements include:

- amanuensis during tests/exams;
- application for extra time during tests/exams, according to their specific impairment (This is done via a formal process of testing and interviewing by a panel from Student Counselling and Development.); and
- on request, tutors are arranged for students in cooperation with the A-step programme (existing tutor programme) on campus.

Note that qualifying for your programme of choice, does not guarantee admission.

STEP 4

You need to source and secure financial support for your studies.

STEP 5

When the final Grade 12 results are released in January 2021, all applications will be re-evaluated; should your evaluation be positive, you will receive a final offer. Take note that meeting the minimum admission requirements for your programme of choice does not guarantee admission.

STEP 6

You have to complete the acceptance process for the offer online within the stipulated timeframe. If you fail to complete the acceptance process for the offer before the deadline, the offer will be withdrawn, and you will lose your space. Note that limited spaces are available.

STEP 7

Pay the prescribed first payment before registration. You can move into the residence on campus where you have been placed, or into off-campus accommodation, and then start your academic activities, including orientation, academic advice, and registration.

To become a student at the University of the Free State, you need to:

- apply for two study options if one option is a selection programme, we advise you to choose a non-selection programme as the second option, because space is limited;
- be finally admitted with your final Grade 12 NSC or IEB results;
- pay the prescribed first payment five (5) working days prior to registration; and
- register in 2021 before classes start.

- You have a minimum level of 4 (50%) in the UFS language of instruction.
- You must pass certain school subjects with a minimum level of achievement in order to take a certain university module. Please refer to the section on the faculty-specific admission requirements.

Limited space: Keep in mind that all programmes have limited space available; therefore, you are encouraged to apply as soon as possible to avoid disappointment. When we process your application for admission, we capture your details onto the UFS databases – if your details are not available, you will not be admitted or be able to register. For this reason, it is very important to stick to the closing dates. **Meeting the minimum admission requirements for your chosen/intended programme of study does not guarantee admission, as limited space is available in each programme.**

National Senior Certificate: If you already have a National Senior Certificate (NSC), you must include a copy with your application form.

Application: Make sure that you complete the application properly and attach all the required documents. An incomplete application, as well as outstanding documents, will delay your application process. Make sure that you complete the application form thoroughly, e.g. if you need on-campus residence accommodation and/or financial aid, indicate this in the relevant section.

Transferring students: If you transfer from another tertiary institution, you must include a certificate of conduct and an official study record from the previous tertiary institution with your application AND submit copies when you register.

International students: If you are from another country, you must attach your certified school-leaving certificate, diplomas, and proof of a conditional exemption certificate issued by the Matriculation Board, to your application. Apply to mb.usaf.ac.za for conditional exemption.



CONFIDENTIALITY CLAUSE

The UFS confirms that all personal information provided in your application form will be treated confidentially and will not be sold to a third party or used for commercial or related purposes.

The UFS further confirms that your personal information will only be used for purposes relating to your potential relationship with the UFS as a student, including but not limited to the processing of your application to study at the UFS, effecting registration at the UFS, and for any communication purposes related to your application and/or registration to study at the UFS.

ADMISSION TO STUDY AT THE UFS

Academic excellence is what the UFS is about – the higher your AP score, the better your chances of being chosen and finally admitted to study. Meeting the minimum admission requirements for your chosen/intended programme of study does not guarantee selection and admission, as all programmes have a limited number of spaces available. Applicants with the highest AP scores are chosen first, and the admission continues until all spaces have been filled. If you do not meet the minimum admission requirements for your intended/chosen programme of study, you will not be selected. Consult the faculty-specific admission requirements for all the programmes you qualify for and apply for the two programmes that best fit your personality, purpose, and passion.

You will be **CONDITIONALLY ADMITTED** based on your Grade 11 or equivalent results, subject to you meeting all the minimum requirements for the intended programme of study. Please note that conditional admission is not applicable to all the selection programmes in the Faculty of Health Sciences.

Your **FINAL ADMISSION** to the programme of your choice will depend on your final Grade 12 results. You will be notified immediately of the university's admission decision after your final Grade 12 results have been released by the Department of Education. Therefore, it is your responsibility to ensure that your contact details are correct on your application form.

CALCULATION OF YOUR ADMISSION POINT (AP) SCORE:

It is important that you thoroughly study the admission requirements of the programmes you are interested in. The UFS calculates your AP score based on the NSC achievement scale. An AP score consisting of seven levels is used. Points will be awarded for six academic subjects (note: no points will be awarded for achievement levels lower than 30%). One point is awarded for Life Orientation from achievement level 5 (60%) or higher when calculating your AP score for admission purposes.

Important information:

- A non-refundable annual administrative fee is charged on all international student accounts.
- Closing date for international students' applications for undergraduate studies is 31 August 2020.
- You must have a VALID study visa before you can enter South Africa.
- Make sure your study visa is issued for study purposes at the UFS, and not at any other institution in South Africa. You must have a valid and appropriate/correct visa to be registered at the UFS.

ACADEMIC MERIT AWARDS FOR NEW FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

The UFS has increased the academic merit awards for first-year students. You have worked really hard and the UFS values and acknowledges your effort. You can use your merit award allocation to register. If your merit award is less than the required registration fee, you will have to pay the balance in order to finalise your registration.

The university reserves the right to amend the regulations and award values and/or conditions applicable to the awarding thereof without prior notice.

If you qualify for an academic merit award, we will credit your class-fee account with the amount of the award after you register as a student at the University of the Free State.

The following scale is used to allocate awards:

The award value is based on the formula used to calculate the admission point.

These awards are automatically awarded to new students based on their performance in the final matriculation examination. The award offer is subject to you meeting the minimum admission requirements of your programme of study and being registered at the UFS as a first-year student in 2021.

First-year students who initially registered at other higher-education institutions

First-time entering first-year students who initially registered at other higher-education institutions, discontinued their studies, and then register at the University of the Free State, will not qualify for academic merit awards during their first year of study.

What does this mean? If you transfer to the UFS from another university, you cannot get an academic merit award based on your final Grade 12 results during your first year of study at the UFS.

Interruption of studies

To qualify for an academic merit award, a student must register at the University of the Free State as a student again. If there is an interruption of more than five (5) years between the last examination (matric or university) and the year in which the award must be awarded, the student does not qualify for an award.

What does this mean? If you interrupt your studies for more than five (5) years, you will lose the academic merit award.

Discontinuation of study

If a student discontinues his/her course during the year, the award will be recovered pro rata.

What does this mean? If you have an award and stop studying, any credit balance on your UFS class-fee account (up to an amount equal to that of the award) will be taken away after you have discontinued your studies.

Payment of academic merit award

Students who qualify for an academic merit award will have the awarded amount credited to their tuition-fee account during registration at the UFS.

What does this mean? You will not get cash; the money will be paid into your student account at the UFS.

Undertaking

The student undertakes to complete his/her degree studies at this university. If he/she does not complete the course, Council reserves the right to claim back the entire awarded amount or the part thereof that may already have been paid out. However, each case will be treated on merit. An award may be withdrawn at any time if the behaviour, diligence, or progress of the student is found to be unsatisfactory. If the examination results of a merit award recipient are such that he/she will have to repeat the studies of a full year/semester, the award will be regarded as a study loan and it will have to be paid back.

What does this mean? If you get an academic merit award from the UFS, you can only complete your studies at the UFS. If you don't complete the qualification, you may have to pay back all the money, or some of it. It depends on your specific situation. If you do not perform well academically, or behave badly, you may lose the award.

OCCASIONAL STUDIES

Students who register for occasional studies do not qualify for merit awards based on their academic achievement of the previous year or academic achievements during their occasional studies.



If your NSFAS bursary has been approved and allocated by the Financial Aid Office, you may register without paying the required first payment. Terms and conditions apply.

Important notice: NSFAS does not fund the University Access Programmes (UAP), as it is a bridging programme. You must fund your own studies and apply the following year for mainstream studies, if you have successfully passed your UAP year. NSFAS Funding is ONLY applicable for the Higher Certificates presented via the UFS South Campus and mainstream programmes on the Bloemfontein and Qwaqwa Campuses.

NB: Only South African citizens qualify for NSFAS funding.

To complete **phase two** of your registration process, you are required to visit an academic adviser when you arrive on campus. WHAT ARE THE NBTS?

Universities South Africa (USAf) initiated the NBTs, and several South African universities use the test(s) as part of their student placement processes. The first test is the Academic and Quantitative Literacy Test (AQL), and the second is the Mathematics Test (MAT). Each test takes three hours to complete and both tests are written on the same day.

IS IT COMPULSORY TO TAKE THE NBT TESTS?

Yes, all first-time entering undergraduate applicants to the University of the Free State must write the NBTs before registering, but preferably before the end of 2020.

MUST I WRITE BOTH TESTS?

It depends. ALL prospective students must write the AQL test. If you apply to the Faculty of Economic and Management Sciences, the Faculty of Natural and Agricultural Sciences, or the Faculty of Health Sciences, you must write both the AQL and MAT tests where required.


WHY WRITE THE NBTS?

The level of academic reading and writing that you must be able to master at university is very different from what you are used to at school. If you lack this level of skills, you may have a hard time at university. But if we know what the level of your skills are, we can make sure that you enrol for the most appropriate modules and programmes in your first year. And that is what we use the NBTs for – to help us understand what skills you have, and what skills need to be developed.

HOW, WHEN, AND WHERE TO WRITE?

Registration for NBTs opens on 1 April 2020. You should write the NBTs while you are in Grade 12, before you register at the university. Visit www.nbt.ac.za for all the information you need. Once you have written the tests, you can use the results to apply at any university. The UFS only accepts NBT results, NO other admission tests will be considered.

If you are applying to study MBChB in the Faculty of Health Sciences, you should have written the NBTs before the end of June 2020.

HOW DOES THE UFS MAKE USE OF THE NBT RESULTS?

In three ways:

- We use it as part of the selection process for the Faculty of Health Sciences.
- If you apply to any of our other faculties, we use NBT results during the registration process.
- To place students in appropriate academic literacy development modules, where necessary.

Generally, as stated above, we use NBT performance levels to place first-year students into appropriate programmes or modules. If you did not pass the NBT Academic Literacy Test and want to study in English, you must register for one of the following academic literacy development modules in English: EALH/EALE/EALN/EALL 1508. The same applies if you want to study in Afrikaans (if offered in the relevant faculty) but did not pass the Academic Literacy Tests – in which case you must register for one of the academic literacy development courses in Afrikaans: AGAH/AGAM/AGAM/AGAE/AGAN/AGAE 1508.

These academic literacy development courses are not language courses. They teach you to read academic text efficiently and critically, while extracting the main ideas and key details. This skill will help you to adequately demonstrate your knowledge in tests and exams. It will also teach you to write academic essays and assignments. Overall, it will give you the confidence to perform at your best academically.

However, it may be necessary for the UFS to make some changes to the information presented in the prospectus following publication – for example, where it is necessary to reflect changes in policy, practice or theory, or if an accrediting body necessitates requirements to be amended. Furthermore, certain programmes may only be offered if there is a sufficient number of applicants.



DISCOUNT ON EARLY PAYMENTS (SA STUDENTS ONLY)

Discount is given on early payment of tuition-fee accounts. Standard discount is given annually and is as follows:

- 5% when all fees for the whole year is paid before 28 February
- 2½% when all first-semester fees are paid before 28 February

Discounts are not given automatically. You must apply for discounts in writing. Discounts are only given on module and accommodation fees charged. If you receive any form of financial aid from the UFS on tuition and/or accommodation fees, you do not qualify to claim this discount.

BURSARIES AND LOANS

IMPORTANT: If you have a bursary or loan, it is your responsibility to ensure that the bursary donors make payments on time, and in accordance with university regulations. You must make sure that you provide your sponsors with the correct details of your account.

If your sponsor does not pay your account in time, interest will be charged and debited to the account, and you or your parents or guardian will be responsible for the payment of such interest.

FIRST PAYMENTS IN ADVANCE BEFORE YOU CAN REGISTER AS A STUDENT

FIRST SEMESTER

Registration for first-semester and year modules takes place during January and February.

- First payments must be made **five (5) working** days before you register. You will not be able to register until these amounts reflect as credits on your tuition-fee account. If your tuition fees are less than the amounts required, you must pay the full tuition amount.
- For the amounts that must be paid before you register, visit www.ufs.ac.za and follow the links: Students – Student Finance – First payments for registration.

SECOND SEMESTER

Registration for second-semester modules takes place in July.

- South African students: Payments prior to registration for the second semester are the same as for the first semester.
- International students: International students must pay all fees for the second semester in advance before registration can take place.

Visit www.ufs.ac.za and follow the links: Students – Student Finance – First payments for registration, to view the amounts that must be paid before you register in 2021.

STUDENTS RECEIVING FINANCIAL AID (SA STUDENTS ONLY)

If you receive financial aid (bursary/loans), and the bursary or loan covers all fees for the year, the amount payable before registration will be reduced by the amount of the financial aid. If your bursary or loan does not cover all fees for the year, you must still pay the prescribed first payment before you register. The amount payable must reflect as a credit balance on your tuition-fee account before you will be allowed to continue with registration.

Please fax proof of your bursaries/loans to +27 58 718 5353 five (5) working days before you register. You must bring the original proof of your bursary/loan with you when you register.

NB:

PAYMENTS AFTER REGISTRATION

Tuition and residence fees are calculated per semester. All fees must be paid as follows, regardless of whether or not an account was received. Official account statements are emailed to your UFS4LIFE email address. It is your responsibility to enquire should you not receive an account at that email address.

PAYMENT DATES FOR **SOUTH AFRICAN STUDENTS**

First semester: all fees for the first semester are payable **on/before 31 March**. Second semester: all fees for the second semester are payable **on/before 31 August**.

PAYMENT DATES FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

First semester: all fees for the first semester are payable **on/before 31 March**. Second semester: all fees for the second semester are payable **on/before 30 June**, regardless of any other date which may appear on account statements.

All other fees are payable no later than the end of the month following the month in which the transaction took place, as indicated on the account statement, unless specifically stipulated otherwise in the regulations.

ESTIMATED PROGRAMME COSTS

- The cost per programme is the average cost per year.
- Tuition fees are charged per module.
- Programme prices vary according to the modules registered for.
- Prices quoted are for SA and SADC students.
- International non-SADC students pay the actual module price + 50%.

NOTES AND STUDY MATERIAL

Study material/notes are automatically prepared when you register and is charged accordingly. It is your responsibility to collect the study material. If you cancel/discontinue any of the modules, you will not be refunded for the notes and study material.

BOOKS

Money for books can be paid into a separate account in advance. The amount paid will be transferred to your student card.

At the end of each academic year, the credit available on your book-money account will automatically be transferred to your tuition-fees account.

STUDENT CARD

Your student card is your key to all kinds of services and events at the UFS. It is your official university identification and, as a student or employee, you must carry it with you whenever you are on campus. Your electronic student card is for your use only, nobody else may use it. Your personal details are associated with your card and are unique to your card. Your first card will be issued free of charge. A fee is payable to replace a lost, stolen or damaged card.

PARKING DISC

To park in designated parking spaces allocated to students, you must buy a parking permit/disc at Traffic Services by the end of February. It must be displayed on the windshield of your vehicle.



ADDITIONAL LATE REGISTRATION FEE

If you attend lectures in a course for which you are not registered, you will have to pay an additional amount per module if approval is granted for registration after the final registration date. The fee is payable in addition to the tuition fees for the course.

MATRICULATION EXEMPTION

All prospective students applying for conditional matriculation exemption on the strength of tertiary qualifications with a view to admission to the university, have to pay the amount required by the Joint Matriculation Board.

RESIDENCE AND ACCOMMODATION FEES

You or your parent/guardian or both are responsible for the full accommodation fee for the accommodation period. Tariffs for accommodation in the different residences and living units are available on request.

For accommodation fees, visit www.ufs.ac.za and follow the links Students – Tuition Fees – Quotation. Fees are also published in the fee yearbook.

NB: Residential students must familiarise themselves with all policies regarding accommodation.

BREAKAGE DEPOSIT (FIRST PLACEMENT IN RESIDENCE)

When you accept the accommodation offer, you must pay the breakage deposit.

RULES REGARDING DEPOSITS

You will FORFEIT the deposit you paid if accommodation has been allocated to you and a place has thus been reserved for you, when you:

- do not show up, or
- cancel your place after 31 December.

The breakage deposit may be used at the sole discretion of the university to recover any contingencies resulting in costs, losses, damages, penalties, etc.

The breakage deposit will ONLY be refunded if you:

- do not comply with admission requirements;
- are not selected for a specific course;
- pass away;
- submit a satisfactory medical certificate as motivation for cancellation;
- leave at the end of the accommodation term. The breakage deposit will be transferred to your tuition-fees account, and if this results in a credit on the account, the credit may be paid out on request.

ACCOMMODATION COSTS IN CASE OF CANCELLATION OF STUDIES

First-year students: If you stay in a residence and cancel your accommodation during the first term of the academic year, you will be responsible for accommodation fees up to the date of cancellation. If you cancel your accommodation during the second, third or fourth terms, you will be responsible for the full accommodation fee for the term in which the cancellation is submitted.

FAMILY DISCOUNT ON TUITION AND/OR ACCOMMODATION FEES

If three or more students who are dependents from the same family (children, stepchildren, adopted children, but excluding children-in-law or married children) study at the university and/or stay in university residences at the same time, the following discount will be granted on the amount payable for residing in a UFS residence, and on modules the students are registered for:

- Three students: 10%
- Four or more students: 15%

Discounts will be granted on the following conditions:

- A discount may only be claimed for full-time undergraduate SA students.
- All dependents must be under the age of 26.
- Students receiving any form of financial aid for tuition and/or accommodation fees do not qualify for this discount.
- The discount will be recalculated if one or more of the students discontinue their studies or leave the residence.
- Family discounts are not given automatically. You must apply for family discount in writing and must present evidence of relationships. The full particulars of the students concerned must be submitted.
- A discount may only be claimed for the current academic year.
- Family discount will only be given on module and accommodation fees.

LIABILITIES

ACCIDENTS

As the university only insures its own risks, it cannot be held liable for accidents that happen to students. It is therefore recommended that students take out personal accident insurance.

DAMAGE TO STUDENTS' PERSONAL POSSESSIONS

The university cannot be held liable for loss or damage to students' personal possessions. Residence students also leave their possessions in the residences during the holidays at their own risk. It is therefore recommended that students insure their possessions. Protect yourself and the property of the university. Any damage and/or theft must be reported to the Protection Services Division. Distinguish between fun and crime, and respect other people's property.

VEHICLES ON CAMPUS

It is recommended that students who keep vehicles on campus take out SASRIA (riot insurance). All students and members of the public who wish to use the roads on campus should purchase an access disc issued by the Protection Services Division of the university. The disc must be displayed on the windscreen.

If you do not have an access permit, you could receive a traffic fine. People using the roads on the university campus or parking on the campus do so at their own risk and the university does not accept any responsibility for any accident, loss or damage. Any damage or theft must be reported to the Security Services Division.



GLOSSARY

UNIVERSITY

An institution of advanced study and research in the arts and sciences where the highest possible academic qualification can be obtained.

RECTOR

The Rector is the Chief Executive Officer of the university, with Vice-Rectors supporting him. Prof Francis Petersen is the Rector and Vice-Chancellor.

UNIVERSITY COUNCIL

The University Council is the highest decision–making body of the university. The Council consists of representatives of the university, the Student Representative Council (SRC), church and community representatives, prominent businesspeople, and individuals appointed by the government.

CHANCELLOR

The Chancellor is the ceremonial head of the university and is generally a prominent figure in society. Our Chancellor is Dr Khotso Mokhele.

FACULTY

The students, lecturers, researchers, and management of a group of departments (in a broad sense) working in the same field of study, form a faculty. The Qwaqwa Campus has four faculties of academic excellence. They are:

- Economic and Management Sciences
- Education
- The Humanities
- Natural and Agricultural Sciences

The head of a faculty is called a dean, who resides on the Bloemfontein Campus. At the Qwaqwa Campus, faculty heads are called programme heads and the subject head is responsible for the management of departments.

DEPARTMENT

The students, lecturers, research and management activities in a specific field of study form a department. At the head of a department, we find the departmental head or departmental chairperson. For undergraduate courses, you will be required to attend classes in various departments, while postgraduate studies are generally undertaken in a single department.

PROFESSOR

A person who has distinguished himself/herself as an expert in a specific field of study.

LECTURER

The name assigned to a person who presents classes to students. Each department has a number of lecturers who are experts in specific fields of study and who are attached full time to the university. Lecturing staff are addressed in terms of their titles.

KOVSIF

The historical word 'Kovsie' is the nickname given to students at the UFS. This is also the general name used for referring to the UFS.

DEGREE

An academic achievement that provides evidence that you are academically competent in a specific field of study so that you may embark upon a career or careers related to this field. Undergraduate refers to students who are studying for the first degree, while the term postgraduate refers to students engaged in a study field where they have already obtained a degree. For example, the term degree could denote a BA (Baccalaureus Artium/Bachelor of Arts), a BCom degree (Baccalaureus Commercii/Bachelor of Commerce), or a BSc degree (Baccalaureus Scientiae/Bachelor of Science). The minimum period of study for an undergraduate bachelor's degree is generally three or four years. This is followed by an honours degree (generally one or two years) or a master's degree (one or more years), and finally a doctorate (generally two years or longer). Some degrees lead directly into certain professions, while other degrees provide general preparation for a variety of careers. A general BCom degree will equip you with the necessary economic and management knowledge so that, for example, you may apply for a position as a manager in a company.

MODULE

A module refers to specific fields of study within a discipline. For example, Financial Management is one of several modules in the field of study known as Business Management.

THE ACADEMIC CALENDAR

An academic year consists of two semesters. The first semester usually commences early in February, and the second semester by the end of July. In between, there is generally a holiday of approximately three weeks. The second semester is concluded at the end of November. Undergraduate students write an examination at the end of each semester. For postgraduate studies, much more self-study and research are expected from students.


