FREE STATE: DISCOVER THE HEART OF SOUTH AFRICA





Rated Researchers

The National Research Foundation's (NRF) rating system is a benchmarking system through which individuals who exemplify the highest standards of research, as well as those demonstrating strong potential as researchers, are identified by an extensive network of South African and international peer reviewers. Ratings are based on the quality and impact of recent research outputs (over an eight-year period).

Apart from research output, the quality and impact of research at tertiary institutions in South Africa are also reflected in the number of rated scientists identified through the NRF-rating system. Awards are valid for a period of six years.



Please note that certain departments mandate direct communication with the programme director prior to application, while others may request that you submit your application directly. It is essential to follow the respective guidelines to ensure a smooth application process.

Kindly take note of the following:

- Students transferring from other universities must include a certificate of conduct as well as a study record from their previous university with their applications. The closing date for students transferring from other universities may depend on the faculties.
- International postgraduate students must attach certified copies of degrees/certificates to their applications. Degrees/certificates that are not certified will delay the processing of applications. In addition, proof of application for a SAQA Certificate of Evaluation relating to all qualifications obtained outside South Africa must be attached.
- Students transferring from other universities are required to provide a certificate of conduct and a complete study record from their former institution when submitting their application. Please be aware that application deadlines may vary depending on the faculty to which you are applying. Adherence to these timelines is crucial for the evaluation of your application.

If you encounter any difficulties, please do not hesitate to contact us at postgradmarketing@ufs.ac.za for immediate assistance. We are here to ensure a smooth and efficient experience for you.

International postgraduate applicants are mandated to submit certified copies of their degrees/certificates alongside their applications. Moreover, we require international applicants to include proof of their application for a SAQA (South African Qualifications Authority) Certificate of Evaluation for all qualifications earned outside of South Africa. This step is vital for the assessment of your international qualifications and should be completed without delay to ensure a smooth application process.

International students will additionally receive a letter from the Office for International Affairs, which serves as a supporting document for your study visa application. Visit the South African embassy/consulate/high commission in your home country with the above letters, as well as your passport, to apply for your visa. Please be advised that your study-permit application can take more than six weeks to be finalised. Please contact the Office for International Affairs should you experience challenges or delays with the visa application process.

Administrative fee: A non-refundable administrative fee is charged on all international student accounts. For more information, visit:

Closing date: The closing date for applications regarding honours and master's with coursework is 31 August 2024. Contact the faculty of your intended postgraduate study for more details.





Visa: You must have a valid study visa before you can enter South Africa. Make sure your study visa is issued to study at the UFS and not at any other institution in South Africa. You must have a valid and appropriate/correct visa to be registered at the UFS. Applications may take more than six weeks to process; please contact the Office for International Affairs immediately if you experience any challenges or delays. See below for more information.

Accommodation: For full-time studies, you must have a letter from Housing and Residence Affairs confirming accommodation. This letter is required for your visa application to study at the UFS. Contact resapplications@ufs.ac.za for assistance.





Medical Aid: You must be a member of a medical aid registered in terms of the Medical Schemes Act 1998 of South Africa, as required by the South African Immigration Act. Please note that your medical-aid cover MUST be valid for the duration of your studies at the UFS. No travel insurance or hospital plans will be accepted. See below for more information.

First payment: A first payment must be made before you can register as a UFS student. The Department of Student Finance will communicate the amount and the payment deadline to you. For further details, visit *https://www.ufs.ac.za/kovsielife/unlisted- pages/tuition-fees/tuition-fees-30*





Scholarships/Bursaries/Sponsorships: If you have a scholarship, inform your sponsor of the UFS regulations on payments before you register and pay tuition fees.

Applicants who are in possession of a degree from non–South African universities must include the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) evaluation letter or proof of application for evaluation to SAQA with their application form. Non–South African certificates/degrees must be assessed by SAQA prior to registering at the UFS. This process can take anything from **two to three months**. Visit www.saqa.org.za for more information.



Study Visas

If you are a foreign student and wish to study in South Africa, you can apply for a study visa by completing South African Home Affairs Form BI-1738. Study visas must be applied for at VFS Global Centres at various locations in

South Africa or at the nearest South African embassy, mission, or consulate abroad; prospective students are responsible for the payment of the relevant fees. Study visas for studies at a learning institution must be valid for the duration of the study.

The following documents must be submitted with the BI-1738 application form

- a passport valid for no less than 30 days after intended studies
- payment of the prescribed administrative fee
- confirmation and proof of payment for a South African medical aid through a medical scheme registered with the SA Council for Medical Schemes; the cover must remain valid for the duration of the calendar year
- letter of offer from the university, stating the duration of the degree
- letter of undertaking from the university this letter is issued by the Office for International Affairs; contact Jeanne Niemann: E: niemannja@ufs.ac.za | T: +27 51 401 3219.
- medical and radiological reports (less than six months old)
- vellow fever vaccination certificate, if relevant
- relevant certificates if married, widowed, divorced, or separated
- details regarding arranged accommodation while in South Africa
- proof of sufficient funds to cover tuition fees and maintenance
- a police clearance certificate for the past 12 months or longer since the age of 18.

You are advised to submit the documentation as soon as possible. DO NOT send the documentation to the university. You should keep a copy of your submission and all receipts safe. Please note that it can take longer than six weeks to obtain a study visa.

Please note that the holder of a study visa may conduct part-time work for a period not exceeding 20 hours per week.



Office for International Affairs

The Office for International Affairs (OIA) serves as the first port of call for all international students at the UFS, providing assistance and specialised administrative support. The principal purpose of the OIA is to enable internationalisation at the UFS. It renders strategic advice on

MASTER'S DEGREES BY WAY OF FULL DISSERTATION

The faculty also offers an LLM degree by way of full dissertation. Students admitted to the LLM by way of full dissertation register for a module in Research Methodology and for the dissertation.

Admission requirements for LLM degrees by coursework and full dissertation:

a. For admission to the Master of Laws degree, a candidate must, subject to 2022 General Rule A72.1, be in possession of an LLB degree or an equivalent Law degree and must have obtained a weighted average of at least 60% in the undergraduate programme. Preferably, candidates must have obtained at least 60% for the final-year research report. If the candidate did not register and pass the research report in the final-year LLB studies, other evidence must be presented of research and writing competencies.

Admission to the Master of Human Rights degree is subject to the UFS General Rules. Specifically, students must

- a. have an honours degree (NQF exit Level 8) or equivalent qualification; and
- b. have obtained a weighted average of at least 60%.

Admission to the Master of Human Rights degree is further subject to a selection process.

- Be in possession of an LLB
- Passed with a 60% weighted average
- Received 60% for final-year research essay / mini-dissertation degree

Admission to the Master of Human Rights degree is subject to the UFS General rules. Students must

- be in possession of an honours degree (NQF exit Level 8); or
- have an equivalent qualification found appropriate to pursue the master's degree; and
- have obtained a weighted average of at least 60%.
- Admission to the Master of Human Rights is further subject to a selection process.

To be admitted to **the LLD**, a **candidate must have obtained an LLM** and a final mark of at least 65%. To be admitted to the PhD, a **candidate must have obtained a master's degree and a final mark of at least 65%**. A candidate with a final mark of between 60% and 64% in the master's degree may be admitted at the discretion of the Dean on the recommendation of the supervisor.

The faculty may require the applicant to write a language proficiency test at his/her own cost, the results of which will be used in the application assessment process.

- The funding must be officially confirmed by the funder. Proof of confirmed funding must be submitted to Student Finance five (5) working days prior to registration. Please email the confirmation letter to tuitionfees@ufs.ac.za
- The funding awarded must cover the full cost of study for the year.

The above excludes the following:

- International students studying with the assistance of financial aid are **NOT EXEMPT** from paying the first payment, as indicated for SELF-PAYING STUDENTS.
- Students who have applied/appealed for funding but have not yet received funding confirmation, must pay the first payment as indicated for SELF-PAYING STUDENTS, **five** (5) working days prior to registration. Payments will be refunded when funding is confirmed.

PAYMENT DATES

Tuition and residence fees are calculated per semester. All fees must be paid as follows, regardless of whether an account has been received or not. **Official account statements are sent to students' ufs4life email addresses** on a monthly basis. It is the responsibility of the student to provide the university with his/ her correct contact details and to make enquiries should he/ she not receive an account.

The university strictly adheres to the Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA). Account statements or any other personal information will NOT be shared with a third party. You must forward the account to the person(s) responsible for paying the account. It is your responsibility to enquire if you have not received an account.

South African students

- The first payment as indicated must be paid five (5) working days prior to registration.
- All fees for the <u>first semester</u> are payable on/before **31 March**.
- The tuition-fee account must be <u>settled in full</u> by **31 August**.

STUDENT COUNSELLING AND DEVELOPMENT (SCD)


At SCD, we strive to promote, enable, and optimise students' selfactualisation and sense of community. SCD fulfils the following essential roles:
