In order to be considered for selection in a programme, an applicant is required to comply with the programme's minimum admission criteria in respect of the total AP score (APS), subject-specific requirements (as determined per programme), and the faculty/department's specific requirements. However, due to limited space, fulfilling all the minimum entry (admission) requirements does not guarantee acceptance to study at the UFS, or entrance into any particular programme offered by the UFS.


Situated in the scenic sandstone mountains of Phuthaditjhaba in the Eastern Free State, our Qwaqwa Campus attracts students from across the continent, with the majority from the Eastern Free State and western KwaZulu-Natal.

This campus offers programmes in the Faculties of The Humanities, Education, Economic and Management Sciences, as well as Natural and Agricultural Sciences, with postgraduate teaching in various centres of excellence. Nestled in the hills overlooking the vibrant city of Bloemfontein, lies the South Campus of the University of the Free State (UFS). The facilities can accommodate up to 4 000 students and include lecture rooms, an auditorium, a library, and an impressive administration building.

Originally established in the 1980s as a satellite campus for Vista University, it was incorporated into the UFS in 2004. Ever since its incorporation, the UFS tailored the South Campus to play a significant role in the economy of the region, the enhancement of its people, as well as being the hub for distance-learning programmes offered by the institution.


One of the main roles of the campus is to draw new students from lower levels of education who would previously not have been able to obtain higher education. The South Campus offers programmes for students to gain access to Further Education and Training (FET) and Higher Education (HE) levels. These programmes enable learners to ultimately enter the mainstream curriculum after completing preparation courses. By offering this opportunity, the UFS ensures that students – who might otherwise have fallen by the wayside – get to develop to their full potential and realise their dreams.

In addition, the South Campus also serves as the pivotal centre to more than 6 000 long-distance learners. These students are not able to study on campus due to a variety of factors, such as their geographical location, financial constraints, or having to complete their degrees on a part-time basis because of job commitments. The influx of long-distance learners account for the South Campus being the fastest growing of the UFS campuses.





- If you are a senior student, consult the following for admission requirements: head of department | lecturer | faculty rulebooks.
- All admission requirements are subject to change without prior notification.
- Unless stated otherwise, a level 4 (50%) is required for English Home Language or English First Additional Language.
- Refer to Important Closing Dates for selection programmes. Applications for all other non-selection programmes close on 30 September 2021.

EXTENDED CURRICULUM PROGRAMMES

Prospective students who have applied for studies in 2022, but do not meet the admission requirements for the mainstream programme with their final NSC results, may be considered for the Extended Curriculum Programme (ECP). Placement is not guaranteed and is subject to availability of space. The better your NSC results, the better your chance of being admitted to study at the UFS.

The ECP is designed to equip students who do not meet the minimum admission requirements with the necessary competencies to be successful in their studies. Academic support and skills development are integrated with regular academic work.

IMPORTANT: *To be considered for placement in the ECP, prospective students must apply for the mainstream programmes.*





- register in 2022 before classes start.

- you meet **all** the minimum admission requirements for the programme you intend to study. Meeting the minimum admission requirements for your chosen/intended programme of study does not guarantee admission, as limited spaces are available in each programme;
- you have a minimum level of 4 (50%) in English Home Language or English First Additional Language; and
- **you must pass certain school subjects with a minimum level of achievement in order to take a certain university module.** For example, you must get a mark of 70% for Mathematics in Grade 12 if you plan to study BSc majoring in Physics with Engineering subjects. Limited space: Keep in mind that all programmes have limited space available; therefore, you are encouraged to apply as soon as possible to avoid disappointment. When we process your application for admission, we capture your details onto the UFS databases – if your details are not available, or if you have omitted it on your application form, you will not be admitted or be able to register. For this reason, it is very important to complete the application form in full and to stick to the closing dates. National Senior Certificate: If you already have a National Senior Certificate (NSC), you must include a copy with your application form.

Application: Make sure that you complete the application properly and attach all the required documents. An incomplete application, as well as outstanding documents, will delay your application process. Make sure that you complete the application form thoroughly, e.g. your personal details, school performance levels, the correct name of the school you are currently attending or have attended if you have already matriculated, if you need on-campus residence accommodation and/or financial aid, indicate this in the relevant section.



ADMISSION TO STUDY AT THE UFS

Academic excellence is what the UFS is about – the higher your AP score, the better your chances of being chosen and finally admitted to study. **Meeting the minimum admission requirements for your chosen/intended programme of study does not guarantee selection and admission, as all programmes have a limited number of spaces available.** Applicants with the highest AP scores are chosen first, and the admission continues until all spaces have been filled. If you do not meet the minimum admission requirements for your intended/chosen programme of study, **you will not** be selected. Consult the faculty-specific admission requirements for all the programmes you qualify for and apply for the two programmes that best fit your personality, purpose, and passion.

Admission can be a complicated process.

To make it easy to understand, the admission process can be summarised in the following steps:



CALCULATION OF YOUR ADMISSION POINT (AP) SCORE:

It is important that you thoroughly study the admission requirements of the programmes you are interested in. The UFS calculates your AP score based on the NSC achievement scale. An AP score consisting of seven levels is used. Points will be awarded for six academic subjects (note: no points will be awarded for achievement levels lower than 30%). One point is awarded for Life Orientation from achievement Level 5 (60%) or higher when calculating your AP score for admission purposes.

APPLICATION AND ADMISSIONS OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

APPLICATION AND ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS:

- Closing date for international students' applications for undergraduate studies is 31 August 2021.
- You must have a VALID study visa endorsed for study at the UFS, and not at any other institution in South Africa before you enter South Africa for studies at the UFS.
- You must be a member of a medical aid registered in terms of the South African Medical Schemes Act, as required by the South African Immigration Act. Your medical aid MUST be valid for the duration of the academic year (until 31 December), renewable each year. No travel insurance, hospital plans or foreign medical aids will be accepted.
- A non-refundable annual administrative levy is charged on all international student accounts. This fee is added to the annual registration fee payable by all students at the UFS.
- Students from outside the Southern African Development Community (SADC) pay international fees, which are 50% more per module per year compared to the fees paid by South African students.
- The UFS cannot offer financial support (bursaries, loans) to international students. It is therefore important to ensure that you have sufficient financial resources for the planned duration of your studies.
- A first payment is required before you can register as a UFS student. The Department of Student Finance will communicate the amount and payment deadline to you. For more information, visit <https://www.ufs.ac.za/kovsielife/unlisted-pages/tuition-fees/>
- Should you fail to pay your tuition fees in total by 30 June, your registration will be suspended.
- If you have a scholarship, inform your sponsor of the UFS regulations on registration fees and tuition-fee payments before you register.

- English is the principal medium of instruction; therefore, you must have an adequate command of the English language.

Both are not a prerequisite for application. Please make sure that you capture subjects exactly as stated on your school-leaving report – not percentages.

You need to upload copies of the following documents:

- Your passport or South African identity document
- Your final Grade 11 results with the school's stamp
- If available, your final Grade 12 results with the school's stamp
- If available, certified copy of your school-leaving certificate
- If applicable, study record (academic transcript) with a certificate of conduct and/or qualification certificate if you have obtained your degree

NB: Grade 12 June results with the school's stamp must be emailed to studentadmin@ufs.ac.za as soon as it becomes available, especially if you have applied for a selection programme.

STEP 2

Your application is submitted. You will receive a student number and acknowledgement of your application. If you have not submitted the required documents, you will be requested to do so to finalise your application.

STEP 3

Your application and eligibility for a USAf certificate of conditional exemption, if applicable, are evaluated by the university. Should your evaluation be positive, you will receive a conditional offer to study – SUBJECT TO AVAILABILITY OF SPACE. Selection programmes are excluded. If you have indicated in your application that you require on-campus residence, you will also receive correspondence from Housing and Residence Affairs. Note that qualifying for your programme of choice does not guarantee admission.

STEP 4

If you do not yet have a Universities South Africa (USAf) Certificate of Conditional Exemption, or are in the process of applying for one, the UFS Office for International Affairs (OIA) will assist you. The office can apply to USAf on your behalf. Once a conditional offer has been made to you, please liaise with niemannaja@ufs.ac.za or internationalenquiries@ufs.ac.za for assistance. Detailed information is included on p. 47. You will be responsible for the payment of the USAf fee. Please note that assistance from the OIA is only available if you apply to the UFS. STEP 6

Following receipt of the conditional offer to study, you will receive a visa (undertaking) letter from the UFS Office for International Affairs.

STEP 7

Contact the UFS Office for International Affairs (OIA) for individual advice on study visa applications and mandatory South African medical aid. Please contact niemannaja@ufs.ac.za or internationalenquiries@ufs.ac.za for assistance.

STEP 8

Obtain mandatory South African medical aid – the OIA (contact details above) can assist you. This is required for you to be able to obtain a study visa.

STEP 11

When your final statement of results is available, it must be submitted to the UFS. Your conditional offer will be re-evaluated, and you will receive a final admission offer.

STEP 12

You have to complete the acceptance process for the offer online within the stipulated timeframe. If you fail to complete the acceptance process for the offer before the deadline, the offer will be withdrawn, and you will lose your space. Note that limited space is available.

If you meet the requirements, you will be allowed to register conditionally on condition that you finalise the application for Matriculation Exemption.

MATRICULATION EXEMPTION

Matriculation exemption is a legal requirement for international students for first-degree study at a South African university. Students who did not pass the South African Senior Certificate with endorsement are required by law to apply for matriculation exemption from the Matriculation Board. Prospective international students will receive advice on the necessary type of matriculation exemption; the UFS Office for International Affairs is available to apply on behalf of prospective international students for certificates of conditional exemption. Apply to mb.usaf.ac.za for conditional exemption.

The application will only be finalised by the Matriculation Board on receipt of the final matric certificates.

Admission to degree studies at the UFS requires either

- an Endorsed South African Senior Certificate, or
- a Matriculation Exemption Certificate issued by the South African Matriculation Board.

Below is an outline of the process for students who prefer to apply to USAf themselves.

Registered UFS students on the South Campus who have completed the Higher Certificate and wish to continue with bachelor's degree studies, must also follow these steps to apply for a conditional exemption certificate. **Students will need to submit final school-leaving results to receive conditional or full exemption.**

SOUTH AFRICAN MEDICAL AID



In terms of the Immigration Act 13 of 2002 as amended and its regulations, any international prospective student in the Republic of South Africa has to provide proof of medical cover with a medical scheme registered in terms of the Medical Schemes Act 131 of 1998. Although you might be able to secure a study visa with other types of medical products, whether South African or otherwise, the University of the Free State only accepts South African medical-aid products. To comply with the regulations, the university requires a membership certificate as proof of full medical-aid cover with a South African-registered medical-aid scheme for the full calendar year, until 31 December of that year. (<https://www.medicalschemes.com/medicalschemes.aspx>)

To avoid unnecessary complications, please make the necessary financial arrangements with the medical-aid provider prior to your entry into South Africa. Should you rely on a sponsorship, please make sure that you advise your sponsor of this requirement as soon as you get sponsorship or acceptance. The required medical-aid cover fee must be paid directly to the medical-aid company, separate from the tuition fees. Students will not be allowed to register unless they can show a membership certificate as proof of a valid and comprehensive medical-aid cover for the duration of the academic year (until 31 December); without a clearance certificate, students cannot register at the institution. Students who are members or dependents of a South African-based parent/guardian/spousal/work medical aid, are required to present a recent membership certificate for the annual registration. The membership certificate must reflect active membership for the current year.



STUDY VISAS

If you are a foreign student and wish to study in South Africa, you can apply for a study visa by completing South African Home Affairs Form BI-1738. Study visas must be applied for at VFS Global Centres (<https://www.vfsglobal.com/dha/southafrica/>) at various locations in South Africa or at the nearest South African embassy, mission or consulate abroad; prospective students are responsible for the payment of the relevant fees. Study visas for studies at a learning institution must be valid for the duration of the study.

The following documents must be submitted with the **BI-1738 application** form:

- a passport valid for no less than 30 days after intended studies
- payment of the prescribed administrative fee
- confirmation and proof of payment for a South African medical aid through a medical scheme registered with the SA Council for Medical Schemes; the cover must remain valid for the duration of the calendar year
- letter of offer from the university, stating the duration of the degree
- letter of undertaking from the university – this letter is issued by the Office for International Affairs
- medical and radiological reports (less than six months old)
- yellow fever vaccination certificate, if relevant
- relevant certificates if married, widowed, divorced, or separated
- details regarding arranged accommodation while in South Africa
- proof of sufficient funds to cover tuition fees and maintenance
- a police clearance certificate for the past 12 months or longer since the age of 18.

You are advised to submit the documentation as soon as possible. **DO NOT** send the documentation to the university. You should keep a copy of your submission and all receipts safe. Please note that it can take longer than one month to obtain a study visa.

Please note that the holder of a study visa may conduct part-time work for a period not exceeding 20 hours per week.

OFFICE FOR INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

The Office for International Affairs (OIA) serves as the first port of call for all international students at the UFS, providing assistance and specialised administrative support. The principal purpose of the OIA is to enable internationalisation at the UFS. It renders strategic advice on internationalisation and supports the international activities of internal UFS stakeholders. It furthermore supports international partnerships, research internationalisation, internationalisation-at-home activities, and student exchanges.

The services include, but are not limited to

- specialised services for international students, and ensuring their compliance with relevant legislation;
- facilitating international partnerships and advice to internal stakeholders on partnership processes;
- providing practical and emotional support for international students;
- structuring co-curricular internationalisation-at-home activities, such as cultural diversity celebrations;
- supporting co-curricular internationalisation-at-home activities and the social integration of international students; and
- liaison with various external stakeholders, i.e. government, embassies in South Africa, science councils, and funding agencies.

As a first-entering international student, you

are invited to join the Umoja Buddy Programme (UBP), coordinated by the OIA. The UBP is designed to help with the adjustment process by pairing newly admitted international students with current senior students at the UFS. Students requesting an Umoja ambassador have the chance to start their time here at the UFS with a friend they can hang out with, and who can help them adjust to campus life. The UBP is a fun and easy way to learn about South African culture, and it is a great way to share about your own country and culture. The UBP provides both international and local students at the University of the Free State the opportunity for an enriching cultural exchange and allows both participants to gain a broadened perspective on the world.



DON'T WAIT TILL THE LAST MINUTE!!!

Some bursaries do not pay out immediately, and the delay can cause you stress and anxiety. To avoid the stress and anxiety about your finances, you are advised to source and secure funds when you apply for studies at the UFS to support yourself in terms of registration fees, books, meals, accommodation, transport, etc., while you wait for the bursary to pay out.

The University of the Free State offers the following bursaries for qualifying students:

ACADEMIC MERIT AWARDS FOR NEW FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

The UFS has increased the academic merit awards for first-year students. You have worked really hard and the UFS values and acknowledges your effort. You can use your merit award allocation to register. If your merit award is less than the required registration fee, you will have to pay the balance in order to finalise your registration.

The university reserves the right to amend the regulations and award values and/or conditions applicable to the awarding thereof without prior notice.

If you qualify for an academic merit award, we will credit your class-fee account with the amount of the award after you register as a student at the University of the Free State.

The following scale is used to allocate awards:

The award value is based on the formula used to calculate the admission point.

These awards are automatically awarded to new students based on their performance in the final matriculation examination. The award offer is subject to you meeting the minimum admission requirements in your programme of study and being registered at the UFS as a first-year student in 2022.

FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS WHO INITIALLY REGISTERED AT OTHER HIGHER-EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS

First-time entering first-year students who initially registered at other higher-education institutions, discontinued their studies, and then register at the University of the Free State, will not qualify for academic merit awards during their first year of study.

What does this mean? *If you transfer to the UFS from another university, you cannot get an academic merit award based on your final Grade 12 results during your first year of study at the UFS.*

INTERRUPTION OF STUDIES

To qualify for an academic merit award, a student must register at the University of the Free State as a student again. If there is an interruption of more than five (5) years between the last examination (matric or university) and the year in which the award must be awarded, the student does not qualify for an award.

What does this mean? *If you interrupt your studies for more than five (5) years, you will lose the academic merit award.*

DISCONTINUATION OF STUDY

If a student discontinues his/her course during the year, the award will be recovered pro rata.

What does this mean? *If you have an award and stop studying, any credit balance on your UFS class-fee account (up to an amount equal to that of the award) will be taken away after you have discontinued your studies.*

PAYMENT OF ACADEMIC MERIT AWARD

Students who qualify for an academic merit award will have the awarded amount credited to their tuition-fee account during registration at the UFS.

What does this mean? *You will not get cash; the money will be paid into your student account at the UFS.*

UNDERTAKING

The student undertakes to complete his/her degree studies at this university. If he/she does not complete the course, Council reserves the right to claim back the entire awarded amount or the part thereof that may already have been paid out. However, each case will be treated on merit.

An award may be withdrawn at any time if the behaviour, diligence, or progress of the student is found to be unsatisfactory. If the examination results of a merit-award recipient are such that he/she will have to repeat the studies of a full year/semester, the award will be regarded as a study loan and it will have to be paid back.

What does this mean? *If you get an academic merit award from the UFS, you can only complete your studies at the UFS. If you don't complete the qualification, you may have to pay back all the money, or some of it. It depends on your specific situation. If you do not perform well academically, or behave badly, you may lose the award.*

OCCASIONAL STUDIES

Students who register for occasional studies do not qualify for merit awards based on their academic achievement of the previous year or academic achievements during their occasional studies.

Terms and conditions apply.

New first-year students: prospective students must apply before 30 November 2021 for a bursary for culture, art, and leadership. CENTRAL ACADEMIC ADVISING (CTL) AT THE UFS

JOURNEY TO SUCCESS



Advising is a way to connect students to the campus and help them feel that someone is looking out for them.

During the registration process, you are required to consult with an academic adviser. The faculties, in collaboration with the Centre for Teaching and Learning (CTL), have dedicated academic advisers to help you better understand how your academic aspirations connect with your dream job. To help you along your way, we offer you three main types of advisers that can support and guide your journey to academic success:

Peer advisers:

- Who are they? P3 mentors, Gateway buddies, tutors, etc.
- How can they help? Helping you connect to the campus and understand how to excel academically and socially

Faculty advisers:

- Who are they? Faculty managers, faculty academic advisers, and programme directors
- How can they help? They provide curriculum-specific advice and help you select and define your curriculum and majors (select modules)

Central advisers:

- Who are they? Advisers at CTL
- How can they help? They provide advice to students who have not yet decided on their final choice of study and help navigate your academic career in relation to your career dreams. They assist you to decide, commit to, and connect to the institution in order to get where you want to be.

These academic advisers help you make the right decision in selecting the curriculum that best fits your path towards earning your degree. This advice is your academic support and success lifeline while studying at the UFS and will keep you on track all the way to graduation!

The advising relationship between you and your adviser is a mutual relationship of trust and respect.

COMPULSORY NATIONAL BENCHMARK TESTS

NBTS

WHAT ARE THE NBTS?

Universities South Africa (USAf) initiated the NBTS, and several South African universities use the test(s) as part of their student placement processes. The first test is the Academic and Quantitative Literacy Test (AQL), and the second is the Mathematics Test (MAT). Each test takes three hours to complete and both tests are written on the same day.

IS IT COMPULSORY TO TAKE THE NBT TESTS?

Yes, all first-time entering undergraduate applicants to the University of the Free State must write the NBTS before registering, but preferably before the end of 2021.

MUST I WRITE BOTH TESTS?

It depends. ALL prospective students must write the AQL test. If you apply to the Faculty of Economic and Management Sciences, the Faculty of Natural and Agricultural Sciences, or the Faculty of Health Sciences, you must write both the AQL and MAT tests where required.

WHY WRITE THE NBTS?

The level of academic reading and writing that you must be able to master at university is very different from what you are used to at school. If you lack this level of skills, you may have a hard time at university. But if we know what the level of your skills are, we can make sure that you enrol for the most appropriate modules and programmes in your first year. And that is what we use the NBTS for – to help us understand what skills you have, and what skills need to be developed.

HOW, WHEN, AND WHERE TO WRITE?

Registration for NBTS opens on 1 April 2021. You should write the NBTS while you are in Grade 12, before you register at the university. Visit www.nbt.ac.za for all the information you need. Once you have written the tests, you can use the results to apply at any university. The UFS **only** accepts NBT results, NO other admission tests will be considered.

If you are applying to study MBChB in the Faculty of Health Sciences, you should have written the NBTS before the end of June 2021.



HOW DOES THE UFS MAKE USE OF THE NBT RESULTS?

In three ways:

- We use it as part of the selection process for the Faculty of Health Sciences.
- If you apply to any of our other faculties, we use NBT results during the registration process.
- To place students in appropriate academic literacy development modules, where necessary.

Generally, as stated above, we use NBT performance levels to place first-year students into appropriate programmes or modules. If you did not pass the NBT Academic Literacy Test and want to study in English, you must register for one of the following academic literacy development modules in English: EALH/EALE/EALN/EALL 1508. The same applies if you want to study in Afrikaans (if offered in the relevant faculty) but did not pass the Academic Literacy Tests – in which case you must register for one of the academic literacy development courses in Afrikaans: AGAH/AGAM/ AGAL/AGAN/AGAE 1508.

These academic literacy development courses are not language courses. They teach you to read academic text efficiently and critically, while extracting the main ideas and key details. This skill will help you to adequately demonstrate your knowledge in tests and exams. It will also teach you to write academic essays and assignments. Overall, it will give you the confidence to perform at your best academically.

NB: If you have not written the NBTs yet, please register to write as soon as possible.

The University of the Free State encourages students to write the National Benchmark Tests (NBT) if they are able to do so. However, the UFS will not disadvantage any student who is unable to write the NBT due to the impact of COVID-19. The UFS will be putting into place alternative measures for those students who are unable to write the NBTs.

ALTERNATIVE ACCESS TO HIGHER-EDUCATION STUDIES

Couldn't get university admission? It does not have to be the end of the road for you. Do you have an AP of at least 18? In that case, you can get access to Higher Certificate study programmes if you meet the minimum requirements of the University Access Programmes (UAP). Higher Certificate studies include a Higher Certificate in Economic and Management Sciences and a Higher Certificate in Humanities. This gateway to education provides you with an opportunity to access studies in mainstream programmes after the successful completion of your Higher Certificate.

What is the UAP?

We introduced this programme to assist many deserving students who do not meet our admission requirements. There are various study options:

- Higher Certificate in Economic and Management Sciences (Commerce route)
- Higher Certificate in Economic and Management Sciences (Administration route)
- Higher Certificate in the Humanities (There are six different options to choose from.)

During your access year, you will get more than just academic information. We address a wider scope of needs to help you prepare for higher-education studies. In the Skills and Competencies in Lifelong Learning course, you will learn skills to help you with problem-solving, self-assertiveness, and other generic competencies. An Academic Literacy course will also improve your academic reading and writing skills.

Who may participate in the programme?

It is an open facility that welcomes all applicants who could not obtain access to a higher-education institution, including the University of the Free State.

All students: Applications open on 1 July 2021

International students: Applications close on 31 August 2021

SA students: Applications close on 31 August 2021

The programmes are presented in the following regions

(option availability varies for the different regions):

- Bloemfontein South Campus
- Goldfields TVET College at the Moruti House in Welkom
- Motheo TVET College in Bloemfontein
- Flavius Mareka TVET College in Sasolburg
- Maluti TVET College, Bethlehem Campus
- Maluti TVET College (Phuthaditjhaba), Kwetlisong Campus

General minimum admission requirements:

- A National Senior Certificate (NSC) or National Certificate: Vocational (NCV) Level 4, and an AP of 18.
- Four subjects on Level 3 (40%–49%).
- Language of instruction on Level 3 (40%) for all options.

Faculty-specific admission requirements:

Economic and Management Sciences:

- Commerce route study option: Mathematics on Level 3 (40%) or higher.
- Administration route study option: Mathematics is not a requirement to study this option. The duration of the course is four years.

NB: You will not be allowed to change from an Administration to a Commerce programme.

Student Finance – your financial partner on your journey to graduation

Higher education is a financial investment in your future. By learning how to manage your finances and maintain good credit, you will contribute to your success at university and after graduation. Student Finance is here to guide you every step of the way!

Being proactive about your personal financial management will help you to reduce your stress and plan for your future. Here are some helpful tips for your personal financial management:

STEP 1

Start by doing an **online quotation** based on the programme/modules you plan to enrol for. For the estimated costs/quotation, visit www.ufs.ac.za and follow the links: Students – Student Finance – Quotation.

STEP 2

Budget for other expenses such as registration, breakage fee if you are selected to stay in a campus residence, private accommodation if you stay off campus, textbooks, study material, pocket money, food, data, travelling, clothes, and any other expense you might need to consider.

STEP 3

Have a look at the **Student Finance Yearbook** for the estimated average cost per year of the most popular academic programmes. You can access the Student Finance Yearbook at www.ufs.ac.za – Students – Student Finance – Student Finance Yearbook.

STEP 4

If you need **financial assistance**, apply for funding to help pay your fees early so that you are not stressed, and can secure your financial assistance ahead of registration. Funding takes the form of bursaries, scholarships, and loans. Please contact Financial Aid for more details regarding the various options available.

All university fees are determined by the Council, which may amend it at any time. The amended amount will be payable on request.

Fees are payable in full, irrespective of whether any services rendered by the university are disrupted by circumstances beyond the university's control, such as strikes, student boycotts, public unrest, or any other disruption on campus.

Payment dates:

Tuition and residence fees are calculated per semester. All fees must be paid regardless of whether or not an account was received. Official account statements are emailed to your UFS4LIFE email address. It is your responsibility to forward the account to the payer and to enquire should you not receive an account at that email address. You can access your account through the Student Self-Service Portal. Visit www.ufs.ac.za and follow the links: Students – Student Self-Service – Financial Records.

Payment dates for South African students:

First semester: all fees for the first semester are payable on/before **31 March**.

Second semester: all fees for the second semester are payable on/before **31 August**.

Payment dates for international students:

First semester: all fees for the first semester are payable on/before **31 March**.

Second semester: all fees for the second semester are payable on/before **30 June**, regardless of any other date which may appear on account statements.

All other fees are payable no later than the end of the month following the month in which the transaction took place, as indicated on the account statement, unless specifically stipulated otherwise in the regulations.

Discount on early payments (SA students only)

Discount is given on early payment of tuition-fee accounts. Standard discount is given annually and is as follows:

- 5% when all fees for the **whole year are paid before 28 February**
- 2½% when all **first-semester fees are paid before 28 February**

Discounts are not given automatically. You must apply for discounts in writing. Discounts are only given on module and accommodation fees. If you receive any form of financial aid from the UFS for tuition and/or accommodation fees, you do not qualify to claim this discount.

Bursaries and loans:

IMPORTANT: If you have a bursary or loan, it is your responsibility to ensure that the bursary donors make payments on time and in accordance with university regulations. You must make sure that you provide your sponsors with the correct details of your account.

First payments in advance before you can register as a student

Visit www.ufs.ac.za and follow the links: **Students – Student Finance – First payments for registration, to view the amounts that must be paid before you register in 2022.**

First semester: Registration for first-semester and year modules takes place during January and February.

- First payments must be made **five (5) working** days before you register. You will not be able to register until these amounts reflect as credits on your tuition-fee account. If your tuition fees are less than the amounts required, you must pay the full tuition amount.

Second semester: Registration for second-semester modules takes place in July.

- South African students: Payments prior to registration for the second semester are the same as for the first semester.
- International students: International students must pay **all** fees for the second semester in advance before registration can take place.

Students receiving financial aid (SA students only)

If you receive financial aid (bursary/loan), and the bursary or loan covers **all** fees for the year, the amount payable before registration will be reduced by the amount of the financial aid. If your bursary or loan does not cover all fees for the year, **you must still pay the first payment before you register.**

Estimated Programme Costs

- The cost per programme is the average cost per year.
- Tuition fees are charged per module.
- Programme prices vary according to the modules registered for.
- Prices quoted are for SA and SADC students.
- International non-SADC students pay the actual module price + 50%.

Study material is automatically prepared when you register and is charged accordingly. It is your responsibility to collect the study material. If you cancel/discontinue any of the modules, you will not be refunded for the notes.



BOOKS

Money for books can be paid into a separate account in advance. The amount paid will be transferred to your student card.

At the end of each academic year, the credits available on your student card will automatically be transferred to your tuition-fees account.



STUDENT CARD

You will receive a student card when you produce proof of your registration. Your student card is your key to all kinds of services and events at the UFS. It is your official university identification, and as a student or employee, you must carry it with you whenever you are on campus. Your electronic student card is for your use only; nobody else may use it. Your personal details are associated with your card and are unique to your card. Your first card will be issued free of charge. A fee is payable to replace a lost, stolen, or damaged card.



PARKING DISC

To park in designated parking spaces allocated to students, you must buy a parking permit/disc from Traffic Services by the end of February. It must be displayed on the windshield of your vehicle.



RESIDENCE AND ACCOMMODATION FEES

You or your parent/guardian or both are responsible for the full accommodation fee for the accommodation period.

Tariffs for accommodation in the different residences and living units are available on request.

NB: Residential students must familiarise themselves with all policies regarding accommodation.



Breakage deposit (first placement in residence):

When you accept the accommodation offer, you must pay the breakage deposit.

Rules regarding deposits

You will forfeit the deposit you paid if accommodation has been allocated to you and a place has thus been reserved for you, when you

- do not show up; or
- cancel your place after 31 December.

The breakage deposit may be used at the sole discretion of the university to recover any contingencies resulting in costs, losses, damages, penalties, etc.

The breakage deposit will ONLY be refunded if you

- do not comply with admission requirements;
- are not selected for a specific course;
- pass away;
- submit a satisfactory medical certificate as motivation for cancellation; and
- leave at the end of the accommodation term. The breakage deposit will be transferred to your tuition-fees account, and if this results in a credit on the account, the credit may be paid out on request.

Accommodation costs in case of cancellation of studies

First-time entering students (FTEN): In the event that a FTEN student cancels his/her residency in terms of Paragraph 6 of the Terms and Conditions, such a student will only be liable for the payment of any and all accommodation fees that are outstanding up to the cancellation date.

Non-FTEN: In the event that a student who is not a FTEN student cancels his/her residency in terms of this Paragraph 6 of the Terms and Conditions, such a student will be liable for the payment of any and all accommodation fees that are outstanding up to the cancellation date.

Meal fees and system

All junior residences of the UFS are self-catering; however, meals are offered on a cafeteria basis in the dining halls at

Bloemfontein Campus:

- Dining@Kovsies at Abraham Fischer Dining Hall
- Soetdoring Dining Hall
- Medical Cafeteria at the Francois Retief Building
- Food outlets on the Thakaneng Bridge

Qwaqwa Campus:

South Campus:

- Student Dining Hall

You can deposit money for meals, which will be credited to your student card within 48 hours. There is no fixed amount payable; it depends on your budget.

At the end of each academic year, the credit available on your student card will automatically be transferred to your tuition-fees account.

Family discount on tuition and/or accommodation fees

If three or more students who are dependents from the same family (children, stepchildren, adopted children, but excluding children-in-law or married children) study at the university and/or stay in university residences at the same time, the following discount will be granted on the amount payable for residing in a UFS residence, and on modules the students are registered for:

- Three students: 10%
- Four or more students: 15%

Discounts will be granted on the following conditions:

- A discount may only be claimed for full-time undergraduate SA students.
- All dependents must be under the age of 26.
- Students receiving any form of financial aid for tuition and/or accommodation fees do not qualify for this discount.
- The discount will be recalculated if one or more of the students discontinue their studies or leave the residence.
- Family discounts are not given automatically. You must apply for family discount in writing and must present evidence of relationships. The full particulars of the students concerned must be submitted.
- A discount may only be claimed for the current academic year.
- Family discount will only be given on module and accommodation fees.



STUDENT AFFAIRS

At Student Affairs, we take care of you while you are a student on either our Bloemfontein, South or Qwaqwa Campuses; we do this through our student life communities, the Center for Universal Access and Disability Support – or CUADS as it is known, Student Counselling and Development, and Student Governance.

LET US HAVE A QUICK LOOK AT EACH OF THESE.

The Department of Student Life and Communities purposefully fosters close collaboration with faculties and academic units to create a seamless integration between the social life and academic performance contexts of our students. A balance between academic responsibilities and vibrant student life is achieved through strong student communities and co-curricular programmes such as leadership development. As a Kopsie student, you will get the opportunity to be exposed to learning experiences outside the classroom that are intentionally designed to develop you as a well-rounded graduate.

The Center for Universal Access and Disability Support (CUADS) aims to ensure that the University of the Free State increasingly becomes a universally accessible higher education institution that embraces and is welcoming to all students, including students with disabilities. CUADS assists students in gaining access to support regarding communication, for example Sign Language interpreting services; accessible study material, for example Braille; alternative assessment arrangements, such as concessions; and individual academic support through assistive devices.

We know that leaving home and moving to a new city to study is very challenging, and all our students are doing the best they can. To help you on your way and support you throughout your journey, Student Counselling and Development is a key partner. It is important to know that you are not alone and that we, as the UFS, really care about your well-being. Therefore, we provide individual and group counselling to registered UFS students who are experiencing personal, psychological, and behavioural difficulties or require career guidance. We furthermore aid and support students on their journey of personal development, in order to function to their full potential and effectively meet their educational and life goals. We enhance and support the healthy growth and development of students through advocacy and consultations with the UFS community.

The mental, physical, and emotional well-being of our students is very important, and we take every measure to ensure that you enjoy your student years and develop holistically.

The fourth piece that completes the Student Affairs picture is Student Governance. We strongly believe in governance excellence, capacity building of our students through the promotion of professional student governance, and a complete humanising experience. The Student Representative Council or SRC, responsible for facilitating activities such as SRC elections, developmental training, and strategic planning, plays a key role on all three campuses. The office also embarks on hosting other activities, which include public conversations and seminars. These activities promote the active participation of student leadership in institutional governance. Student governance, among others, drives the following:

- student participation and a sense of belonging and inclusivity through co-curriculum programmes and governance activities
- a strong governance culture that acts as a fundamental for advancement of transformation policies
- institutional and campus SRC and student parliaments, structured student governance training programmes, student organisations and associations, student governance structures, namely class representatives through which the faculty councils are constituted; first-year committees, residence subcommittees, and residence committees.

At the University of the Free State, we believe that every voice counts; therefore, our student leaders are actively participating in university and faculty governance and management structures.

As the CUADS team, we will be delighted to welcome you as a student with a disability, because at CUADS we believe in your potential and creating opportunities where challenges are experienced.

The centre, which was established in 2001, has since grown and expanded significantly and today forms part of Student Affairs as an independent entity, with offices on the Bloemfontein, South, and Qwaqwa Campuses. Supplementary to the academic support offered to students with disabilities, the centre aims to ensure that the UFS increasingly becomes a universally accessible higher education institution that embraces and is welcoming to all students, including students with disabilities.

We encourage you to contact us to enable you to achieve your academic goals. We are proud of each and every graduate with a disability at the UFS.

PROGRAMMES AND SERVICES

As a registered UFS student, you can access the following programmes that will enrich your Kopsie experience and support you on your journey to success.

- **Disability Support Programme**, which entails the provision of a specialist and holistic coordinated approach to student support in order to create enabling environments to empower students with disabilities to participate equally.
- **Accessible Transport Programme**, which includes the provision of accessible transport to students with disabilities between the Bloemfontein and South Campuses.
- **Liaison, Awareness and Advocacy Programme** for awareness and advocacy around matters of disability, universal access, and universal design towards the integration and inclusion of persons with disabilities across all three campuses.
- **Accessibility Programme** to ensure access to all buildings and facilities for all users according to the principles of universal access and universal design in collaboration with University Estates.
- **Accessible Study Material Production Programme** for the provision of academic support through the production of study material in different formats, i.e. Braille, E-text, enlargements, and audio.
- **Alternative Assessment Programme** for the provision of an alternative test and examination venue that is accessible to accommodate students with disabilities for their assessment needs, together with alternative formats of test and exam papers. Special arrangements include the provision of amanuensis (scribe and reader) during tests/exams, and application for extra time during tests/exams according to the student’s specific impairment. (This is done via a formal process of testing and interviewing by a panel from Student Counselling and Development.)
- **Communication Access Programme** for the provision of Sign Language interpreting and lip-speaking services for academic support needs and other communication needs of students with hearing impairments. In addition, it coordinates the classroom interpreter schedule in cooperation with the UFS Interpreting Services.
- **Student Academic Support Programme** – besides academic support from individual lecturers, CUADS also provides individual tutoring to students in collaboration with the A-Step Programme, coordinates assistance with support at the WriteSite in the Centre for Teaching and Learning, and assists with purchasing applicable assistive devices.

CUADS provides a support service to the following categories of students with disabilities:

- specific learning difficulties (e.g. dyslexia, ADD/ADHD, hyperactivity)
- mobility impairments (e.g. wheelchair users, amputees, cerebral palsy, muscle dystrophy, spina bifida, multiple sclerosis)
- visual impairments (e.g. blind, partially sighted, eye conditions)
- hearing impairments (deaf, hard of hearing, and deafened)
- debilitating mental health, psychological and other chronic conditions (e.g. schizophrenia, epilepsy, panic disorder)
- temporary impairments (e.g. a broken hand).

ARTS AND CULTURE

Arts, Culture, and Dialogue

The Arts, Culture, and Dialogue office within the Department of Student Life and Communities serves as a channel for students to express themselves through visual, literary, and performing arts and dialogue. Students and members of the university and the greater Mangaung Metro community engage with a specific focus on social justice, social cohesion, and critical diversity. Through dialogue, we inspire audiences towards developing engaged citizenship and cohesive communities.

SLAD-Fest

Company Relations

Explore careers and connect with potential employers to guide you on the requirements you lack, so that you can learn these while studying. We also encourage students to get part-time or vacation work to gain valuable skills needed to enter the job market. We regularly advertise bursaries, vacation work, internships, and graduate programmes on our Blackboard page, Facebook page, website, and email. Various companies visit our campuses to engage with potential employees and to present their offerings to students.

Entrepreneurship

Students are encouraged and supported through a process of entrepreneurship awareness. We assist in activating your entrepreneurial mindset and skills. We offer volunteer opportunities to registered students in order to gain valuable work skills, and in return, you will receive a reference letter from Career Services specifying the specific skills you have obtained. Volunteers get the opportunity to present workshops, conduct mock interviews with a student to prepare for a job interview, assist students in updating their CVs, and learn valuable transferrable skills in the process.

The Career Closet project depends on donations we receive from students, staff, and the community. Kovsie ACT is a learning opportunity for students who want to learn about sustainable environmental development through fun community-building activities. It is an opportunity for you to learn new skills and build valuable relationships.

As a Kovsie student, you can develop significantly while learning to solve problems in the company of others and develop the ability to listen to different perspectives while working together. Through different programmes and activities, Kovsie ACT strives to create this kind of collaborative learning. In the process of working and learning together, students foster quality relationships that last throughout their study period and beyond.

Kovsie ACT programmes develop specific attributes that will help you to position yourself optimally in the labour market after graduation. For example, students learn to listen and communicate better, they acquire time management and interpersonal relationship skills. Kovsie ACT also makes students aware of transnational problems affecting the human condition, such as food insecurity, environmental sustainability, and the socio-economic challenges in a global and local context. In this regard, our programmes encourage students to become active global citizens.

As a first-year student, you can participate in the following programmes and projects:

KOVSIÉ ACT Music Festival

A community and student celebration where some of the country's top musicians grace the stage, providing entertainment for a diverse group of spectators. This event aims to bring the campus and broader Mangaung community together.

ECO-Vehicle Skills Programme and Creative Pitstop Project

The eco-vehicle project is all about ...

ELECTRIC VEHICLES with SOLAR CHARGING STATIONS, built by different Student-Life teams.

Each team applying integrated skills and knowledge in FIVE ENGINEERING FIELDS, developed through FIVE SKILLS PROGRAMMES, and then competing in a SUSTAINABLE ENERGY RACE EVENT.

The aim is to create an interdisciplinary experience where students work together to build an eco-vehicle and creative pit stop from waste material. Our student's ingenuity and endurance are showcased to the public and tested on track day.

Social Cohesion events at RAG Farm

The Kovsie ACT office, in collaboration with residences, arranges social-cohesion events with various themes and artists for students in a safe and secure environment. Before classes start each year, we go out of our way to introduce our students to one another. If you arrive on campus with no friends – you will have plenty by the time our social-cohesion events end.

Buddy Project

Through the Buddy project, Kovsie ACT aims to promote social responsibility among students and the broader community. This campaign emphasises the need for responsible alcohol use and advances the principles of the broader national Arrive Alive campaign. A buddy is a designated driver who refrains from drinking, thus ensuring the safety of family and friends after any social outing or event.

UBUNTU Community Street Store

This beacon of hope inspires the community, as well as the students participating in the experience, and is more than just a 'free clothes store' for the underprivileged in our community.

Big Give Foodbank

This joint venture between Kovsie ACT and the Food Security Office on campus sets out to collect money and non-perishable food for distribution to students in need.

Community Gardens and Food Initiative

Kovsie ACT, in collaboration with the Centre for Sustainable Agriculture and the Food Environment task team, aims to contribute to food security on campus. The aim is to ensure that food-insecure students with strong academic records are adequately nourished, thus increasing their chances of academic completion and success.

With the participation of residences and off-campus communities, 40 vegetable gardens have been established, with the possibility to feed hundreds of students on a weekly basis.

Casual Day

As the NCPD's flagship awareness and fundraising project, Casual Day has grown into the most prominent and successful social advocacy campaign in South African history, having raised R370 million since 1995 (including the record R31 million raised in 2018). Casual Day is a widely celebrated national campaign that occurs annually. Kovsie ACT, in partnership with the Centre for Universal Access and Disability Support (CUADS) on campus, proudly supports this campaign.

Tekkie Tax

Several national non-profit organisations have joined hands to enable a singularly focused national FUNDRAISING campaign. Tekkie Tax is a dynamic project OWNED by welfare organisations and MANAGED by welfare organisations to the BENEFIT of welfare organisations. Together, they represent more than 1 000 NPOs across the country.

The Tekkie Tax International Fundraising Campaign supports five sectors:

A = Animals **B** = Bring Hope **C** = Children
D = Disability **E** = Education

STUDENT LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

The Office for Student Leadership Development (SLD) provides a formal and institutionally integrated co-curriculum for leadership development, as well as research on graduate leadership development. The office, in partnership with faculties and other departments, design programmes that are delivered through student-life colleges and communities via on-site training, engagements, and events, and also online via Blackboard for specific programmes on the Bloemfontein, South, and Qwaqwa campuses.

We strive to meet the capacity-building needs of student leaders and to develop their full potential, aiming to produce graduates who are holistically developed and well-rounded. The office provides channels for student pathways and signature development, while creating opportunities to enter into leadership positions and to pursue career development. As a result, the SLD programmes enhance the academic performance and social integration of students.

The leadership development programmes are open to all undergraduate, graduate, and postgraduate students and can be categorised under two overarching themes, namely Leadership Development programmes and Leadership Training programmes, each consisting of two pillars.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES:

FutureLEAD: Essential / Critical Leadership Development	The FutureLEAD Leadership Development Challenge (FLC) is a blended learning programme over four to six months, engaging students on Blackboard and in panel discussions on and around understanding and using leadership in various situations and environments (studies, personal, community, and career).
AdvanceLEAD: Advanced/Specialised Leadership Development	The Specialised Leadership Development Challenge entails selective leadership programmes aimed at high-achieving student leaders who show potential. They undergo advanced training and are channeled towards specialised programmes, e.g. the Activator First-Year Conference, the Global Leadership Summit (triennial GLS, hosted by the UFS), as well as participation in national and international leadership opportunities, e.g. conferences, summits, and seminars.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAMMES:

KovsieLEAD: Student Governance Training	Training of elected student governance structures and committees across campuses to be fully equipped and functional. This entails combined campus/structure programmes, e.g. student governance induction training and structure-specific training, including operational and portfolio-specific training, as well as inspirational sessions, e.g. SRC, associations and organisations' EC training, RC training, faculty council training, etc.
PurposeLEAD: Ad hoc/ Specific Training	Purposeful training for specific situations/ institutional goals/ preparation/ mobilisation in support of students and governance structures' specific needs, events and campaigns such as pre-election candidate training, accessibility and diversity training and a series of quarterly sessions on 'What Students Should Know', e.g. about protesting, human rights, gender-based violence, etc.

FOOD ENVIRONMENT OFFICE

The Food Environment Programme is designed to address the many dimensions of the food environment; assisting students who suffer from food insecurity and hunger is part of the overall programme. The University of the Free State has previously identified student food insecurity and hunger as a significant problem. Food insecurity adds stress to the students' lives, and this has a negative impact on their studies. We promote a healthy food environment, with students and staff who are well informed and empowered to take appropriate action regarding their food and nutrition situation, which will promote student well-being and student success.

The following programmes and projects are offered:

No Student Hungry programme

To address this problem, the 'No Student Hungry bursary programme' was started in 2011. The primary intervention offered an allowance to provide one balanced meal per day.

Food Parcel programme

The secondary intervention provides a food parcel, containing a variety of non-perishable, nutritious staple food items. This joint venture between the Food Environment Office and Tiger Brands sets out to distribute non-perishables to students in need.

Community gardens

The Food Environment Office and Kovsie ACT, in collaboration with the Centre for Sustainable Agriculture, aim to contribute to food security on campus. The aim is to ensure that food-insecure students are adequately nourished, thereby increasing their chances of academic completion and success.

We encourage you to become a member of these cohesive groups through on-campus residences or day residences. Together, these groups form the strong building blocks of larger communities called Student Life Colleges.



- sport activities: as a Kovsie student, you will continue to enhance your sports talent and if you are committed enough, you can represent Kovies on national and international level.





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ON-CAMPUS RESIDENCES

Your residence at the UFS will become your second home; life in a student residence at the UFS can be a very exciting and rewarding experience. As a Kovsie student, you will benefit from a whole new world of friendships that can last a lifetime. There are many people from different language, racial, and cultural backgrounds on campus. Living and learning in this diverse environment can give you a definite advantage over many other job seekers once you graduate, which will help you later in life.

You should indicate on the application form for studies in 2022 whether you want to secure a place in one of the on-campus residences.

The leadership in residence communities consists of a residence head, prime, residence committee, and peer mentors. This leadership team creates a residence environment where every student feels welcome and inspired. All residence communities are driven by a set of shared values, which mediates a culture of mutual accountability.

First-year students are supported in their transition to higher education by means of a peer-mentor system in residences. Each first-year student is allocated a peer mentor who facilitates individual conversation as well as conversations in small-group format with students.

CO-ED RESIDENCES

Co-ed residences are residence communities consisting of male and female students. Although male and female students both form part of co-ed residences, they live in separate corridors with separate bathroom facilities. There is controlled access to blocks/pods and corridors.

DAY RESIDENCES

A day residence is a residence consisting of students who live off campus in private homes, student houses, townhouses, flats, rooms, etc. Students who are members of day residences must arrange their own accommodation off campus.

If you do not live on campus, a day residence gives you the opportunity to participate in organised student activities. It is very important to us that you have the opportunity to develop as a complete person by participating in academic and non-academic activities on campus. With day residences, you can participate in all activities offered in campus residences.

If you live off campus, you are free to join one of the day residence communities. Each day residence has a gazellie (or a large lounge with a kitchen and bathroom) on the campus, where the day residence communities host residence meetings, study, or just hang out and socialise.

A residence head and a residence committee oversee each day residence. This leadership is responsible for managing day residences and seeing to it that all activities offered are in line with the vision, mission, and values of the university.

Day residences offer students who are living off campus the following:

- mentorship and academic support
- learning and social spaces on campus where you can study and hang out with your friends
- access to UFS programmes and resources
- opportunities to develop holistically
- sharing innovative ideas
- growth
- a vibrant social life to build relationships
- fun, and fun, and more fun

HOUSING AND RESIDENCE AFFAIRS

YOUR HOME AWAY FROM HOME

Our residences are very popular, with a waiting list for applicants. Therefore, you should indicate on the application form for studies in 2022 if you want to secure a place in one of the on-campus residences.



APPLICATION FOR RESIDENCE ACCOMMODATION

To become a resident in one of the campus residences, you need to

- indicate on your application form for studies in 2022 that you require residence (on-campus) accommodation;
- keep your breakage deposit of R960 ready in case you are selected for placement in a residence (refer to the placement procedure on the application form); and
- take note of the academic admission criteria for residences. Make sure that your admission point (AP) meets the criteria.

PLACEMENT POLICY

It is very important to take note of the following academic requirements for junior residences on the:

BLOEMFONTEIN CAMPUS:

- Meeting the minimum admission requirements for your chosen/intended programme of study does not guarantee placement in a residence on campus, as limited space is available in each residence.
- A minimum Grade 12 AP of 30 is required for admission to a residence.
- Your academic merit is determined based on the most recent admission point as calculated by the university (whether Grade 11 or Grade 12 results).
- If you were admitted to a residence based on the Grade 11 AP, but the final Grade 12 AP is less than 30, your admission to a residence will be cancelled.
- If your current AP (Grade 11 final results or Grade 12 June results) is less than 30, you can still apply for residence accommodation. You will qualify for admission to a residence (subject to availability) if your final Grade 12 AP is 30 or more.
- If you are currently in the University Access Programme (UAP), you will qualify for admission to a residence if you pass all your modules.
- If you were registered at the UFS or another tertiary institution for the second or subsequent years, you must have passed at least 120 credits to qualify for admission to a residence. Current first-year students will qualify for admission to a residence based on their Grade 12 AP.

SOUTH CAMPUS:

Admission to a full-time programme on the South Campus

- If you were provisionally admitted to a residence on the Bloemfontein Campus prior to your final Grade 12 results becoming available and your final results indicate that your studies encompass an extended curriculum programme on the South Campus, such provisional admission shall automatically be transferred to a residence on the South Campus.
- Your admission is in all cases subject to you meeting the conditions pertaining to the aforementioned admission.

VERY IMPORTANT:

As a prospective student, you must keep in mind that placement in a residence does not mean that you have been selected for a particular field of study. In order to be considered for placement in a residence, you must have received either a conditional admission offer for a programme of study or a final and firm offer for admission. The final Grade 12 marks will eventually determine whether you qualify for admission to an undergraduate programme of study and residence accommodation. You will only be allowed to occupy the residence in which you have been placed once you register as a student.

ACCREDITED OFF-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION

The safety and living conditions of our students are of great importance. The disc must be displayed on the windscreen.

People using the roads on the university campus or parking on the campus do so at their own risk and the university does not accept responsibility for any accident, loss or damage. Any damage or theft must be reported to the Security Services Division.

GLOSSARY

University:

An institution of advanced study and research in the arts and sciences where the highest possible academic qualification can be obtained.

Chancellor:

The Chancellor is the ceremonial head of the university and is generally a prominent figure in society. Our Chancellor is Prof Bonang Mohale.

Rector and Vice-Chancellor:

The Rector is the Chief Executive Officer of the university, with Vice-Rectors supporting him. Prof Francis Petersen is our Rector and Vice-Chancellor.

University Council:

The University Council is the highest decision-making body of the university. The Council consists of representatives of the university, the Student Representative Council (SRC), church and community representatives, prominent businesspeople, and individuals appointed by the government.

Faculty:

The students, lecturers, researchers, and management of a group of departments (in a broad sense) working in the same field of study, form a faculty. The head of a faculty is called a Dean, who resides on the Bloemfontein Campus.

Department:

The students, lecturers, research, and management activities in a specific field of study form a department. At the head of a department, we find the departmental head or departmental chairperson. For undergraduate courses, you will be required to attend classes in various departments, while postgraduate studies are generally undertaken in a single department.

Professor:

A person who has distinguished himself/herself as an expert in a specific field of study.

Lecturer:

The name assigned to a person who presents classes to students. Each department has a number of lecturers who are experts in specific fields of study and who are attached full-time to the university. Lecturing staff are addressed in terms of their titles.

Kovsie:

The word 'Kovsie' is the nickname given to students at the UFS. This is also the general name used for referring to the UFS.

Degree:

An academic achievement that provides evidence that you are academically competent in a specific field of study, so that you may embark upon a career or careers related to this field. Undergraduate refers to students who are studying for the first degree, while the term postgraduate refers to students engaged in a study field where they have already obtained a degree. For example, the term degree could denote a BA degree (Baccalaureus Artium/Bachelor of Arts), a BCom degree (Baccalaureus Commercii/Bachelor of Commerce), or a BSc degree (Baccalaureus Scientiae/Bachelor of Science). The minimum period of study for an undergraduate bachelor's degree is generally three or four years. This is followed by an honours degree (generally one or two years) or a master's degree (one or more years), and finally a doctorate (generally two years or longer). Some degrees lead directly into certain professions, while other degrees provide general preparation for a variety of careers. A general BCom degree will equip you with the necessary economic and management knowledge so that, for example, you may apply for a position as a manager in a company.

Module:

A module refers to specific fields of study within a discipline. For example, Financial Management is one of several modules in the field of study known as Business Management.

The Academic Calendar:

An academic year consists of two semesters. The first semester usually commences in February, and the second semester by the end of July. In between, there is generally a holiday of approximately three weeks. The second semester is concluded at the end of November. Undergraduate students write an examination at the end of each semester. For postgraduate studies, much more self-study and research are expected from students.


